PUMPKIN MUFFINS

- | | |
|-------------------|---------------|
| 1½ C Flour | 1½ C Oil |
| 2 t Baking Powder | 1 Egg, beaten |
| ¾ t Salt | 1 C Pumpkin |
| 2/3 C Sugar | 1½ C Milk |
| ½ t Cinnamon | ½ C Raisins |
| ½ t Nutmeg | |

Sift together all above ingredients. Combine 1 beaten egg, oil, pumpkin, milk and raisins and stir into dry ingredients - blend. Pour into greased muffin tins (½ full), sprinkle sugar over top. Bake 15 minutes in 350 degree oven. Makes 12 muffins.

BLUE BERRY SUPREME

| 20 Graham Crackers, crushed |
| ½ C Brown Sugar |
| ¼ lb. Oleo or Butter, melted |

Combine ingredients and pack in greased 8" x 10" baking dish. Cream 1-8 oz. pkg. Phil. Creamcheese, add ½ C white sugar and cream together; 2 beaten eggs and 2 T lemon juice, mix all together and pour over graham cracker mixture. Bake 25 minutes at 350 degrees. When ready to serve, spread top with 1 can "Comstock Blue Berry Pie Mix." Top with ice cream or Cool Whip. Serves 8 to 10 persons.

PUMPKIN MUFFINS

We try to be the "voice-of-the-average-square-dancer." Not everyone will agree with all their opinions, but you will find their thinking stimulating and thought provoking.

We are all in favor of dancing your "own way", as long as you do not interfere with the flow of the dance or other dancers. Fast twirlers have lots of fun and everyone watches but they MUST arrive in position at the same time everyone else does.

The same holds true for kicking, stomping and yelling as well as other show off "so your own things." Have a ball, but not at the expense of the next square that can't hear the caller for your noise.

Recent conventions and dances have been marred by a few selfish dancers that do not consider anyone else but themselves. A Crowded Floor is NO PLACE TO KICK OR STOMP. Keep this means of expressing your exhilaration for the private club, or exhibition floor. Several persons were injured seriously recently when kicked or stomped. NOT by teenagers, either, 'tho they usually are blamed for their exhuberance. In every instance mentioned, the injured specified a "mature" person was guilty.

Square dancing is still dancing and must be done with a personal flair, but not at the expense of the dancing pleasure of others.

We hope with all the new classes and workshops the callers will spend a few moments on courtesy and styling of the NEW type of Western Square Dancing in contrast to the old stomping, kicking and yelling of the barn dance.

Show off if you like - dance with your own flair...that is what the whole movement is about, but - others have the same right you have.

Dance WITH others - not FOR yourself.
