
From the Editor

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Since the deadline for submitting Hall of Fame nominations (January 15, 2010) is fast approaching, I thought I would provide you with some additional information on this award.

<u>History</u>

The Hall of Fame was organized to honor dancers, callers, cuers, publishers, teachers, organizers, promoters and/or vendors for their contributions made to the dance activity **STATEWIDE**. The Hall of Fame became a reality due to the work of Chet and Julia Vetter, Mori and Phyllis Sogolo, Art and Martha Springer and Marty and Birdie Martin. The first inductees were made May 19, 1983 at the State Convention. The square dance hall at Strawberry Square became the permanent home of the Hall of Fame at a Grand Opening dance held on December

4, 1983. At the State Convention, new member(s) are presented with a small plaque to keep and a larger plaque is installed at Strawberry Square Hall for public viewing.

As of the State Convention in year 2009, 76 inductees have been installed in the Florida Hall of Fame. These inductees consist of dancers, callers, cuers, publishers and vendors. Some have qualified in two categories.

Display cases for past presidents of the Florida Federation of Square and Round Dancers, the Florida Callers Association and the Round Dance Council of Florida have been provided by the Hall of Fame Committee. Each of the five area associations has a plaque displaying person(s) from their area who have been honored as person or couple of the year. An additional plaque lists the State Convention General Chairman and Caller Chairman and Cuer Chairman for each of the State Conventions.

The Hall of Fame is financed through funds derived from State Conventions. The three sponsoring associations, Florida Federation, Callers Association and Round Dance Council each contribute one-third (1/3) of expenses.

The Hall of Fame Committee as of May 2009 is: Dick and Darleen Nordine, Chairman Ernie and Francis Rollen David and Elizabeth Garrett Penny Green Dewey and Donna Hendricks, Secretary

The Selection Committee is a group of dancers, callers and cuers from every area of the state and both sexes are represented. These are known only to the Hall of Fame Committee and not to each other. Members of the Selection Committee must have been active in the Florida dance activity for at least 10 years, have visited and danced in a number of areas within the state and be knowledgeable of what is going on. Voting is done in secret by sending resumes and ballots to each voting member, ballots are completed and returned to the Hall of Fame Committee Chairman without revealing the name and address of the voter. The ballots are opened in the presence of a quorum of the Hall of Fame Committee.

<u>Criteria</u>

Nominees must have a minimum of 10 years <u>statewide</u> involvement in the Florida Square and Round Dance activity. Their contributions must encompass the entire state of Florida, not just one or two areas. This should require unselfish dedication of time and labor. <u>Being an Area</u> <u>president, Federation president, Caller/Cuer Association president and/or State Convention</u> <u>chairman is not enough.</u> The Hall of Fame is seeking individuals or couples whose efforts have affected the majority of the State of Florida. The fact that one is nominated is a very high honor, whether or not they enter the Hall of Fame.

Nominating Resume

Preparing a nominating resume will take some time and investigation to make it complete. Talk to other dancers, callers and/or cuers for dates, places and times the nominee was involved in **<u>statewide</u>** participation. Follow the who, what, when and where rules as you investigate and prepare the resume. The more information submitted, the better.

Once the resume(s) is finished there are two ways in which to present the information to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume(s) may be submitted to the Board of Directors of any of the Five Associations, Callers Association or Cuers Association. The Area or Association Board of Directors will review the resume(s) and vote to reject or pass it on to the Hall of Fame Committee chairman. The resume(s) must be received by the Hall of Fame Committee by January 15th of each year. It is suggested that any association <u>not</u> submit more than two resumes for consideration per year. The Hall of Fame Committee shall meet and review all resume(s) presented and vote by secret ballot before forwarding such resume(s) to the Selection Committee for the final vote.

Please give as much information as possible, the more the better. Talk to friends, callers, cuers, fellow board members, dancers that have left the activity, etc. for information. You'll be surprised how many people will work with you to prepare the nomination resume.

