
From the Editor

Robert (Doc/Bob) W. Tirrell, Jr. – retired cuer - Doc/Bob Tirrell, 85, went to be with his Lord Tuesday evening Dec. 29, 2009 peacefully with family at his side.

He was born June 27, 1924 in Brockton, MA to Robert Wilson Tirrell, Sr. and Edith Averill Tirrell. He attended several different schools in New England, Germany, and NJ. He graduated with Dartmouth class of '45 although with the World War II interruption, it was actually in 1947. While at Dartmouth, he became a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon. During World War II, he was a Navy Pharmacist mate attached to the 3rd Marines, 3rd regiment in the Pacific. He furthered his education at New York University School of Dentistry, graduating in 1951.

Doc practiced dentistry in New York City for 20 years and then gradually moved his practice to New Jersey where he practiced for another 20 years. He retired in 1991 to Waterford, Vermont.

He married the love of his life, Peg Morse on June 16, 1948 in Ridgefield Park, NJ. They honeymooned while riding their bikes 13 days to get to their summer jobs in Lakewood, ME. They began square dancing for relaxation in 1949 at the local Y. This led them to a lifetime commitment to the promotion of square and round dancing. They began cueing and teaching round dancing in 1960. They helped form many square and round dance clubs including Tenakill Twirlers (Cresskill, NJ), Garden State Campers Chapter 001 NSDCA (NJ), MontShire Campin' Squares Chapter 181 NSDCA (VT/NH). They were presidents of the Northern New Jersey Square Dance Association in 1964-65 and editors of the association magazine, Grand Square, for 25 years. They were founding members of the Northern New Jersey Round Dance Leaders Council, becoming honorary lifetime members in 1992.

They were chairman of LEGACY (International Association of Square Dance Leaders) from 1981-1985 and 1997-1999 and Executive Secretary from 2000-2003. They were Founders of ROUNDALAB, the International Association of Round Dance Leaders and served as Executive Secretary, and historian, as well as a member of many committees.

Upon retiring to Vermont, they became members of the Vermont Association of Round Dance Leaders (VARDL) and have served as secretary/treasurer. They have often represented VARDL at the Vermont Association of Western Style Square Dance Clubs (VAWSSDC) meetings. They have edited the VAWSSDC quarterly magazine, Gazette, for 14 years. They are lifetime members of the New England Square and Round Dance Foundation and have served as membership chairman and public relations chairman. They also were associate editors of the NSDCA TIMES, official magazine of the National Square Dance Campers Association (NSDCA), for 14 years and represent the NSDCA at ARTS-Dance meetings (Association of Square Dance Associations promoting square dancing).

They have choreographed many round dances and have taught and/or cued at 34 National Square Dance Conventions, 12 Canadian National Square and Round Dance Conventions, and 21 New England Square and Round Dance Conventions. They were secretary and public relations chairman for the 2004 and 2005 New England Conventions in Brattleboro, VT. They have cued rounds for many square and round dance clubs in New Jersey, New York, Maine, Vermont, and New Hampshire, and called many square dance fun nights in New Jersey and New York.

They have received many awards for their dedication to the square and round dance activity including the Lucarini award (NJ -1965), Yankee Clipper (New England -2004), Roundalab Silver Circle (1992), Roundalab special award (2008), Silver Spur (national recognition of service to square dancing - 1995), and the LEGACY Heritage Award (national recognition of promotion of the square dance activity - 2002).

Square Dancing became a family activity and often they were joined on the dance floor by their three children and several grandchildren. In 1998 and 2008 they celebrated their 50th and 60th wedding anniversaries with special square and round dance parties. Doc was very proud to know the many people that he introduced to the joy of square and round dancing.

