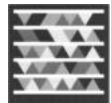
First of all, most, but not all of the square dance clubs only charge \$5-6 admission fee. For that small charge you have at least 2 full hours of great square dancing, round dancing, fellowshiping with some of the nicest people that you might ever come in contact with. The dance that you attend normally has snacks, finger foods and goodies of some kind to munch on - at no extra charge. Sound good so far?

Western style square dancing today is not like it was "back in the day". Modern music is used, music that you can sing along with, has a wonderful beat and makes you want to keep your fingers tapping on the table if you are not on floor participating in the great fun. Alcohol is not allowed at any square dance function and then, to my knowledge, very few people ever go outside to "smoke".

In the summertime most clubs go "casual" in dress which of course means that you can wear jeans or capris, short sleeve shirts and be comfy depending on the temperature. During the rest of the year square dance clothes are adorning the floors all over the place. 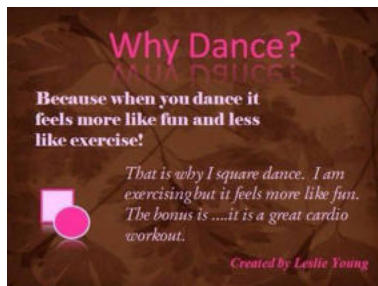

I don't know about you, but I'm ready for the dance season to start! When your whole world revolves around square dancing and there are no dances to go to, what are you supposed to do?

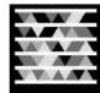
We were shocked this week by the passing of Caller Tim Marriner due to a massive heart attack on August 29th. He had just returned from a dance in Canada. A GoFundMe page was established to help Donna with the funeral expenses. The goal is \$20,000; as of this writing (September 1st) square dancers have done it again. We have raised \$21,280!

We also lost Caller Al Brundage on August 30th. He was 96 years old and lived in south Florida. As of this writing, funeral details have not been received.

By the time you read this article, it will be time for the snowbirds to start returning to Florida and the seasonal clubs will be starting up. Hopefully there will be numerous new dancer dances (classes) starting up too! It's not too early to start advertising and recruiting for the Fall. I hope that the experienced dancers will see the benefit of participating in these classes. Your assistance will not only encourage the new dancers but you might be surprised to find out some things have changed since you learned to dance. As you probably know many calls move from list to list, so when you were learning there might be calls that were on the Advance list that you didn't learn but now they are on the Plus list. Definitions are also revised; you don't normally see any communications about these changes so you should participate in new dancer sessions so you can find about them.

Several of the large dances in Florida are changing their dates this dance season. Grand Square International's Daytona Beach Ball will be September 9 – 10 this year; it has been in October for several years. GSI's Florida Space Coast Fiesta (formerly Winter Fest) will be February 3 – 4, 2017 and will be held in Titusville instead of Lakeland; in the past, it has been the end of January. The 63rd Florida State Convention that has been on Memorial

Day Weekend for longer than I have danced, which is 35+ years, will be March 24 – 25, 2017.

After the dance season gets started, there will be two association weekends in November. The West Coast Association's 42nd Annual Fall Fun Fest will be November 11th – 12th in Bartow. Tom Miller and Jack Lewis will be calling and Susan Snider will be cueing. Ribbons are \$18 per person in advance for the entire weekend; \$20 at the door. The following weekend the Northeast Association will have their annual Fall Festival "A Bountiful Barn Dance" November 18th – 19th. Ted Kennedy will be calling and Sandy Sturgis will be cueing. Ribbons are \$15 per person in advance for the entire weekend; \$20 at the door. If you want to come for just one night, the cost is \$10 per person. You can find flyers for these dances at www.floridasquaredance.com or www.dancergram.com.

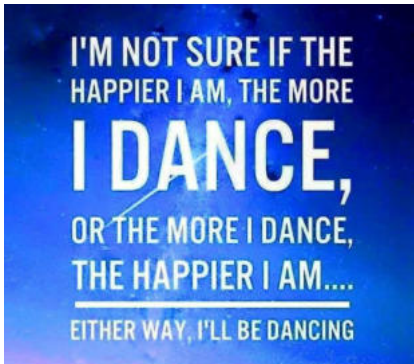

Betsy will be calling and Carl Rod will be cueing.

Our next Federation meeting will be held November 13th (Sunday of the Fall Fun Fest weekend) at the Stay Inn & Suites in Bartow. In addition to other business on the agenda, we will be installing the 2017 officers. Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend the Federation meetings.

With the start of the new dance season and then the New Year, don't forget to update your websites and contact information that is included in the *Bow & Swing* and the regional publications. The majority of inquiries we receive regarding Florida square and round dancing are through the Internet. Visitors won't be able to find your dances if you don't keep your information current! Callers and Cuers, this means you should also ensure your information is correct with your professional associations i.e. Florida Callers Association, Round Dance Council of Florida, CALLERLAB, American Callers' Association, your regional caller/cuer associations, and your personal websites.

I hope to see you at a dance somewhere!

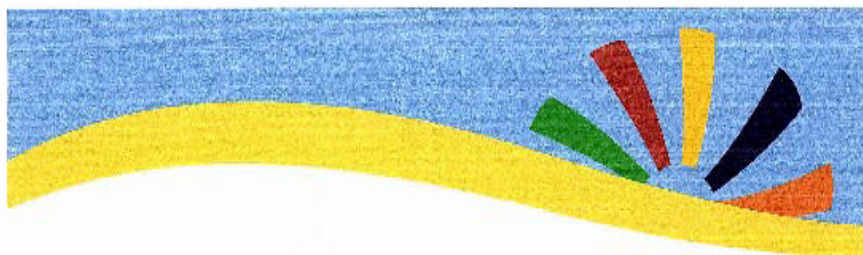

Alfred G. Brundage, 96, a nationally recognized square dance caller of Miami and formerly of Port St. Lucie, Fla., and Connecticut, died Aug. 30, 2016 in Miami of natural causes.

Brundage, the partner of Norma Peak of Miami since 1997, was predeceased by Beatrice Miles Brundage, his wife of 31 years, and his grandson, Frederick Griswold Schalich. .

He is survived by two children, Barry Wolcott Brundage of London, and Mary Lou Brundage Schalich of Monroe, Conn.; three stepchildren, William F. Miles of Annapolis, Md., Barbara Brooks of Rockport, Maine, and Patricia Silvia of Milford, Conn.; a brother, Robert M. Brundage of Albuquerque, N.M.; nine grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Born Nov. 4, 1919 in Hartford, Conn., Brundage was the son of the late Harold A. and Mable Gene Griswold Brundage. He grew up in Danbury, Conn., and graduated from Danbury High School and the University of Maine, where he studied agriculture. However, it was Brundage's boyhood fascination with square dancing, discovered peeking into the windows at Danbury's now-defunct Hawthorne's Tavern, which would direct his career path.

Brundage, his mother, brother and several neighbors formed the 4H Club's first-ever music club, the King Street Pioneers, that helped introduce square dance music to the region. Brundage initially played trumpet for the band before filling in for the group's outgoing square dance caller and discovering his life's passion.

As square dancing grew in popularity, Brundage and the King Street Pioneers went from passing the hat after dances in a former chicken coop to becoming a sought-after attraction for local community groups and churches.

In the 1930s, Brundage began teaching square dancing at state 4H conferences in Storrs College, Conn., now the University of Connecticut. He opened his first dance barn in 1948 in Stepney, Conn., where he taught his first caller school, also one of the first in the Northeastern United States.

Brundage received broad recognition for his contributions to square dancing. He was a sought-after attraction among community groups and churches, and a regular featured performer at the Danbury State Fair. He was admitted to the National Square Dance Hall of Fame in 1975 and in 1993, to the New England Square Dancing Hall of Fame. In addition, the Square Dance Foundation of New England presented him its highest award for distinguished service, the Yankee Clipper Award, in 2003.

In addition to calling square dances and teaching callers in Connecticut, and after 1978, in Florida, Brundage established a strong dance tourism program. Over the course of 50 years, he and his late wife led thousands of dancers to sightseeing and dance exchanges in 35 countries. Among Brundage's career highlights were the opportunities to call square dances on the Great Wall of China, at the Taj Mahal in India, and on the grounds of the Parthenon in Greece, the Pyramids in Egypt and at Nairobi National Park in Kenya.

As he shared his love of square dancing and travel, Brundage developed deep, lasting friendships around the world. He lived his life based on a creed he called the "3 Cs," striving never to complain, criticize or condemn.

After creation of The ARTS, the Board had many discussions of several issues, including the image of our dance activity, including Square Dancing. Several ideas for improving the image were discussed, however, none seemed to gain wide acceptance until specific "Square Dancing ReBranding" ideas were presented and discussed. After considerable discussion of a specific proposal the ARTS Board committed the organization to support the effort to "Re-Brand" Square Dancing. The dictionary defines "Re-Branding" as the process of giving a product or an organization a new image, in order to make it more attractive or successful. As the effort progressed it became evident that a more appropriate term is "Re-Image." The Board approved creation of the Re-Image Committee, with Jim & Judy Taylor as the leaders of this ef-

fort. They have been very active promoting the Re-Image Project. Their work has included creation and approval of a new square dance logo and slogan. One of the goals of the Re-Image Project is to have the new logo and slogan become accepted and recognized as the symbol of Square Dancing. The Live Lively Logo and Slogan have caught hold of dancers' imaginations and have been embraced worldwide. Numerous associations, conventions, festivals, and clubs have been using the logo and slogan to promote their activities. Jim & Judy continue to look for new methods and products to help promote this important effort. These products include pins, bolos, window stickers, banners, note pads, and others. These products are made available at nominal cost in an effort to help publicize the Re-Image Project. We can hardly wait to see what they come up with next!

Johnny began calling in 1970 and in 1979 went fulltime as a caller. He has called in 47 of the 50 states including the Alaska State convention in Fairbanks. He has been featured on many large weekend festivals such as the Delaware Valley Festival in Philadelphia and the Baltimore festival where the attendance exceeded 200 squares.

In 1981, Johnny was instrumental in forming a callers quartet called "The Red Boot Boys." The boys were together for 23 years doing more than 150 dance/concerts per year. One of their more memorable weekends was the Greater Atlanta Extravaganza in the mid 80's where more than 1600 dancers were in attendance and they brought in The Red Boot Band for the Saturday night concert. Johnny recorded for Red Boot Records with many hits to his credit and recorded 14 albums with the "Boys." Johnny & his wife Penny reside in Dacula, GA.
