Work 5 rows of SC on edge of front, spacing button holes of right side in the middle row. For Button hole, or holes, work in SC up to where you want the button hole, ch 3 or 4, depending on size of button, skipping equal amount of sts, then resume SC.

LEGACY  
LEADERS GATHERED for COMMITMENT & YAK

We toss around words like Callerlab & LEGACY without really knowing what they represent or how they apply to the Square Dance Movement. This month we are going to try clear up some of the mystery surrounding the LEGACY organization. While ordinary club dancers may never know a Legacy Trustee, his life and especially his recreation will be affected by actions and decisions made by this group as they guide our movement.

LEGACY is an "International assembly of trustees of the square dancing activity". Back in 1972 Charlie Baldwin (New England Caller), Stan Burdick (American Square Dance) and Bob Osgood (Square Dancing) met in New York to discuss the needs of a badly fragmented movement and possible ways to insure the future of square dancing. These three publishers of square dance magazines believed that if a group representing all possible facets of square dancing could be assembled in a solution-oriented meeting, the 3 C's (Coordination, Cooperation and Continuity) could be accomplished to give the movement direction and permanence. This group would include representatives of such organizations as Record Companies, Callerlab, Square Dance Associations, Square Dance Suppliers, Square Dance Publications and many many more, in order to have all facets of the movement represented.

In May, 1973 100 leaders from U.S. and Canada met in Cleveland, Ohio and Legacy 1 was formerly under way. This assembly concerned itself with 10 agenda items which included; Image, Leadership, Heritage, Standardization, Ethics, etc.

200 Trustees from 36 states, Canada and Germany met, May 5-8, 1977 at Memphis, Tenn. as Legacy 111. Considerable time during the four day meeting was spent in solution-oriented discussions and projected plans for mini-Legacy sessions around the world. The main purpose of a mini-Legacy is to bring leadership awareness, training and communications into Square Dance population centers.

How does all this affect you as a dancer or as a leader within the movement? So What? Charlie Baldwin said it best, "Legacy is a must to balance Callerlab. A viable organization is necessary to give the American Folk Dance balance. For the benefit of the whole, every segment (of square dancing) has need of a floor to voice opinions and discuss directions. LEGACY must provide a place."

The present Florida LEGACY trustees are Chet & Julia Vetter and George & Judy Garland of the North East Florida Square Dance Association. These trustees are appointed by a committee of LEGACY and this responsibility is given only to the most knowledgeable and dedicated leaders within an area.

## TIPS FOR BETTER DANCING

In learnig a call, try to understans the defination of the call rather than just memorizing a position. If you understand the defination you will be able to do the call from any position but if you have memorized one position you will be lost of the call is used from any other poaition.

If after the call is taught and you are not sure of the definition, as the caller to explain it to you again.

If a set consists of two strong couples and two weak couples, the strong couples should be across from each other when squared up. This will give each couple a strong corner and provide each side of the square with a strong couple.

At the completion of any basic you should immediately extend your hands and take the hand next to you. This will help you see the formation you are in and be ready for the next call. Failure to join hands will result in sloppy lines or waves.

Whenever possible use forearm grips for turning movements such as swing thru, spin the top, turn thru, etc. This will enable your turns to be made more precise and keep you square together.

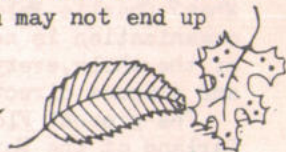
If you become lost, turn your head in all directions to see where you should be. Oftentimes someone else can point to your spot. When you become lost, do not wander around but stay alert and watch the rest of the square for an open spot and then take it.

If you want to help someone that is lost, try to avoid talking and instead use hand signals. A very effective method is to point to the spot they should be in. Don't push. Most people don't like being pushed. Don't talk, this will cause you and the others in your square to miss the next call.

If the caller calls a call you have never heard, do not give up and quit. The caller will usually give the directions to the call while you are dancing.

If your square breaks down, take the nearest opposite sex and form lines and as soon as you see the other squares in lines pick up the action. You may not end up with your original corner or partner, but you will be dancing.

And remember a smile and helping hand will go a long way!



### Ripple Cape Crocheted Directions

Always work in the back loop of stitches except for the neck band. Use a size G or H hook and about 4 skeins of 4oz., 4ply worsted or dacron sayelle. The sayelle can be thrown in the washer and dryer, coming out beautiful as long as you don't use hot water. Chain 118, (working from neck). SC in 2nd st from hook, 1SC in next st, 3SC in next, 1 SC in each of next 2 st. \*Skip 2 sts, 1 SC in each of the next 2 sts, 3 SC in next st, 1 SC in each of next 2 sts, repeat from \* across ch ending to correspond, ch 1, turn.

2nd row: Working in back loop of sts throughout, dec 1 st (dec by inserting hook in st, pull yarn through, insert hook in next st, pull yarn through, YO and work off all loops at one time). SC in next SC \* 3SC in next SC, 1 SC in each of the next 2 SC, skip next 2 SC, 1 SC in each of the next 2 SC, repeat from \* across row ending to correspond, dec 1 st at end of row, ch 1, turn. Repeat 2nd row throughout increasing in every 6 rows until there are 8 SC before and after center st of each point. (To increase, work in same manner, but work 2 SC in SC before the center st of point, 3 SC in point and 2 SC in next SC after point.) Work down in pattern until cape is length desired.

Neck Band: With right side of 1st row toward you, attach yarn in 1st point. Work 2 SC in same space, 2 SC in each remaining point. Ch 1 to turn each row. 2nd & 3rd rows: Working through both loops of sts., work 1 SC in each Sc, cut yarn. Directions continued on inside back cover

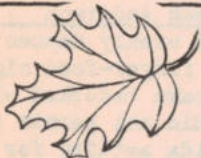

16oz. Cream Cheese, 8oz. grated sharp cheddar(or Kraft sharp cheese), 1 1/2 tsp. Worcester Sauce, 3 tsp. minced dried onion. Let cheeses soften at room temperature. 3c.flour, 2c. sugar, 2teas. salt, 2teas.baking soda, 6teas. cocoa. Sift all together in pan, flatten out and make 4 holes with back of spoon. Put in one hole 2teas. vanilla, in another hole 2tblsp. vinegar, in the other 2 holes-10tblsp. melted Oleo. Pour 2 cups luke warm water over all. Mix well and bake 30 min. or longer in 350 degree oven.
