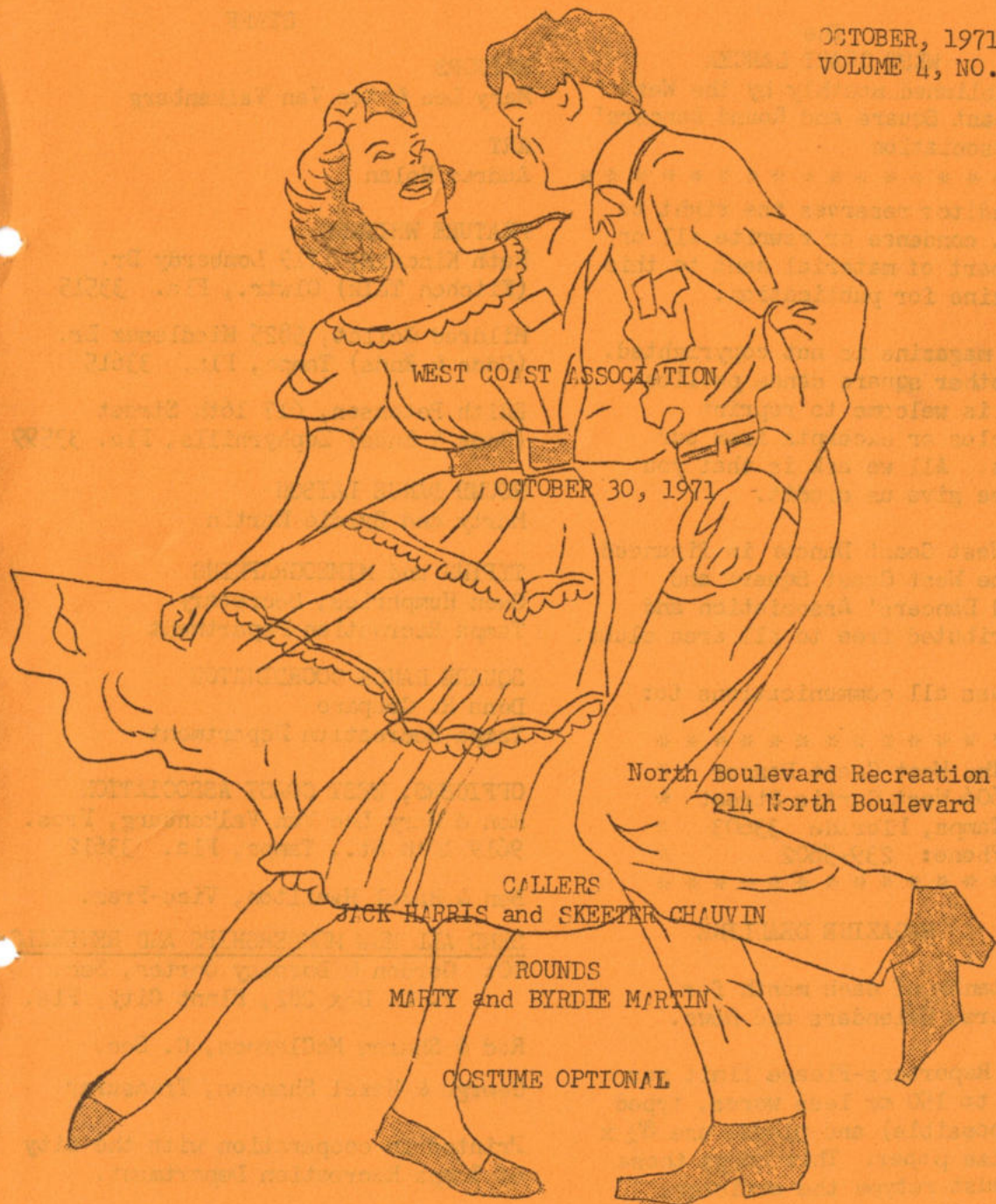

TABLE TALK

"LICKIN" GOOD DINNER

2½ or 3 lb. chuck roast, place on heavy foil on cookie sheet, peel potatoes and carrots and stack along side of roast. Cover meat, potatoes and carrots with 1 can of mushroom soup, then sprinkle one package "Lipton's Dry Onion Soup" all over entire roast, potatoes and carrots. Use enough foil to completely seal entirely over meat and potatoes and carrots. "A good idea is to place meat and vegetables on one piece of foil then cover thoroughly with another piece of foil." Be sure to bring bottom foil up and over top foil to complete sealing of the two foils. Roast in 300 degree oven for 4 hours or more. If prepared properly you will have a very tender and flavorful dinner.

VEAL CUTLETS

Use 6 or 8 thin sliced veal cutlets, bread and brown in skillet. Put ½ can (6-oz.) Hunts Tomato Sauce in greased casserole, place cutlets over the sauce and pour remaining ½-can of sauce over cutlets. 1-C grated mozzarella or parmesan cheese on top. Place foil over dish and bake 45 minutes in 325 degree oven.

CORNED BEEF CASSEROLE

1-can corned beef ½-C chopped onions
 1-box cooked macaroni
 Heat together 1-C milk and 1-can cream of chicken soup. Butter baking dish. Combine corned beef, chopped onions and macaroni and pour over with the milk and chicken soup mixture. Add the grated cheese to taste and bake about 30 or 35 minutes in moderate oven (350 degrees).

BASICS and WORKSHOPS

Today, everything is bigger and better. Square and round dancing is following the current trend. There have never been so many basic classes in either form of recreation. Many who danced years ago are rejoining us and realize the necessity of again going through basics to dance well.

It is natural for a new graduate or one who has not danced for years to be embarrassed or frightened when attending open dances or conventions. No less than 20 lessons covering the first 50 basics plus practice make a dancer. A GOOD dancer requires at least 30 lessons, 75 basics and LOTS of practice. A few callers and even the dancers well meaning friends often encourage new dancers to venture out before they are prepared, not thinking of other experienced dancers who have paid their money to DANCE. There isn't one of us that will not help a new dancer but the fundamentals are necessary before they can understand that help. Trying to run before learning to walk discourages many dancers and is one of the reasons we lose so many dancers every year.

Continuing to attend workshops and classes is necessary for new material is always being presented. They also help a dancer to react automatically to basic calls (there is no time to stop and think about the right way to go in the middle of a figure). All 75 basics should be firmly established in the dancers mind so that he can move effortlessly from one figure to another.

In round dancing to learn each dance step by step is very hard and each dance must be memorized. Good basics again come through here for with a good understanding of the 2-step, waltz and the positions, easy rounds can be followed by cues the same as square dancing.
