It is with deep regret that we announce that Marty Winter of Northport passed away on September 7 due to a combination of pneumonia and a weak heart. Marty was well known as a square and round dance leader in the New Jersey, New York City and Long Island area before retiring to Florida after a severe heart attack. He and Flo have been active in teaching square and round dancing in Port Charlotte, Venice and Englewood. In addition to publishing his original square dance material in national publications for many years, he choreographed several original round dances including "Invisible Tears" and "Moon Eyes". Marty will be missed by his many square and round dance friends and followers in our area. We extend our sincere sympathy to his family.

2 2/3 cups crushed pretzels--not too fine  
3/4 cup butter  
3 tbsp. sugar--mix and put in pan. Bake 400 about 10 mins. Cool.

1 8oz. pkg. Cream cheese--softened  
1 cup sugar--mix with cream cheese  
2 envelopes Dream Whip--whipped. Fold into cream cheese and sugar mixture and spread over cooled pretzel crust.

Dissolve 2 pkgs. Strawberry jello in 2 cups boiling water. Add 2 10 oz. pkgs. frozen strawberries. Stir until strawberries melt. Cool until almost set., pour over cream cheese and cool.
