ADVANCED DANCING'S BASIC CALLS

This list has been compiled for those who desire more material above club level dancing. These calls will give you a basic knowledge of the hi-frequency material and get you in on the ground floor of advanced level dancing.

All 4 couple movements:  
Right & left thru, star thru, pass thru, curlique, cross trail

Acey deucey  
Arky allemande/arky grand  
Arky star thru

Cast a shadow  
Chain reaction

Circulates:  
Cross over circulate  
Trade circulate (from 2-faced lines & waves)  
In roll circulate/Out roll circulate  
Clover and (anything)

Diamond formations:  
Cut the diamond  
6 by 2 acey deucey  
Double star thru/Triple star thru

Ends bend  
Explode the line  
Explode (anything)

Fractional tops (1/4 top, 1/2 top, 3/4 top)

Half breed thru  
Horseshoe turn  
Hourglass formation:  
Hourglass circulate  
Cut the hourglass/Flip the hourglass

Load the boat  
Lockit

Mix (anything) and mix, such as swing & mix, circulate & mix, etc.

Motivate

Pass and roll  
Pass in/Pass out  
Pass the sea

Quarter in/Quarter out  
Quarter thru/ 3/4 thru

Recycle (facing couples)  
Remake the set-up  
(Right or left) roll to an ocean wave  
Round off

Scoot back variations:  
Scoot and dodge

Spin the windmill (circulators go as directed)

Friendship is the only cement that will ever hold the world together.

A few people have accused this magazine of being oriented toward the new graduate and the problems inherent in becoming an accomplished club dancer. If the care and nurturing of those who will succeed us and keep our hobby alive and well constitutes "orientation toward"--then we must plead guilty and be proud of it. It is with the new dancer, anxious to excel, from which our enthusiasm springs, not from the experienced who have either settled into a comfortable groove of "Pass through and bend the Line," or have gone into tape seclusion in order to hone their skill.

In a few short years our activity has moved from simple fun oriented clubs to at least mainstream plus, from all positions, with emphasis on raising the level everywhere. This is a bootstrap operation and one which is largely the result of popular demand. While this trend has solved one problem it has created another. How does the new graduate make the ever widening transition from serious student to well adjusted club dancer? When does he or she become an encouraged participant as opposed to a disappointed drop out?

We tell prospective recruits how much fun our hobby is and try to convince them that they should try it for the good of whatever their problem is. We do not lie to them, but we are guilty of running a con game because we minimize the long hard 30 to 40 weeks of lessons they must endure just to learn the language and do not even mention the total lack of transition facilities to bridge the gap between classes and club.

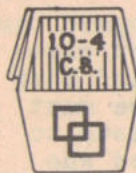
It is true that the length of our classes is fast approaching the limit if we are to attract recruits. It is simply not worth 35 to 40 weeks of preparation to find out that they are not ready to enter the square dance scene. Where are these new people going to go for the practice, encouragement, and instruction they need to become full time participants? Certainly not at a club dance where they may be shunned, avoided, looked down on, and otherwise made to feel inadequate or even unwelcome.

One thing is clear--we do not have answers to these problems. Solutions must rest with clubs, callers, associations, federations, and other organized groups. We cannot afford to ignore the trend and hope that it will go away. Perhaps a series of NEW DANCER WORKSHOPS would provide a solution. These workshops would list definite goals and limitations and be designed to bridge the gap between basic classes and club involvement. Such workshops would provide the practice which is so essential to making the calls second nature and would, at the same time, introduce the plus material from an all position concept.

One may say that such workshops already exist--and this is true up to a point. However, they are so fragmented that most die off because they are not financially feasible. One cannot expect callers to give their time and expertise to three or four squares. Even five or six squares will not pay for a hall and leave anything for a caller.

We were very much impressed by the "Freshman Frolics" sponsored by the Sun Coast Callers last winter. 50 squares turned out for the first one and 20 to 25 squares after the winter people headed north. We suggest a bi-monthly ROOKIE workshop be organized along the same lines to encompass all new graduates in an area; i. e., Tampa or Pinellas County, or both. Such a program would fill a need for the dancers and be financially attractive to the caller. WHAT DO YOU THINK? We would appreciate caller opinion, too.

