The score is in on the 30th National Square Dance Convention in Seattle with a final tally of 24379 in attendance of which 249 were from Florida. Considering the distance Florida's showing was not too shabby. All 50 states were represented so it was truly a 'National Convention'.

Square Dancing magazine reports that, while it was a great convention, the 'Parade of States' feature was a fiasco again this year. Trying to put 18000 dancers into a grand march seems to be a little much and consideration should be given to devoting this time to other pursuits such as dancing.

Birmingham Alabama was the successful bidder for the 1985 convention which will bring it about as close to Florida as is comfortable. Alabama will probably need help and our Federation should at least offer moral support. The next 4 convention sites are: Detroit '82, Louisville '83, Baltimore '84 and Birmingham in '85.

## TIPS FOR TAWS

During our rainy season, how many cars have you gals cleaned with your skirt as you squeezed between them?...or wished for the rain to stop until you could get from the house to the car, or from the car to the hall? A rain skirt is what you are looking for.

You need plastic for the skirt, a lacy-looking, light-weight one makes a most attractive skirt. Using a circular skirt pattern, cut it one inch longer than your dress. Use 1-inch interfacing for the waistband and matching binding for the front opening. Snap fasteners may be used on the waistband and the front opening. As an alternative, use tape or ribbon to be tied in a bow at the waist. A flat seam is the most sturdy one. Be sure to use a long stitch when sewing plastic. If you find the plastic slips when you are sewing it, try sewing over tissue paper.

## SQUARE DANCE ANGELS

It seems that there is never too much discussed on this subject--so here we go again. Angels, your presence can make the difference in some learners staying or leaving without giving square dancing a fair chance. Your reason for attending should be to show new dancers what a wonderful activity square dancing can be. It means a lot of smiles and good conversation between tips - a genuine expression of friendship. A dancer who can be in the right place at the right time with the hand extended to assist is indeed a good helper.

This places a big responsibility on you as a dancer. How you act, dance and dress will be a deciding factor in a beginner joining a class and staying.

You should wear the simplest square dance attire. The new dancer will look up to you and notice what you wear. Let your outfit look easy to make and inexpensive to buy. Let it be colorful, clean and becoming.

New dancers rightfully expect the "angels" to have a good understanding of the dance figures being taught. Nothing is more distressing to beginners than to find the person who is in their square, supposedly to help them, having trouble simply because they thought they knew what the caller was going to teach. They didn't really need to listen to find he had called it another way.

At first the caller is going to instruct the dancers in the standard patterns and positions. You should omit any special frills or styling habits you might have added to your dancing, so as not to confuse the learners. Do only what your caller is teaching.

One important thing to remember: Don't try and impress your learner friends with how good a dancer you are and how well YOU have learned. That isn't your task if you are there to help. You are a HELPER just as others helped you when you were in the same situation. There is one person who is teaching and showing the newcomers what he wants them to do--but he is on the stage and has a microphone in his hand. Let HIM do the explaining!

**KITCHEN KOLUM**

**BAVARIAN APPLE TORTE**

**Step 1 Crust**

- 4 oz. butter or margarine
- 1 1/2 c. sifted all purpose flour
- 1/3 c. granulated sugar
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla

Mix all ingredients with electric mixer until blended. Pat in bottom and sides of 9" spring form pan. Bake at 400° for 5 min. Cool for 5 min.

**Step 2 Filling**

- 8 oz. pk. cream cheese
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 c. granulated sugar

Blend all ingredients in a mixing bowl and pour into partially cooled crust.

**Step 3 Topping**

- 4 c. sliced & peeled apples
- 1/3 C. granulated sugar
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 c. apricot preserves
- 2 Tbls. water

Toss apples with cinnamon and sugar in a plastic bag. Arrange apples slices on cheese filling. Bake at 400° for 25 min. When cake is cooled, brush top with the blended preserves and water, or just pour the mixture over entire cake.
