Married Dancers Missing Out on Fantastic Weekend Dances

I found this article in the *Intercom*, the Single Square Dancers USA (SSDUSA) Newsletter; it should be somewhere where couples can see it!

I have been meaning to write this for a few years. I have talked to a few couples about these dances but have not seen any results. After the article that Bill Tetley wrote in the Oct. 2007 Golden Triangle Tidbits and the comments written by Curtis & Barbara Powell in the same issue, I knew I had no choice but to get this job done.

FROM BELLES & BEAUS writing by Curtis & Barbara Powell: (Tidbits Oct. 2007) Bill Tetley was excited to share his and Pearl's trip to National Singles Dance-A-Rama in North Little Rock, Ark. on August 30 through Sept. 2nd. Bill reported that some 563 dancers from all over the U.S.A., 115 of those being from Texas were in attendance, 19 of those Texans hailed from the Golden Triangle (Beaumont area). Those great callers were Mike Hogan, the Sprotsky twins, Shane Greer and David Towey. With Patti Wheelington, Jerry Piercek, Kathy Fisher, and David Meyer working the rounds and Joe Johnson taught line dances. With those callers and cuers working the floor, you can now understand why Bill dances 32 of the 38.5 hours of available dance time. SOUNDS LIKE THEY HAD A SUPER GOOD TIME. MAYBE OTHERS OF US SHOULD CONSIDER GOING TO THE NATIONAL SINGLES IN 2008. The 2008 dance will be in Nashville, Tenn. and is always over Labor Day Weekend.

FROM BILL TETLEY WRITING: (Tidbits Oct. 2007) Note: Bill is a single square and round dancer. He does not belong to the Beaumont singles club but has membership in a couples club. He has been dancing well over 30 years. Ten members of Round Abouts and a soon to be eleventh, including our own cuer, Gloria and her sister Marlene (assistant instructor) attended the 37th annual National Singles Dance-A-Rama in North Little Rock, Ark. over the Labor Day Weekend. Dancing began on Thursday evening with a Trials-in-Dance with a crowded floor of perhaps 350 dances. Then on Fri. morning the action really begins with four separate halls, one each for Rounds, Plus, Mainstream, and Lines. Naturally, the two halls with the most action were the Plus (the largest) and the Round (next largest). Rounds were done by David Meyer and Kathy Fisher, both filling in for Robbie Carrington (who had to cancel at the last minute), Jerry Pierce, and Patti Whelington. There were nine different teachers on all levels plus lots of time in the round dance hall for just fun dancing.

Before the weekend was over a total of 563 dancers had showed up. What was really exciting was that in the main hall (Plus with Rounds), there were between 30 and 50 couples dancing rounds, with another 20 couples participating in the Round Dance hall. This must have inspired the cuers too. The Square dancing was a blast according to all attendees. Tim Tyl did his great dog song one evening. Mike Hogan got everyone's applause with his Elvis act, and Joe Johnson (the line dance instructor) made a hit with all those who attended his workshops by leading some really cute different dances in the main hall each evening, always including the ones he taught in the workshops. Friday and Saturday nights after the regular dancing, live bands supplied music till the wee hours of the morning for all those willing to free-style dance and wear out their feet even more. They all had a great time and danced their feet to the nubs.

While this is truly a big national event for singles dancers, there were a number of couples in attendance, both married and longtime dance partnerships, and they enjoyed the affair as much as anyone. Couples are always welcome to come to these dances. They can just dance and party all weekend and let the singles worry about all the work it takes to host the events. This event starts with a trails-in dance on Thursday and ends Sunday night about 10:30 p.m. On Monday which is Labor Day is a travel day home or whatever you want to do or go. This will require 4 nights in a hotel if starting Thursday and staying thru the end (Sunday night).

There are a lot of things to do in and around Nashville. One thing our group is looking at is to miss one night of dancing and go to the Grand Ole Opry. There is a planned bus tour to go there on Friday night.

Why not give this dance some thought and if you can't go this year then what about in 2009? The 2009 dance will be Quad Cities. Well where in this World is Quad Cities (I had to look it up on a map). It is four towns located along the Mississippi River; they are Davenport and Bettendorf in Iowa and Moline and Rock Island in Illinois.

Lake Ashton's Shufflin Squares Help raise thousands for Achievement Academy

"It was a great night of Bar-B-Q, boot scootin' line and square dancing, but mostly, it was a great evening because we helped raise several thousand dollars for the Achievement Academy," says Shufflin' Squares Presidents Freda and Clyde Kitts.

Freda and Clyde said the Shufflin' Squares were pleased and proud to be a part of the fundraising event for the Achievement Academy which has delivered services to individuals in Polk County with developmental delays and disabilities for more than fifty years. The Academy started in 1955 as part of United Cerebral Palsy, but has expanded to include individuals with any type of developmental delay or disorder.

The Lake Ashton Shufflin' Squares were among square dancers from Polk County to provide entertainment at the Academy's first annual country-western round-up fund-raiser. Festivities started with a Bar-B-Q meal served under the spreading oaks of the Higgenbotham Ranch, then moved to the barn for line and square dancing into the night. The Shufflin' Squares and other dancers demonstrated the whirls and twirls of modern western square dancing and then showed those attending how easy it was to do it themselves. Most of the guests participated in some easy square dances, an old-fashioned Virginia Reel, and line dances including the Electric Slide.

The event was staged at the Higgenbotham Ranch in Lakeland, May 10. Chairman of the event and treasurer of the Achievement Academy board, John Scott [also a square dancer], said the evening probably raised about \$12,000 for the Academy. The school serves Polk County with locations in Bartow, Lakeland and Winter Haven.
