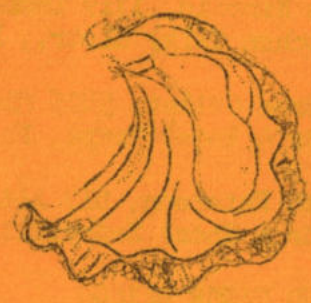

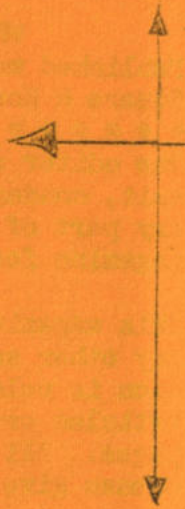

LEMON WHIPPERSNAPS

- 1 Pkg. (17 1/2 oz.) Pillsbury Lemon Cake Mix
- 2 C (1 1/2 oz. carton) Frozen Whipped Topping thawed
- 1 Egg
- 1/2 C Sifted Powdered Sugar

Grease cookie sheets. Combine cake mix, whipped topping and egg in large bowl. Stir until well mixed. Drop by teaspoon into powdered sugar; roll to coat. Place 1 1/2" apart on cookie sheet. Bake at 350' for 10 to 15 minutes until light golden brown. Remove from cookie sheet. "Makes about 4 dozen."

- 4 Eggs separated
- 1 1/2 C Butter or Oleo
- 1 1/2 C Sugar
- 2 C Flour
- 1 Vanilla

Cream butter and sugar, add egg yolks, flour and vanilla. Beat egg whites till stiff and add to creamed mixture. Pour batter in shallow 11" x 17" pan. Spoon cherry pie filling over the top. Bake in 350' oven for 40 to 50 minutes. Dribble icing over the top when done.