By using the above method you may have several WHO, WHAT, WHEN AND WHERES TO COVER EVERYTHING THE NOMINEE(S) HAS DONE IN THEIR DANCING CAREER. The nominee(s) may have been involved with several aspects of the activity. If there is not enough space on the

form, attach additional information on a regular sheet of paper and attach with the Resume(s) Outline.



Purpose of Award

To show appreciation to both Callers and Cuers who go that EXTRA MILE, without personal gain, in giving freely of their time and talents to the Square Dance activity.

Criteria for Award

Any Caller or Cuer who is a member of the Florida Callers Association or the Round Dance Council of Florida.

Procedure for Nomination

- 1) The Board of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers shall be the selection committee, with the current president as chairman of same. New members coming on will replace the ones going off.
- Any dancer may submit a name of a caller/cuer to the selection committee prior to February 1st of the year in which the nominee is to be selected. (A Nomination Form must be fully completed.)
- 3) The selection committee meets during the February working weekend to review the nominee(s) and arrive at a final decision.

Procedure for Presenting Award/Awards

- 1) The award(s) should be presented on Saturday evening at the Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention held in May of the same year, by the current president of the Florida Federation.
- 2) The award(s) presented shall be a framed document and an "Extra Mile Award Recipient" bar or dangle.

CALLERLAB INSURANCE COVERAGE

INSURANCE COVERAGE INFORMATION

From time to time the Home Office receives inquiries as to what the membership liability insurance policy covers. There are various individuals who have misinterpreted this insurance to not only cover the caller but also believe it cover the clubs, officers and event the caller is calling. This simply is not true. Our liability insurance covers only the member caller who is calling the dance. Not the event; not the club; not the club officers; not the facility, not the dancers, and not even the caller's partner (Coverage, however, is available for partners that cue round dances, line dances, or otherwise share responsibilities with the caller, by paying an additional premium). In short, the liability insurance covers just the caller while performing the responsibilities of being a caller.

Group Liability and Equipment Insurance

Members, Associate Members, and Apprentices who live in the U.S. are automatically enrolled in CALLERLAB's group insurance program upon payment of their current dues and fees. Retired callers who are Associate Members are not eligible to participate in the insurance program. This program consists of three separate categories:

Liability Insurance

The general liability, bodily injury and property damage portion of the policy provides liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, with an aggregate limit of \$2,000,000 per caller, per event. It protects you, the caller, for any acts or omissions of acts that result in bodily injury or property damage while you are calling square dances or related activities.

Medical Coverage

The accidental medical portion of the policy provides supplemental insurance for you while you are conducting square dance-related activities. Maximum coverage is \$10,000. This coverage is

effective only after your primary carrier, Medicare, or other health insurance company has settled a claim.

Accidental Death/Dismemberment

The AD&D portion of the policy covers you while traveling to or from a square dance. Coverage for accidental death is \$5,000. Coverage for accidental dismemberment may be as high as \$5,000, depending on the loss.

Policy Conditions

These policies do not cover the dancers. Dancers may have their own accident and medical insurance, either through their homeowner's policy or through their club in the U.S.D.A. (United Square Dancers of America). "Related activities" include regular dances, workshops, classes, one night stands, contra, traditional, round dancing and line dancing. A caller's partner is not covered by this insurance. Coverage is available for partners that cue round dances, line dances, or otherwise share responsibilities with the caller by paying an additional premium. Contact the CALLERLAB Home Office by phone for details. If a caller is dropped from membership, then the insurance for both the caller and the partner is null and void as of the date the caller dropped from the membership rolls.

The policy year is April 1st through March 31st of the following year. If dues are not paid by April 1st, the insurance is not effective until full payment is received. The insurance cost is not prorated for members joining in mid-year. The premium is the same regardless of the date you pay your dues and fees.

