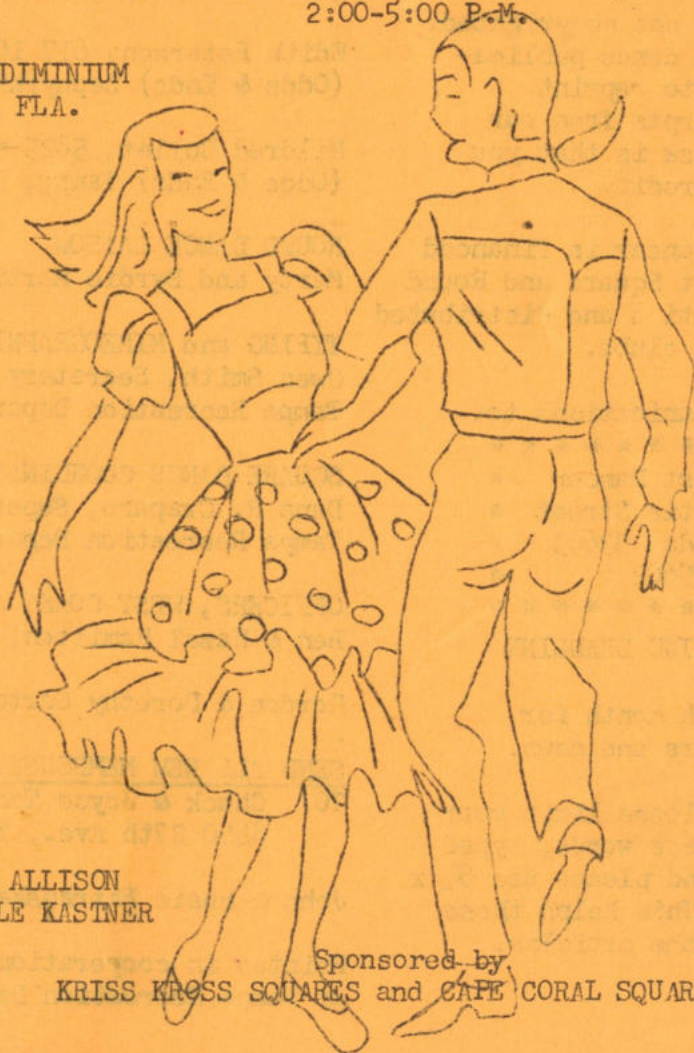

GRAHAM CRACKER NUT BARS

- 32 Graham Crackers "whole" 1 C Sugar
 3½ oz. can Flaked Cocoanut ½ C Milk
 2 sticks melted oleo 1 C Pecans chopped
 1 C Graham Cracker Crumbs 1 Egg well beaten

Line bottom of 9" x 13" baking dish with a layer of whole crackers.

Combine butter, sugar, milk and egg. Cook, stirring constantly until mixture comes to a boil. Remove from heat and add cocoanut, nuts and cracker crumbs. Spread over crackers and top with another layer of whole graham crackers. FROST.

- Frosting 1 stick soft oleo ¼ C pecans chopped
 6 T light cream or milk 2 C conf. sugar
 1 t vanilla

Combine butter, cream sugar and vanilla and beat until fluffy. Frost top of bars or squares (cut as desired). Sprinkle nuts over frosting.

Refrigerated 24 hours. These can be frozen after cutting.

CRAZY PIE

Melt ¾ of stick of oleo in 9" x 9" x 2" cake pan. Mix ¾ C sugar, ¾ C flour, 2 t baking powder and 1/8 t salt together.

Add ¾ C milk and mix all together and pour over melted butter. Pour 1 can of fruit pie filling over the mixture. Bake 30 to 40 minutes at 400 degrees.

- 1 Waltz Forward In CP waltz forward LOD L,R, close L:
- 2 Drift apart Taking short stps (W long stps) drift apart to arms length with M's L & W's R hands only R,L,R:
- 3 Change sides (W twirl) Fwd LOD L,R,L turning 1/2 LF (W twirl: 1/2 RF across in front of M) end in loose CP facing RLOD
- 4 Twinkle thru XRIF (WXLIF) toward wall, side L, close R;
- 5 Twinkle in XLIB (W XRIB) Diag twd COH, side R, close L.
- 6 Twinkle out XLIB (W XLIB) diag twd wall, side L, Close R ending in closed position facing wall:
