This is What the 4th of July is Really About

As I came out of the supermarket that sunny day, pushing my cart of groceries towards my car, I saw an old man with the hood of his car up and a lady sitting inside the car, with the door open. The old man was looking at the engine. I put my groceries away in my car and continued to watch the old gentleman from about 25 feet away. I saw a young man in his early twenties with a grocery bag in his arm, walking towards the old man. The old gentleman saw him coming too, and took a few steps towards him. I saw the old gentleman point to his open hood and say something.

The young man put his grocery bag into what looked like a brand new Cadillac Escalade and then turned back to the old man and I heard him yell at the old gentleman saying, "You shouldn't even be allowed to drive a car at your age." And then with a wave of his hand, he got in his car and peeled rubber out of the parking lot.

I saw the old gentleman pull out his handkerchief and mop his brow as he went back to his car and again looked at the engine. He then went to his wife and spoke with her and appeared to tell her it would be okay. I had seen enough and I approached the old man. He saw me coming and stood straight and as I got near him I said, "Looks like you're having a problem."

He smiled sheepishly and quietly nodded his head. I looked under the hood myself and knew that whatever the problem was, it was beyond me. Looking around I saw a gas station up the road and told the old man that I would be right back. I drove to the station and went inside and saw three attendants working on cars. I approached one of them and related the problem the old man had with his car and offered to pay them if they could follow me back down and help him.

The old man had pushed the heavy car under the shade of a tree and appeared to be comforting his wife. When he saw us, he straightened up and thanked me for my help. As the mechanics diagnosed the problem (overheated engine), I spoke with the old gentleman.

When I shook hands with him earlier, he had noticed my Marine Corps ring and had commented about it, telling me that he had been a Marine too. I nodded and asked the usual question, 'What outfit did you serve with?'

He had mentioned that he served with the first Marine Division at Tarawa, Saipan, Iwo Jima, and Guadalcanal. He had hit all the big ones and retired from the Corps after the war was over. As we talked we heard the car engine come on and saw the mechanics lower the hood. They came over to us as the old man reached for his wallet, but was stopped by me and I told him I would just put the bill on my AAA card.

He still reached for the wallet and handed me a card that I assumed had his name and address on it and I stuck it in my pocket. We all shook hands all around again and I said my goodbye's to his wife. I then told the two mechanics that I would follow them back up to the station. Once at the station I told them that they had interrupted their own jobs to come along with me and help the old man. I said I wanted to pay for the help, but they refused to charge me.

One of them pulled out a card from his pocket looking exactly like the card the old man had given to me. Both of the men told me then, that they were Marine Corps Reserves. Once again we shook hands all around and as I was leaving, one of them told me I should look at the card the old man had given to me. I said I would and drove off.

For some reason I had gone about two blocks when I pulled over and took the card out of my pocket and looked at it for a long, long time. The name of the old gentleman was on the card in golden leaf and under his name "Congressional Medal of Honor Society." I sat there motionless looking at the card and reading it over and over. I looked up from the card and smiled to no one but myself and marveled that on this day, four Marines had all come together, because one of us needed help. He was an old man all right, but it felt good to have stood next to greatness and courage and an honor to have been in his presence. Remember, OLD men like him gave you FREEDOM for America. Thanks to those who served....& those who supported them. If you don't stand behind our troops, PLEASE feel free to stand in front of them! The unauthorized duplication of sound recordings is not only a serious violation of the copyright law, but is a serious violation of state and federal criminal law. If you buy a record you are only allowed to use that record for your personal use. You cannot make a copy of the record, tape, cd, mini-disk or jump drive and give it to or sell it to someone else. You are allowed to make a copy for your own use only. You should, however, be able to show proof of purchase of the record should you ever be questioned about it. The legal and potential civil and/or criminal exposure that occurs by copying recorded music and selling or giving it to someone else is dangerous. If there are one or twenty people involved right down the chain each person can be charged under state and federal law. <u>Penalty can be imprisonment of not less than one year and a fine up to \$25,000 for the first offense and up to \$50,000 and ten years imprisonment for any subsequent offense. Think about it.</u>

Motivating Dancers to Recruit New Dancers

From John Saunders:

How can we get the dancers more motivated to help find new class members. I know you'll hear the same old excuses of we have asked all of our friends and we don't know anyone else to ask. Remind them that every time they get the car serviced or buy groceries or get a hair cut they come in contact with someone. This one on one contact worked in the past and will work now.

However, as callers and leaders we cannot depend on the dancers alone to do this recruiting. We as callers must be there to do our part to help. Look back on the times when your recruiting program was most successful and remember what you did. Try to repeat some of those positive things and you may find that they still work. You may not get the big crowds that you used to get, but if you can increase your numbers by a couple of squares each class you can be successful. If you have a club membership of 40 dancers and each dancer actually puts the class flyer in the hands of just 10 people, then along with what you can give out and any demos you can do, I would bet that you can see results. We used to encourage dancers to bring new dancers to the first night or two of classes. We should still be doing this. Another thing I've noticed in our area is the increased number of demos we are asked to do at this time of year. These demos would be more useful if they were done closer to the start of a new class, so ask the sponsoring group if they maybe could change them and tell the reason why. Don't sell any idea short. Any promotional idea is worth looking at and you never know what will work at a given time in a given area. The dancing part of our activity has not changed. The dancers like to dance and the callers like to call. The way we perceive our activity has changed and I don't think all the perceptions are good. Try to remember what got you into the activity and kept you in the activity. Remember what you liked about square dancing and promote the heck out of those things. The things you don't like, make sure they are not brought up to new dancers. Sometimes you have to back up to go forward. Maybe it's time for us to look back and then be able to look forward. Remember the old hoe-down record "Back Up and Push." Thanks, John.

2011 Florida State Square Dance Convention

Since we can no longer use the grocery and gas coupons as a fundraiser for the State Convention, we will need to find other ways and/or put more energy into the one fundraiser we currently have.

Now that the Florida State Convention is an "all state convention", every association is involved in the fundraising for the convention every year. The convention is no longer sponsored by an individual association where they raised the funds for their convention. All associations are now involved, and therefore, must assist with the fundraising every year.

The "big" fundraiser we have for the 2011 convention is the selling of used square dance clothes on E-Bay with all the proceeds to benefit the convention. This is such an easy project for all of us because all we have to do is donate the square dance clothes that we've been wanting to dispose of any way but didn't know how.

All you have to do is go through your closet and pull out ladies' outfits that you no longer wear and bring them to your association's Ways & Means Chairman. What we need the most is complete ladies' outfits **in good repair** (men's clothing doesn't sell as well...sorry guys!). Individual items don't net much money for the amount of work that goes into listing them; blouses, skirts, slips and dresses are best. Outfits can be created from the individual pieces that are received.

The West Coast Association Ways & Means Chairmen are Lance and Rita Baxter (<u>lanceandrita@yahoo.com</u>) with Jenny Green (<u>kitycatz@tampabay.rr.com</u>) assisting them. If you have any clothes to donate, please bring them to the West Coast Dance Sunday and the Baxters and Jenny will collect them and transport them to the convention chairman.

These donations will then be taken to a square dancer in Orlando who has an E-bay site to sell used square dance clothing. She will inspect the clothes, take pictures of each outfit and post them on her site. To make this task easier for her, please ensure that the clothes are not missing buttons, stained or are worn or torn in any way.
