Dear Fellow Dancers:

It is symbolic of square dancing that when friends are in need, other friends come to their aid. This is the reason for this letter.

Many people throughout Florida are acquainted with Marty and Byrdie Martin. They are round dance instructors, and have contributed greatly to our whole square and round dance movement.

On July 30 Byrdie was stricken with a brain hemorrhage. She was fortunate to survive and is recovering in Lakeland General Hospital. However, a series of two surgical procedures are required to enhance her chances for a total recovery. One operation was performed Sunday, August 16 and the report indicates the operation is a success. The second surgery will follow upon her recovery from this operation.

Unfortunately they have no medical insurance to cover Byrdie. Surgical and hospital costs being what they are today, and especially with brain surgery and intensive care, it can be envisioned to run into five figures of expense.

We in the Lakeland area have started a fund known as the "Byrdie Martin Fund." In addition to this contribution fund we are planning a series of benefit dances to help defray some of the expense.

As concerned friends and dedicated dancers, we do not care to see financial ruin come to any of our people. We are informing each of the clubs and dance groups of the situation with the thought that they may wish to help, either by having a benefit dance or making a contribution for these wonderful people.

 TABLE TALK

CHOCOLATE DESSERT

- 2 T Melted Butter $1\frac{1}{2}$ 1 oz. Squares Unsweetened
 1 C Chopped Nuts chocolate (melted)
 2 C Vanilla Wafer Crumbs $\frac{1}{2}$ t Vanilla
 $\frac{1}{2}$ C Butter or Oleo 3 Egg Whites (stiff beaten)
 1 C Confectioners Sugar
 3 Egg Yolks (well beaten)

Combine crumbs with nuts and melted butter. Line bottom of 9" square pan with half of the crumb mixture. Cream butter and sugar, add egg yolks, chocolate and vanilla, mix well. Fold in egg whites. Spread over crumb mixture and top with remaining crumbs. CHILL (serve nine)

EASY FILLED COOKIES

- 1 C Crisco
 2 C Brown Sugar

Creamed together, add 2-eggs and mix well. Add $3\frac{1}{2}$ -C sifted flour, 1-t salt and $\frac{1}{4}$ -t cinnamon sifted together, add dry ingredients to the cream mixture alternately with $\frac{1}{2}$ -C sour milk. Add 1-t vanilla. Place one heaping teaspoon full of dough on greased cookie sheet and flatten slightly. Put 1 scant teaspoon full of dough over top. Bake 16 to 18 minutes in 375 degree oven.

Filling: $\frac{1}{2}$ -Box raisens or 2-C chopped dates, $\frac{1}{2}$ -C water, $\frac{1}{2}$ -C sugar heat to boiling stirring constantly add 1-T cornstarch dissolved in a little water, cook until thick, cool.

Record: Mercury Celebrity Series G-30128-Simpel Gimpel-Horst Jankowski

Position: OP-fcg for Intro-As noted for Dance

Footwork: OPP, directions for M except as noted

Note: For more fun it is suggested that Meas 3 & 4 of Intro and Meas 3, 4, 15 & 16 of dance be done "Penguin" style with arms held straight down at sides but with hands pointed outward and horizontal to floor.

Meas

INTRO

- 1-4 Wait; Wait; Circle Away (M LF; W RF),-,2,-; 3,-,4,- (L OP-fcg);
- 5-6 Walk LOD (W does 1 RF twirl under lead Hos),-,2,-; 3,-,4,- (SCP);
- 7-8 Rk Fwd,-,Rec,-; Rk Bk,-,Rec,-; Apt,-,Pt,-; Tog,-,Tch,-(SCP);

DANCE

- 1-2 Fwd Two-step; Fwd Two-step;
- 3 (Release Hos) lunge slightly Swd LOD (Fc to Fc),-, Rec turning RF (W LF) to face RLOD,-;
- 4 Lunge slightly Swd RLOD (Bk to Bk),-, Rec turning RF (W LF) to face LOD,-;
- 5-8 Blend to SCP and repeat Meas 1-4
- 9 (Blend to CP, M facing wall) Side,Close,Fwd,-;
- 10 Side,Close, XIF (W XIB),- (Bjo, M facing LOD);
- 11 Side,Close, XIF (W XIB),- (Scar, M facing RLOD);
- 12 (Blend to CP, M facing wall) Side,Close,Bk,-;
- 13-14 Side, Close, Side, Tch; Side, Chose, XIF (W XIF),-(SCP);
- 15-16 (Release Hos) Roll LOD (M LF; W RF),-,2,-; 3,-,4,-(SCP);

Dance is done a total of 4 times, then repeat Meas 1-8 and quickly rock apt to ack.

(To perform dance as a mixer, W may circle away RF in Meas 15-16 while M roll LOD to next lady.)