SQURE DANCE OPEN COMPETITIONS

The National Executive Committee has approved Square Dance Competitions for both Youth and Adults at the 59th National Square Dance Convention. Following is updated information and some of the rules of the competitions.

It was decided to again use the "Last Square Dancing" format. There will be two sessions: Open Competition on Thursday afternoon and Youth Competition on Friday afternoon.

The open Competition will be open to all dancers. It will be held in Freedom Hall on Thursday, June 24 at 4:00pm. In order to participate, you must sign up as a part of a complete square. Sign-up forms must be turned in at the Competition Registration Table in the East Hall Main Lobby no later than 12:30pm on Thursday. Individuals or couples may meet near the table and group themselves into squares. For complete rules and procedures and for sign-up forms, click on the competition link on the website (www.59thnsdc.com).

The Youth Competition is open to all dancers age 18 and under. It will be held in the Variety Hall (right next to the Youth Hall) on Friday, June 25 at 4:15pm. Sign-up will take place in the Youth Hall. You must sign-up as part of a complete square and sign-up forms must be turned in no later than 2:00pm on Friday. Youth Dancers can meet in the Youth Hall and form squares and then sign up.

These sessions are one time only events at the 59th NSDC and are just for fun. **ENJOY YOURSELF AND HAVE A GOOD TIME!**

Remembering Mike Jacobs

On December 2 caller Mike Jacobs passed away, from what is believed to be complications from diabetes. He was 58.

Words like "talented" and "leader" pale in significance here. He was unique in talent, unique as a leader, unique as a person.

Mike was totally dedicated to square dancing. He started calling in 1971 and quickly jumped in with both feet. I first met him in 1975 in Louisville when I was there for a weekend. Just another local caller, I thought, but he was already calling everywhere – national conventions,

state conventions, after-parties – anything to get his name known. He also loved to dance, and would dance for hours at conventions and weekends. He would attend weekends as a dancer and call at the after-parties.

What's the best way to get your name known everywhere? Call every program, every level, and do it everywhere. Over and over again. Never stop. So in addition to calling Mainstream and Plus, he started calling Advanced and Challenge. He didn't just call C-1 – he called Challenge right thru C-04 and became very proficient. Mike called a few tips at the 1983 National Advanced & Challenge Convention, and the next year he was on staff – elected by the dancers. He remained on staff thru 2000, which was the last year of the event. He was one of the most sought after Challenge callers for the past 25 years. His Challenge Teach Tapes and Dance Tapes sold through out the world.

Mike moved to the Washington, D.C. area in 1987, which offered him more opportunities to call, due to all the clubs in the Mid-Atlantic and New England states. Driving on the East Coast or flying around the country, he was in big demand and would be calling somewhere almost every weekend. This remained true right up to his passing.

Mike was a true traveling caller, but in a unique way. He was in demand at Mainstream and Plus and at festivals featuring these programs; but he was equally in demand for Challenge calling, and called numerous Challenge weekends every year throughout the U.S. and Europe. It is extremely rare for a caller to be popular as a Mainstream, Plus and festival caller and be equally popular as a Challenge caller. But this was Mike.

He was also a leader of callers. He joined CALLERLAB in 1976, was a member of the Board of Governors from 1999 until his death, and was Chairman of the Board for two years. He became a CALLERLAB Caller Coach in 1996 and conducted caller schools and clinics around the country. He was Vice-Chairman of the CALLERLAB Caller Training Committee, and helped organize and promote the organization known as ARTS (Alliance of Round, Traditional & Square Dance).

In addition, Mike was highly intelligent. You could discuss any subject with him and he always had good knowledge of the topic. He was like a college professor who knows something about everything. He was especially knowledgeable about history, books and plays, and would often weave thoughts from these areas into his conversation. It was fascinating to talk with him about anything just to see what interesting background fact he would put into the conversation.

Mike Jacobs will be remembered as the quintessential caller, a person who could do it all and do it all with excellence. He will be remembered. He will be missed.

What Makes a Good Dancer?

