NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE ASSOCIATION??

There is a grass roots movement among several state square dance organizations to form a National Square Dance Association. The Florida Square Dance Association will be represented by Joe Vaccari of Fort Walton Beach at the initial meetings. At a feasibility meeting in Memphis at the National Convention Mr. Vaccari was named as a regional delegate representing Fla, Geo. N.C. and S.C.

The purpose of a national organization would be to give the various state dancer groups a cohesive unity they now lack. The members would concern themselves with such projects as National Folk dance, Square Dance Week, education and general promotion of all phases of dancing. ## *New State Dress*



CROCHETED STARS - 1982 DEBUT



Since stars are an integral part of the 1982 convention outfits, we are printing instructions for crocheted stars as furnished by Irma Lucas. We hope that all those among our readers who crochet will help us provide them for non-crocheters.

Materials: White Knit-Cro-Sheen by J.P. Coats (or similar weight.) Size 6 (Dritz) crochet hook. A 400 yard ball of Knit-Cro-Sheen will make approximately 135 stars. (55 are needed for each 1982 outfit).

Directions: Ch 5 & join with sl st to form ring. Ch 2 & work 14 half dble in ring, joining with sl st in top of ch 2.

\* Ch 7, sl st in second chain from hook, S in next ch, half dbl in next chain, dbl in each of next 2 chains, tr in last chain; skip 2 half dbles of previous round (ring) and sl st in next half dbl. Repeat from \* four times and fasten off.

For those not able to procure crocheted stars we will provide a pattern of the right size so that stars may be cut from white felt.

To enable Round Dancers to better evaluate a round dance, Roundalab, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, has adopted a point system devised by Dave and Shirley Fleck of Toledo, Ohio. Basically every dance figure and/or combination, dance position and the repetition and layout of sequence are assigned a point value. A total figure is determined for every dance.

By comparing the dance rating number to the current "guide", a Round Dance teacher and/or dancer can more accurately determine where a dance fits in the total round dance picture. These are the plateaus currently in use: 0 - 60 easy for non round dancers, 61 - 125 square dance rounds, 126 - 175 easy intermediate, 176 - 250 intermediate, 251 - 299 high intermediate.



One question that is often asked ---- What must I do to receive blood from the WCA Blood Bank? Answer: First, one must be a member of WCA in good standing—that is, one who has paid dues for the current year at least 30 days prior to his or her request for blood. Yearly membership dues cover the period between January 1 and December 31 inclusive.

Second, the chairman should be notified and furnished with the following information: Name and address of patient, date of hospital entry, name of hospital and approximate number of units needed, if known. Your chairman will verify your eligibility and authorize withdrawal from the West Coast Association account. In the event of an emergency, these procedures may be accomplished after the fact.

TURKEY CASSEROLE

Turkey (dark & light pieces left over from Thanksgiving)  
 1 can french cut green beans 1 c. grated sharp cheddar cheese  
 1 can seedless black olives (lg) 3/4 c. mayonnaise  
 1 can cream of chicken soup 1 medium onion  
 1 can cream of mushroom soup 1 box frozen onion rings.

Combine turkey and mushroom soups, grated cheese, mayonnaise and grated onion. Heat until smooth. In bottom of pyrex casserole dish, place a layer of turkey and cover with layer of french cut beans. Pour the sauce over the turkey and beans. Cut olives in half and place on top. Bake in oven for 45 min. at 350°. Last 15 minutes place onion rings on top. This is quick and delicious! Serve 6-8



SAUCY CRANBERRY

Part I Dissolve in pan 2 pkg. cherry jello, 2 c. boiling water, 2 1/2 c. sugar.  
 Part II Blend in blender 1 1/2 c. orange juice, 1 lb. cranberries.  
 Add to above then add 6 large apples, diced fine and 2 T. orange rind (optional).  
 Mix well and store in jars in refrigerator.
