CAMPERS 21st ANNUAL FLORIDA STATE CONVENTION CAMPERS

FLORIDA FEDERATION OF SQUARE & ROUND DANCERS

Did you know that there is a state wide organization for square and round dancers? There is-and the next few magazines will attempt to make all dancers aware of it.

The Federation was formed in the mid 50's, as a preliminary requisite for Florida hosting a National Convention in 1962. It was necessary to have a dancer group that was state wide.

The Federation consists of four associations from different parts of the state. The West Coast Assn., North East Assn., South East Assn., and the Central Assn. The Florida Federation was formed by several interested callers and square dancers.

The objective of the Federation is to promote square and round dancing, to encourage the formation of clubs, to serve as a clearing house for information with dance groups throughout the nation, and to bring about a spirit of cooperation among callers, teachers and dancers. The promotion of a state convention is among the top priorities of the Federation.
