Words from the Editor

As you know, we had our West Coast Folding/Business Meeting last Wednesday. One of the topics of discussion was promoting square dancing and how we can get more people in class and to the club dances. Needless to say, this isn't just discussed at the West Coast meetings; it is discussed at every meeting we attend - USDA meetings, Federation meetings, club meetings, committee meetings, callers and cuers meetings - it's written about in square dance publications, on square dance websites, in emails, etc.

It was stated that we need to do something because it's getting worse and worse. When the group was told that the West Coast Association is doing everything we can, we were asked what exactly we are doing. What are we doing besides getting together every other month to fold the *West Coast Dancer*?

- Many of us attend the Florida Federation meetings and the annual festivals held by the
 other associations so that we can network with the other dancers and learn what has
 worked and not worked for them, as well as to promote our dances and invite them to
 attend our Fall Fun Fest.
- Our officers' names are on the Florida Dance Web to receive questions from anyone searching the internet for square dance information for the state of Florida.
- The West Coast Dancer is published by the West Coast Association and is distributed free of charge to all dancers. We are the only association in the state of Florida who still has a free newsletter; the other associations sell subscriptions. This newsletter contains all the class and dance information that YOU provide to the editor, plus information and flyers we receive from other associations, the Federation and the USDA.
- We hold eight to ten membership dances throughout a 16 county area to promote square dancing and the West Coast Association in your area.
- We support demos, classes and clubs with our attendance. I think I can safely say everyone that is active at the West Coast level is also a member of at least one club and maybe two. We also attend benefit dances and class dances.
- We partner with the Suncoast Callers & Cuers to not only "staff" the Membership Dances, but to promote classes and workshops.

Sooo..what do YOU do to promote square dancing?

- Do you attend the Federation meetings and the annual festivals?
- Does your club have current information on the Florida Dance Web for those searching the internet for square dance information in your area?

- Does your club submit articles to the West Coast Dancer and is your club information correct?
- Do you promote and attend the Membership Dances? Do you belong to the West Coast Association? All of the West Coast Membership Dances are free to members. Why not try visiting some of the Membership Dances out of your area?
- Do you participate in demos? Do you angel at classes? Are you a member of a club? And I don't mean just a paying member; I mean a working member who serves on committees, greets at the door, helps with refreshments, helps set up, helps clean up, etc.

It's not just up to the West Coast Association to do the promoting; it's up to all of us - the **DANCERS**. No one can be with you for every conversation to ensure you talk about square dancing. I can barely have a conversation with anyone that dancing isn't mentioned. We can't take you by the hand to the dances, conventions and festivals.

Ask not what square dancing can do for you but what you can do for square dancing. Dances don't just happen; people arrive thirty minutes to an hour early to set up tables and chairs, start the coffee, put up decorations if needed, lay out the flyers, hang the banners and get the signin table set up for business. Then there are people working in the kitchen; if there are refreshments, they have to be set out for the break and then cleaned up afterwards. Then after the dance, everything has to be put away, tables and chairs taken down and the kitchen clean up.

The amount of work is always the same whether for one square or for ten; there is always an expense for the caller and cuer and hall rent no matter the size of the group. The caller and cuer still has to do the same amount of planning and preparing for any size group. What kind of support are we showing when dancers show up five minutes or less before the first tip and then leave after the refreshments and 50/50 drawing? This is not only discourteous to the caller and cuer, but to the hosting club. They have gone to all the trouble to have a nice dance for you, you have paid for a 2 - 2- 1/2 hour dance, and then you only stay for about an hour hour and a half tops.

Let's try being a little more cognizant of what we are doing to promote and support square dancing. Are we telling our friends, neighbors, family about the fun that we have at a dance? Do we visit other clubs even when there's not a banner raid? Do we visit clubs outside our area? Do we angel at classes? Do we volunteer for demos?

What is promoting? It's not scheduling a set time and deciding we are going to promote. It's not just doing demos. It's not just telling people about classes. Promotion is a constant thing; it's as easy as a casual conversation at the dealership when you're having work done on your car; or at a restaurant when you're waiting for a table; at the barber shop/beauty shop.

