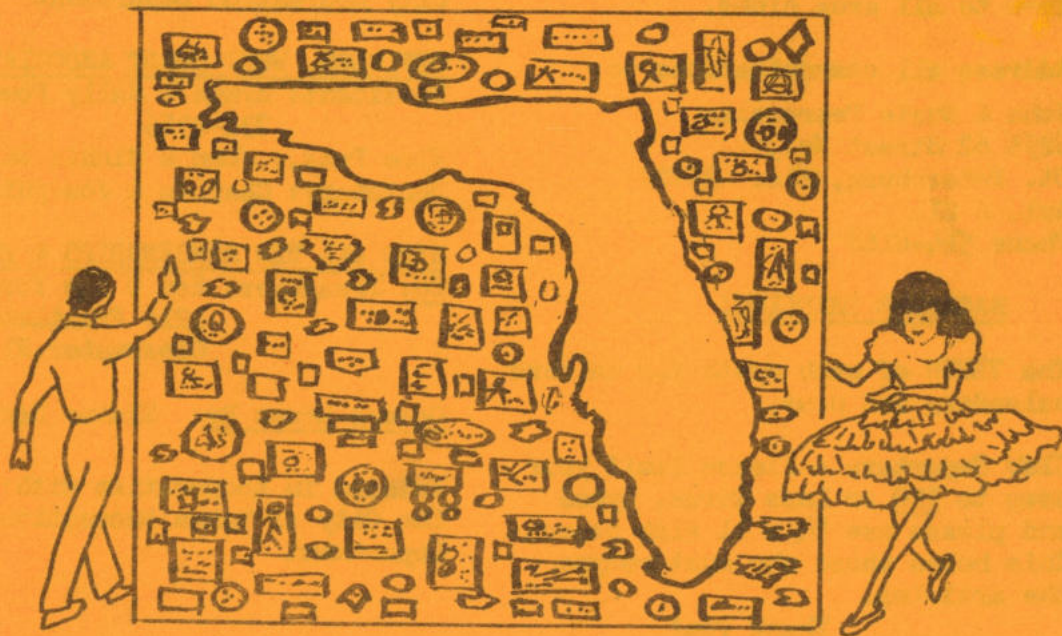

KITCHEN COLUMN

STRAWBERRY FREEZECRUST

- 1 cup flour
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1 stick margarine
- ½ cup chopped nuts

Mix all together, put in a 9 x 13 pan and bake 20 minutes at about 350° - stirring with fork after the first ten minutes and again at 15 minutes. Take out ¼ of crumbs for topping. Press the rest of crumbs over bottom of pan. LET IT COOL.

FILLING

- 3 egg whites beaten stiff, but not dry
- gradually add 1 cup sugar
- 1 large pkg. frozen strawberries
- 2 tbsps. lemon juice
- Fold in 9 oz. size cool whip

Pour filling over crust, top with reserved crumbs and freeze six hours.

Note:

This recipe was sent to me by Kay Mack, who credits Paul Trent for this delicious dessert. Thanks!

NOTE:

For those of you who do not understand the Surprise Apples Slices recipe-- the Ritz crackers takes the place of the apples. Follow the recipe carefully and you will actually think it contains apples.

STRAWBERRY PIE - from Fran Schmakel

- 1 qt. strawberries
- Boil 1 cup water and
- 1 cup sugar and
- 3 tbsp. cornstarch

Add one pkg. Strawberry Jello. Pour in pie shell...let stand to cool.

NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CONVENTION
Anaheim, California

June 24, 25, 26, 1976...the anniversary of 25 years of National Conventions, will be an official function of the Bicentennial Celebration. This month's news release deals with How To Travel and Where to Stay. There is a mode of travel to Anaheim, and accommodations in Anaheim, to fit every need and every pocketbook. For those who desire to fly "Silver Sunshine Express" is made to order. Sanctioned by the 25th National Convention, and put together by Omnisphere Travel, the Silver Sunshine Express will leave from cities all over the Nation, on Monday June 21, 1976. You will arrive in Los Angeles International Airport in mid-afternoon and will be met and escorted to your motel in private buses. Your luggage will be handled for you. Seven nights lodging is included in the price of the tour package. All hotels are within walking distance of the Convention Center, with those persons registering first being given the hotels closest to the Convention Center.

Tuesday morning a special seven hour tour of Universal Studios is planned. Busses will leave the Convention Center at 9 a.m. so you will have plenty of time to see the mock cities, sound stages, and production facilities of the largest film studio in the world. You will be fascinated by the stunt show, the audience participation segment of a video-taped "Adam-12." There are many lunch facilities where you can relax and perhaps see some stars resting between scenes.

Also included in your "Silver Sunshine Express" package is your registration for all three days of the Convention. Prices range about \$341 from Miami. These prices are per person, based on double occupancy and are for the entire seven day package. Your tour ends Monday, June 28, 1976 with a morning trip to the airport where you board flights for home.

Plans are presently underway for presenting bus tours and train tours to the National.

There are 6,000 hotel rooms in the immediate vicinity of the Convention Center with the average price \$20 for a double room.

For those driving recreational vehicles to the convention arrangements for 3,000 vehicles at the Fairground in Costa Mesa will be available for 5 days at \$17.50 for the five days. Dormitory arrangements at the local colleges for \$4.50 per person, per night, with families welcome will be available.

It is important that you make your reservations early in order to obtain the type of housing accommodations you desire in the area you desire. Don't delay.

NOTE:

With so many new square dancers and clubs in our area, perhaps the following will clear up some questions on Banner Stealing.

BANNER STEALING RULES

1. In order to steal or retrieve a club banner, the visiting club must attend your club dance with at least one full square representing their club.
2. In cases where two or more clubs come to steal the banner, the first club having a full square present will take the banner. In cases, of a tie, the host club will select, by lot, the club to which the banner will be awarded. To qualify, one full square from each club participating MUST be present for both the first and last tips of the evening.
3. Banners are not to be reserved for any visiting club.
4. Clubs may not call ahead to find out if the banner is available.
5. All clubs should have but one banner to steal.
6. In cases where a club travels a distance of 50 miles or more one way to steal a banner and the banner is stolen by a local club, the traveling club may be given a secondary banner and ONLY in this case should a club have more than one banner out. Mileage to be measured from the visiting club's regular dance location to the host club's dance location by the most direct route.
7. A secondary banner would be considered as a traveling banner which could be taken only by a traveling club referred to in Rule #6.
8. A couple who belongs to two or more clubs cannot represent one club and steal from another club to which they belong. The badge of the club he intends to represent should be worn.
9. A club can steal a banner or retrieve a banner on a visit to a club, but not both at the same time. It takes a visit to steal and a visit to retrieve.
10. The object of banner stealing is to promote friendly visits between clubs. Do not over patronize a select few - spread your club around. If you are going to be a thief, be a good one, abide by the rules and make a practice of retrieving your own banner before stealing someone else's.
11. A period of at least 3 club dances should pass before the same club steals that club's banner again.

7. I'll smile pleasantly at my partner, and my corner, even if they make a mistake..after all I make mistakes too.
8. I'll leave the instruction to the caller, unless I'm asked to help.
9. I'll remember that I was once a "beginner", and be willing to dance with people who have had less experience than I have.
10. I'll try to remember that "a stranger is a friend I haven't met yet."
