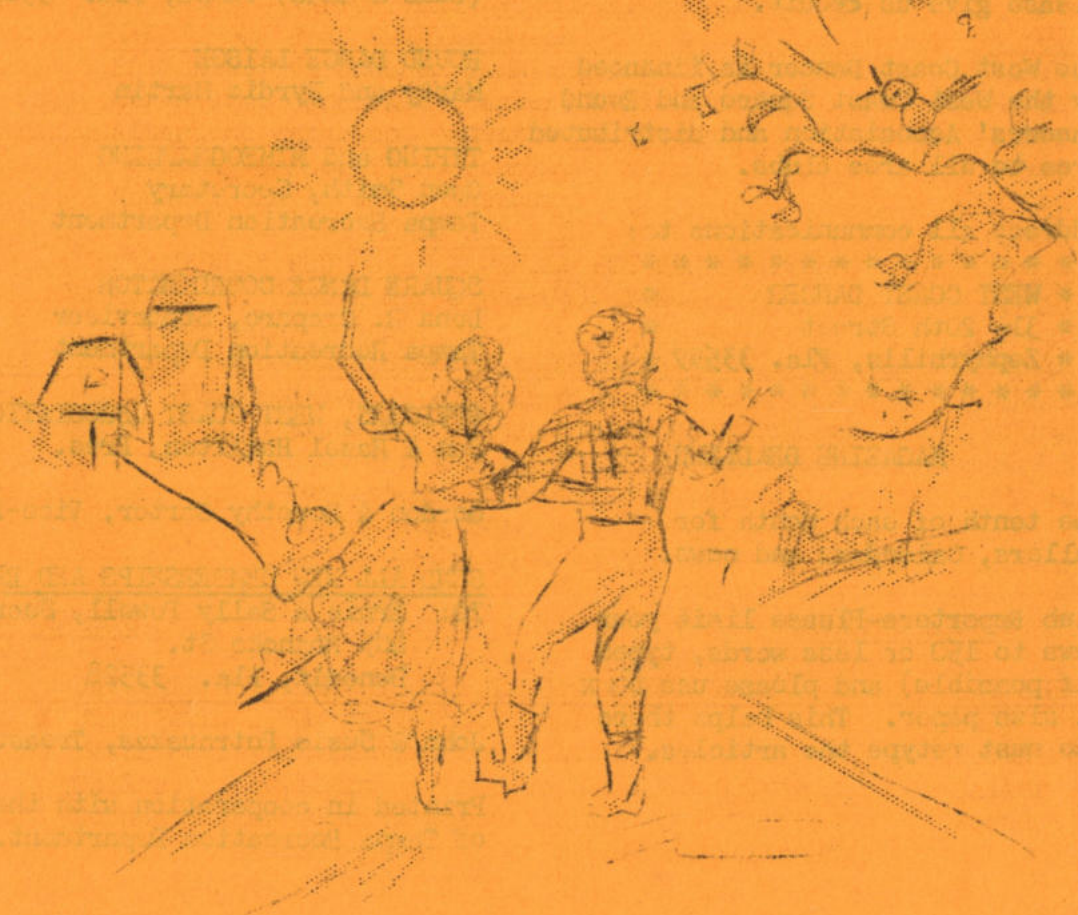

KITCHEN TALK

In the absence of our usual recipe from Ruth Kincaid, I have dug into my old standby and come up with the following dinner which you can prepare ahead of time when we have a big festival going on. Both recipes from Bon Appetit.

CASSEROLE ROASTED PORK (serves six)

3 lbs.	boneless fresh pork shoulder	3/4 cup	small stuffed olives
	salt & pepper	1/4 cup	chopped parsley
1/2 t.	thyme leaves	1 T	cornstarch
2	cloves garlic	1/2 cup	water
12	small new potatoes, pared		
12	small white onions		

Trim a little fat from pork; render in large skillet. Season pork with salt & pepper; place in skillet and brown on all sides. Place browned pork in a roasting pan with cover. Reserve pork fat in skillet. Sprinkle meat with thyme; add garlic. Bake, covered in 325 degree oven one hour. Meanwhile, lightly brown potatoes and onions in reserved pork fat; drain. Remove garlic from casserole. Add vegetables & sprinkle with 1/2 teaspoon salt. Add olives & parsley. Bake covered, 1 hour, 15 minutes longer. Remove meat, vegetables & olives to serving dish. Blend cornstarch and water; stir into meat juices. Cook & stir until sauce boils one minute. Pour over pork.

To serve with this, you might like some

SANGRIA

1 fifth bottle	dry red wine	1 pkg.	frozen peaches w/ syrup
juice of 1/2	lemon	spiral of	orange peel or cucumber rind
juice of one	orange	soda &	ice cubes

Combine wine with fruit juices and peaches. Let stand until peaches are defrosted. Pour into tall pitcher, add 6 to 8 ice cubes and the orange peel. Fill pitcher with club soda. Makes about 10 servings.

SEVEN SHORT CUTS TO STYLE

1. Relax - only when you're relaxed can your personality shine out. From head to toe, no stiffness!!
2. Keep Compact - Style on the move should be subtle rather than flamboyant. So never over-do! Keep your body compact and weight well over your feet.
3. Accent - Listen for the accented beats of the music. Once you feel them, accent your steps; put a bit more foot pressure into the strong beats. This can add new color to your dancing. Caution: don't out-accent your partner.
4. Blend - While accenting, remember to blend. Carry over each step smoothly into the next. Think of taking steps in a group (box, scissors, pivot). The style note is that you'll feel and look more sure of what you're doing.
5. Watch others - A fast way to add striking touches to your dancing is to steal a little style! Watch someone whose dancing style you admire and be a copycat...but be subtle.
6. Think - A little head work will help your footwork. Are you on the balls of your feet? Are your toes pointed? Are your knees relaxed and close together?
7. Have fun - Being alert to the rules of dancing is fine - if you're also alert to your partner. Have fun! Sparkle - the fastest short cut to style on the dance floor. And it's so easy!

DC'S FOR THE MAN

- DO: Keep your arms up steadily in position at all times.
Stand up comfortably straight and not stiffly.
Keep your weight evenly balanced over your feet when still.
Keep your weight slightly forward when moving.
Keep your head up so that you can see where you are going.

DO'S FOR THE LADY

- DO: Remember the man is the leader.
Try and keep yourself balanced & not rely on him to do so for you.
Keep your weight evenly balanced over your feet when still.
Keep your weight slightly forward when moving.
Remember to keep your body weight upward in the body, not down.
Hold the weight of you own arms up.