And yes we need new dancers, but don't forget the dancers we have. We can't loose them; they'll drop out if they think someone doesn't care about them.

This "PROMOTION" thing is a continuous thing and has to be done by ALL of us, from the basic dancer to the advanced dancer. It's not just up to the West Coast officers and the callers and cuers.

West Coast Association

It's that time of year again when we start wondering if we will have new officers to install at the President's Ball on September 21st. And I always wonder why dancers think they can't be an officer. I know we have heard all the excuses - I'm too busy; I haven't been dancing long enough; I'm not a good enough dancer; I don't know how to do it; I travel too much, etc. Well, I have an answer for every one of these excuses.

• I'm too busy. Have you heard the saying "If you want something done, give it to a busy person"? I have heard about so many of you having served in every office and/or every committee chairmanship at your club; what's the difference doing it at the club level than doing it at the association level? I would think it would be easier at the association level since we don't dance every week; we don't have association meetings every month; we try to handle everything by email, but don't let that hold you back we can work around it.

- I haven't been dancing long enough. What does dancing have to do with holding an office? You're the ones we'd like to get to know; you have fresh ideas that we'd like to hear about.
- I'm not a good enough dancer. What does dance level have to do with holding an office? Being a West Coast officer and getting out there meeting people and dancing at different locations gives you the opportunity to practice your dancing.
- I don't know how to do it. Many of the responsibilities of these offices are things you do in your personal life scheduling, budget, finances, insurance, etc. Why wouldn't you be able to apply them to a "business"? There are a lot of people who are still active at the association level who have held these offices previously and they are available to assist and answer any questions you have. And if you have held these offices at the club level, why wouldn't you be able to do it at the association level?
- I travel too much. The schedule for the Membership Dances is established several months prior to the start of the new term; in fact, the 2008/2009 dances are already scheduled and published in the WEST COAST DANCER. The Folding/Business Meetings are the fourth Wednesday of the month in January, March, May, July, September, and November. This gives you enough time to plan your travel around these dates. If for some reason, you can't make it to a Membership Dance or meeting, there are people who would be willing to fill in for you.

Yes, we would like you to make a four year commitment, starting at secretary and progressing through the "chairs" (treasurer, vice president and president), but as you have seen over the past few years this hasn't been happening. The reason for wanting this progression is so that you learn each office before you become president. This will make you a better president. However, if you don't feel comfortable making a four year commitment we would be happy to have your help for a year. If you wanted to stay in an office for more than one year, I don't think there would be any objections!

We have someone who has offered to take the office of secretary, so we still need a treasurer, vice president and president. Solos can hold any of these offices so don't let that be a deterrent! I was secretary, vice president and treasurer as a solo, as was Shirley Pfeffer.

The Library Collection

I love to collect old square dance memorabilia. Anything and all things square dancing - Books, magazines, clothing, old equipment, badges, mugs, patterns, posters, flyers, banners, tapes, records and the list is endless. My biggest dream is to have my own square dance museum and dance hall but until then I love to put together small displays.

During September 2007 - National Square Dance Month, I was privileged to be able to have thirteen public libraries allow me to put my collection in their display cases. Thousands of people pass in and out of libraries each month.

Each collection was different: The display would include a dress and shirt in the background. Books, magazines, patterns, figurines, badges, cards, diploma, and a simple sign were placed throughout the displays.

The sign was simple: September is **National Square Dance Month** - classes starting soon - web address - hotline telephone number

Just think if Square Dancers across the country would contact their libraries and ask if they could use the display case.

The clubs could include photographs of various activities, club badges, banners, etc. Dancers can borrow old books and magazines from their caller or other club members. Most important is to put a contact number and a date for an OPEN HOUSE or CLASS INFORMATION.

To my knowledge - the display cases are free to the public. You can not put class prices on brochures or signs posted in our libraries. Each year for the past four years, our libraries have let us put promotional square dance brochures in each of the 41 public libraries in the Cincinnati area.