As a dentist, Bob was a member of the New York First District Dental Society, serving as chair of program, education, and membership committees and 3 years as treasurer. He also served on several committees including necrology, finance, and ethics. He assisted in the organizing of the 1969 American Dental Association convention in New York City as secretary and in charge of local arrangements. He became a Fellow in the International College of Dentistry in 1965 and a Master in 1987. He was also a member of the New York Academy of Dentistry. He was a member of Delta Sigma Delta (Dental Fraternity), the New Jersey Dental Society and a delegate to the ADA convention as well as society treasurer for 13 years. He also volunteered as a dentist at Englewood Hospital, Englewood, NJ.

Bob served the Borough of Cresskill (NJ) as a member of the Board of Health and the cochairman of the Community Chest. He was also a 50 years member of the Tenakill Masonic Lodge in Tenafly, NJ. Bob was a member of the Reformed Church on the Hill (RCA) in Cresskill where he was on the Consistory as both an elder and a deacon. He also taught junior high Sunday school and was Sunday school superintendent for several years.

Since moving to Waterford, Doc has become involved with the Dartmouth '45 Tuesday monthly luncheon club, edited (with Peg) the Dartmouth '45 newsletter, and was co-chair of the 60th class reunion in 2005. As a member of North Congregational Church, he taught junior high Sunday school, served as a deacon, church treasurer, and acolyte coordinator. He also volunteered at the Wednesday community lunch program. Active in the lives of his grandchildren, he became a Boy Scout merit badge counselor. As a Friend of the Davies Memorial Library, Doc was in charge of the outdoor information sign.

Doc is survived by Peg Tirrell, his wife of 61+ years; his children, Scott (Deb) Tirrell of San Bernardino, CA, Barbara Connelly of Lower Waterford, and Gail (Christopher) Vaucher of Las Cruces, NM; his grandchildren, Jeff (Hollie) Tirrell of Beaverton, OR, Ryan (Cristina) Tirrell of Los Angeles, CA, Paul Connelly of Lower Waterford and Crystal Connelly of Lower Waterford.

He was predeceased by his brother Keith Tirrell, son-in-law Jim Connelly, and grandson Joshua Connelly.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, January 30, 2010 at 2 pm at North Congregational Church, 1325 Main St., St. Johnsbury, VT.

Dancer Highlight

Tom & Isla Coburn



Isla was born in Aurora, IL, moved to Compton, CA, when she was 10 and then moved to Seattle, WA, when she was 15.

Tom was born and raised in Yakima, WA, and moved to Port Angeles, Washington in 1949. From 1956 – 1962, he served in the Navy on the USS Mt. Baker AE4, home port Japan. He was back in Port Angeles in 1960. Tom drove a logging truck on the Olympic Peninsula for about 30 years.

Tom and Isla met in April 1974 and were married in

June of the same year in Sequim, WA. Isla has two children, six grandchildren and three great grandchildren. Tom has five children, 12 grandchildren and six great grandchildren. Isla managed a chiropractic office in Port Townsend, WA, from 1989 until she retired in 2001. Tom retired from truck driving the same year. They moved to Sebring in 2001, after Isla's mother's husband passed away.

In 1974 Isla was going through a divorce and she was introduced to a young lady that was going through square dance lessons; she suggested that Isla come along; she did and she was hooked! Isla met Tom during that time and when he asked her to marry him, she said on two conditions: one being she doesn't do breakfasts and the other was he'd have to take square dance lessons, and they've been dancing ever since. Tom and Isla were the Round Dance Reps in Washington State in the mid '70s. They would go learn the three round dances being presented each month and then come back to the Association, demonstrate and teach it, and then they would vote for the dance they would like for that month. Isla states that was so long ago, they weren't cued, you had to memorize them.

The Coburns are members of the Harmony Hoedowners in Sebring, Grande Squares of Camp Inn in Frostproof, Pine Ridge Promenaders in Lake Placid (where they are treasurers) and they are currently the Highlands County Reps of the West Coast Square and Round Dancers Association.

As far as hobbies and interests, square dancing is their main interest. Isla enjoys crocheting and reading and sews occasionally and she volunteers at her church.

