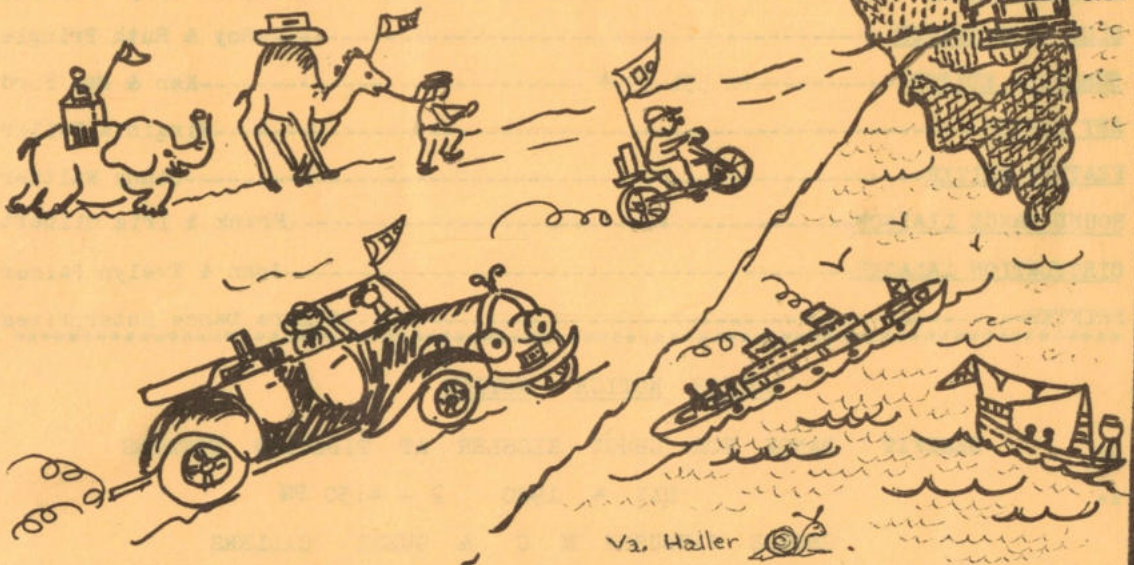

MERIT AWARD— The Community Blood Bank's Third Annual Award Luncheon for blood bank organizations was held March 17 at Bayfront Concourse, St. Petersburg.

A merit bar, representing 121 units of blood donated in 1979 by our dancers, was presented to West Coast Association. This bar was attached to a plaque received by WCA in 1978, when our donations were 52 units.

Don Doddridge, CBB Executive Director, stated that only 3% of eligible persons contribute to blood bank programs. These few donors support and supply the needs of all hospitals and medical treatment centers in this country. So, it is very evident that a donor is someone "extra special."

TOO MANY FESTIVALS??

A conversation between several couples was overheard recently and their comments were "Too many festivals" and Too many dances being written for these festivals".

In June of 1979, 112 different dances were taught at various R/D functions during the month. (festivals, week-ends, camp-outs, etc.) involving R/D teaching held throughout the U.S. and Canada. This is almost one per week in each state. These affairs may be cut down to some extent due to the gasoline prices and other shortages--but is this big push for festivals, etc., the answer to provide a good and enjoyable activity in our home club programs?

If a festival includes the teaching of 8 or 10 dances, what is the final result? Only a limited number of these dances will be picked up and used by the local teacher. However, pressure by couples attending the festival is always present wanting the local teacher to use the dances each couple particularly likes. Regardless of what dance is picked, the local teacher must reteach it, as dancers going through 4 or 5 dances during a weekend come home with little knowledge of the dances involved and must be given a complete breakdown of the dance before they feel at ease and can do the dance as they desire.

Another comment was that it is fun to meet and visit with friends from other areas. This, of course, is an important part of round dancing, but is this true when these affairs are being generated so often? It is a part of the earnings of some R/D leaders, it is true, but are diluting the pleasurable activity as a whole?