Square dance and contra dance has had their ups and downs. Granted there has been a hardcore center of set dancing in New England where people held onto a tradition of dances and tunes; New Englanders also danced to the phrase of the music.

But throughout the rest of America square (and contra) dancing has gone through phases. Before the end of the nineteenth century "barn dances" were very popular – the whole family could come and have a good time. But then the dances got the reputation of being too rowdy. Alcohol was prevalent as were rough dancing and coarse language. Families no longer could attend, and certainly no young person who was raised right would be caught at a barn dance.

Henry Ford brought square dancing and all its allied forms to the ballroom. He hired an excellent dance teacher to call his dances, he had music and dances collected and published, and he held dinner balls by "invitation" for his employees: dress was formal and attendance was mandatory.

Square dancing grew tremendously during WWII, but then again fell into disrespect because of rough dancing and alcohol. Then along came Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw and his wife Dorothy Stott Shaw who were devoted to providing a meaningful experience for high school students. The popularity of Pappy's Cheyenne Mountain Dancers had a magnetic pull on Americans, and the dance halls were full.

To avoid the bad reputation of square dancing, the callers and dancers absolutely forbid alcohol before or during a dance (as had always been the rule in New England). To enforce that rule (and a vast variety of other rules) clubs were formed. In response to the club dancing, others spread the gospel of traditional dancing. Square dancing has split into those two camps, and they have some major differences, and one major similarity – good dancers.

And we are back at the top: what makes a good dancer? Dorothy Stott Shaw suggested you could measure a good dancer not by how many figures they claimed to know, but how well they danced the figures they did know. However, there is much more to dancing than executing figures (and I can think of a few I'd like to execute – permanently).

A contemporary caller suggested a good dancer is one who is on time for the next move, doesn't hurt people, can execute any sequence of moves, etc. These characteristics are necessary for a good dancer; on the other hand, this also describes marching. Some wag said that some dancing has gotten to be like close order drill with women – or as couples.

I love to dance with good dancers because I am assured of successfully getting through the choreography with a minimum of errors. The reward of doing it right is a powerful draw.

Then there are the dancers who are more than proficient; they are the great dancers. They are the people who raise the quality of the dance experience for others. The great dancer moves with style and polish. They invite others to share in their joy of the dance.

David Millstone, a great caller and dance student from New England, tells of being introduced to an elderly gentleman who was at a dance camp; everyone at the camp qualified as good dancers, but "Jack" raised the dance to a new level. As David says, "Jack wasn't just following the figures precisely. He was making faces at his partners and neighbors, perhaps shrugging his shoulders, grinning, a scarecrow of a dancer, having a ball, throwing in a flourish here or there (but always making sure that his partner and neighbors were where they needed to be right on time, not a rigid metronome time but a living, breathing exuberant time.) He wasn't simply following the prescribed steps, going through all the right motions at the right time. Rather, the dance lived in him and he was passing along his enthusiasm and gusto to all he encountered. He left in his wake, as he moved along the set, a line of people noticeably more relaxed, smiling, happier in their own dancer."

In a word, Jack was a great dancer.

David Continues, "A great dancer also inspires the caller and confirms for the person at the mic, "Yes! That's how this dance is supposed to look and feel!". Even the musicians respond to great dancers and add little flourishes and play better.

Great dancers know how to help other dancers in the set get to the right places with subtle pressure and gestures. While dancing, he catches the eye of musicians to let them know he appreciates what they are doing. And the great dancer sets the model by paying attention while the dance is being explained instead of acting like a know it all and chatting during the explanation.

Dick Drum came up with this classification of the growth of dancers:

- 1. Beginning dancers: know nothing.
- 2. Intermediate dancers: knows everything; too good to dance with beginners.
- 3. Hotshot dancers: too good to dance with anyone
- 4. Advanced dancers: dance everything, especially with beginners

My New Year's Resolution is to help as many dancers as I can to become good dancers, if not great dancers.
