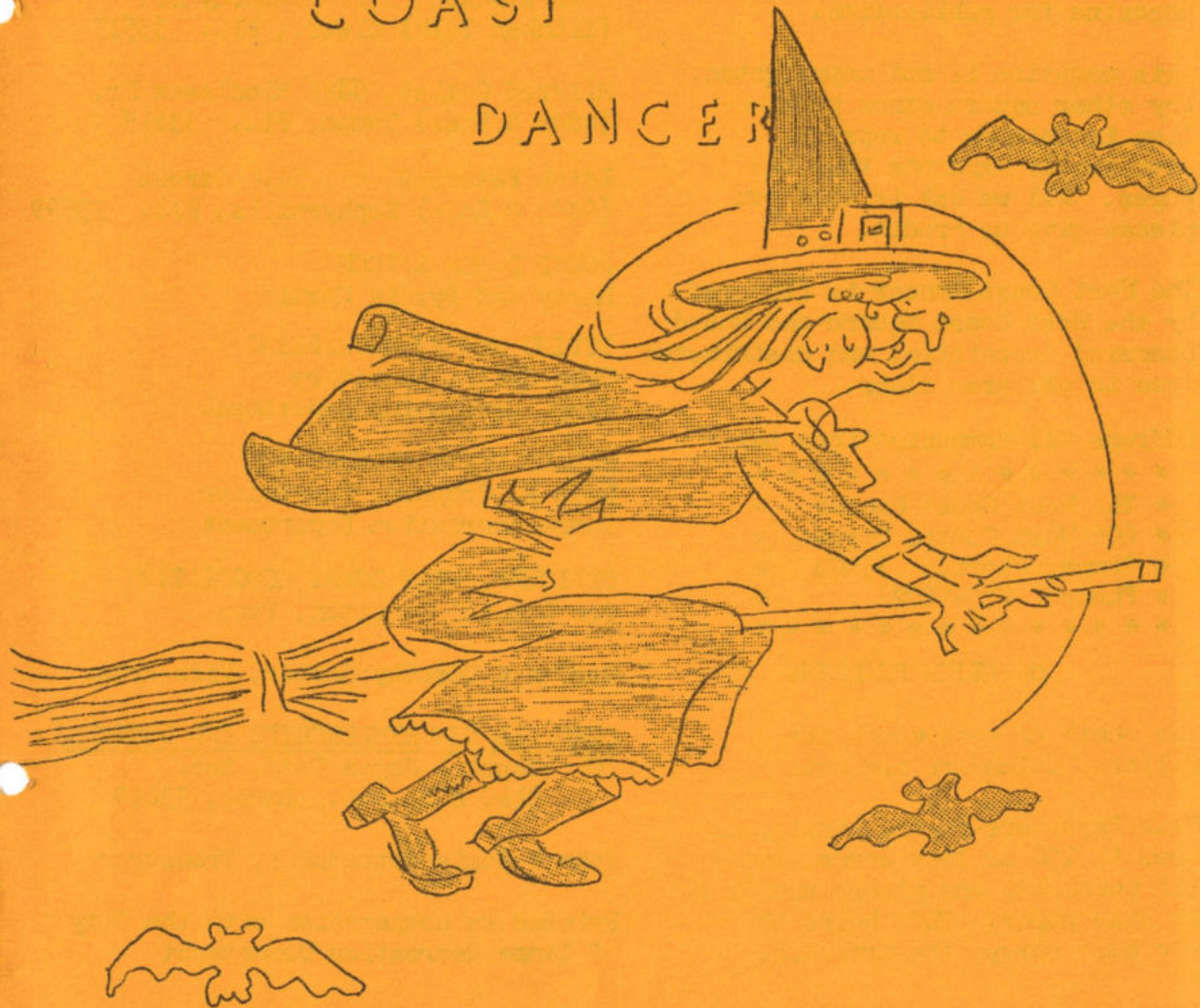

## CHICKEN MEDLEY CASSEROLE

- 1 Chicken  
 2 Medium onions (chopped)  
 1/2 C Ripe olives (chopped)  
 1 can Pimentos (chopped)  
 1/2 lb. Processed cheese  
 1 C buttered bread crumbs  
 1/4 t Pepper  
 2 1/2 C Sea shell macaroni, cook until tender. Stew chicken until tender, cool and remove meat, cut in small pieces. Cook chopped onions and celery in broth. Measure broth, add water if needed to make 3-C. Mix flour and milk, add to broth, heat and stir until thick, add cheese, stir to melt, add salt, pepper, chicken, olives, pimentos, almonds, worchestershire sauce. Stir until well blended then pour over cooked macaroni, cover with buttered crumbs. Bake 30 minutes in 350 degree oven. Serve.