## a big 10-4 ole buddy !

### CROCHETED STOLE

This crocheted stole takes about 12 ounces of 4 ply yarn and size H crochet hook.

#### Abbreviations:

sc (single crochet), sk (skip), ch (chain), sp (space), dc (double chr.)

#### Gauge:

1 1/2 inches between center dcs of two groups

With size H crochet hook, ch 215 to measure about 60 inches.

Sc in second ch from hook and in each ch across--214 sc, ch 1, turn.

Next row: Sc in first sc,\* ch 2, sk 2 sc, sc in next sc, repeat from\* to end--71ch 2 sps.

Pattern Row 1: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sp,\* ch 2, 3dc in next sp (group) ch 2, sc in next sp, repeat from \* to end.

Row 2: Ch 4, turn, sc in center dc of 11rst group,\* ch 2, sc in next sp, repeat from \*, ending ch 3, sk last ch 2 sp, sc in next sc.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn, sc in ch 3 sp, ch 2, 3 dc group in next sp,\* ch 2, sc in next sp, ch 2, 3 dc group in next sp, repeat from \*, ending ch 3, sk 1 sp, sc in next sc.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until there are 3 sps in row.

Next Row: Ch 3, turn, sc in first sp, ch 2, 3 dc group in next sp, ch 2, sc in next sc.

Last Row--(Wrong Side): Ch 4, turn, sc in center dc of group, ch 3, sc in next sc, fasten off.

Fringe: Wrap yarn around a 6-inch cardboard. Cut at one end. Fold 4 strands in half. Insert hook from right side in ch 3 sp around sides. Draw fold through. Draw cut ends through fold to form knot on wrong side. Knot fringe in each ch 3 sp. Trim evenly.

## THE TEN POINTS OF LEGACY

# LEGACY

1. The Image of Square Dancing: A booklet should be produced to show non-dancers a true picture of our hobby; this booklet should be made available to all at a minimum cost to be placed in public libraries and other places where the public may see it.

2. Leadership: There is a need for a study to identify objectives of any square or round dance group. Different groups have different objectives. All groups should determine and identify what their objectives are. Only after such a study can the type of leadership required to meet this objective be determined.

3. Communications: Because the language of square dancing is not always understood by the non-dancing public, the activity must translate it's message into the simplest and most visual methods possible. National and closed circuit educational television should be explored as methods of presenting and, in some cases, teaching square dancing. Word of mouth remains the best method of "getting the word" from the dancers and leaders to non-dancers and new dancers.

4. Ecology: Caller-leadership training should emphasize that a major responsibility of the caller is a knowledge of the needs and ultimate satisfaction of the dancer. This involves being able to relate tactfully to the dancer's ability to enjoy square dancing at (for him) a comfortable level. This same knowledge and responsibility is also shared by dancer leadership.

5. Heritage: Because it appears vital that dancers, leaders, teachers and callers be aware of the heritage of square dancing, it is recommended that appropriate historical material be incorporated into any future square dancing booklets and training manuals.

6. The Business Side of Square Dancing: Callers', teachers', and leaders' fees will be naturally dictated by the laws of supply and demand and will take into consideration the ability and personality of the individual.

7. Standardization: Standardization is required for the over-all good of the activity. It is recommended that standardization be accomplished through a nationally coordinated educational program of callers, teachers and leaders and that the results be published through a coordinated effort of the media.

8. Ethics and Attitudes: Callers and dancer leaders should educate by example and instruction that appropriate square dance apparel should be worn at all public and open dances at all times. National publications should educate the square dance world that for the best interest of the activity dancers should refrain from partaking of alcoholic beverages immediately before or during square dance events.

9. Organization: All levels of club organization must function on the premise that the dancer is the whole reason for the existence of the movement. The well-being of the dancer and his local club should be the major concern of all organizations who should insure that his wants and needs are fulfilled.

10. Unlimited Horizons: The heritage, history and background of the American Square Dance should be incorporated into all levels of leadership training with the object being that the more we know about the past, the better we can do today and the more effectively we can plan for the future.
