## KITCHEN

## KORNER

SHRIMP SALAD SUPREME

- 1 lb. cooked shrimp      1 cup celery chopped fine  
 3 pkg. Phila. cream cheese      1 cup green pepper chopped fine  
 1 can tomato soup (heated)      1 cup mayonnaise  
 1 pkg. lemon Jello      1 small onion grated

Dissolve jello in hot tomato soup; add to cream cheese, a little at a time to blend smoothly. Add other ingredients. Place in mold and chill in refrigerator until congealed.

WESTHAVEN CAKE

Combine and let stand while you mix batter:

- 1 pkg. dates  
 1 cup hot water  
 1 tsp. baking soda

- Batter: 1 cup sugar      1 tsp. vanilla  
          1/2 cup butter or margarine      1 tbsp. cocoa  
          2 eggs      1 & 3/4 cups flour

Cream sugar and margarine, add eggs, vanilla, and cocoa - then flour. Lastly add date mixture. Spread in a pan about 3/4" thick.

Over the top, spread:

- 1 pkg. semi-sweet chocolate chips  
 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes. Serve plain or with whipped topping, if desired.