When asked if there was anything else they wanted us to know about them, Isla wrote "We miss Washington very much and that will always be home, but we are very happy in Florida, especially happy during the winter months. We really enjoy the square dancing here in Florida, and always have a really great time with all the people we have met and all the friends we have made."

Tom and Isla like to visit other square dance clubs and you can usually find them riding along with Sam Dunn, even on his annual trek to Ohio.

Dancing Across America and USDA USA Traveler Program

Pittsford – Not only was the weekly Cast Off 8s square dancing class in the Lothrop gymnasium full of newcomers last week, there were two very special guests. Jerry and Donna Robey of Gainesville, Florida were on hand, having chosen Pittsford to represent Vermont at number 47 in their quest to square dance in all 50 states within 18 months.

Jerry is a retired Methodist minister, and Donna was a stay-at-home mom and housekeeper to six kids. They have eight grandchildren (just enough for a square of dancers). The two retirees have only been square dancing for four years, but it certainly appeals to them.

"We love it," Donna said beaming during a break in the dancing at Lothrop. "It's great for the mind, great for the body. It you square dance for two hours, you probably burn 300 to 500 calories and dance a mile to a mile and a half."

Professional square dance caller Ken Ritucci makes the trip up from West Springfield, Mass. Every week for Wednesday nights in Pittsford. He was thrilled at the number of newcomers in the Lothrop Gym last week.

"I think people just want to get out and try something different," he said. "Meet new people and get some exercise."

Debra Tobin of the Cast Off 8s agreed.

"A lot of people are like, "Well, I don't have any rhythm," she said. "You don't need rhythm, you know? You need to know your left from your right. It's moving and shuffling. No fancy footwork."

Tobin was asked what her title was. "Treasurer's wife," she replied.

Where's the treasurer?

"He's out dancing," she said, nodding toward the floor where her husband Peter was turning and promenading.

And square dancing is good, clean and inexpensive fun. The Cast Off 8s charge \$5 per person, and \$10 a couple. The money goes to pay the caller and pay for the hall. In this case, the group donates money to Lothrop Elementary Schoolf or use of the gym.

The Robeys arrived in Pittsford via South Weymouth, Mass. They were on to Connecticut, then Rhode Island for #48 and #49, then back to Gainesville for break until the bid dance in January, the Hawaiian State Square Dance Convention in Honolulu.

The journey began in Fairbanks, Alaska in July 2008 and according to the rules of the United States Dancers of America USA Traveler Program, they must cover all 50 states within an 18-month period. After 12 states, they earned a red bar pin, 24 states earns a white bar, and 36 states earns a blue bar. At 48 states, they earn a silver bar and when they get to Hawaii, they'll receive a god bar.

The couple has a book with forms documenting each state they visit, and they fill in the date, the name of the square dancing club they visit, the city, state and then the caller must sign the form.

The Robeys did most of their traveling between June and October and broke the country up into sections. For instance, in the fall of 2008, they covered the Midwest and the Mid-Atlantic states. But they are not exactly the type to take it easy.

In June of this year alone, they covered the west, hitting Louisiana (6.1), Arkansas (6.1), Oklahoma (6.3), Missouri (6.4), Kansas (6.5), Nebraska (6/6), Minnesota (6/7), South Dakota (6/6), North Dakota (6/9), Wyoming (6/11), Montana (6/12), Idaho (6/13), Utah (6/16), Arizona (6/20), Nevada (6/22), and California (6/26).

And this isn't about a quick visit to the largest city in each state either. Many times, the Robeys had to go deep into the countryside to find a square. They visited places called Bountiful, Utah; Folkston, Georgia; Pickerington, Ohio; Glassboro, New Jersey and Keepers, Maine.

Donna Robey said she and her husband had not done much traveling around the country prior to this journey, and the experience has been well worth it.

"It's wonderful," Donna said. "People are great and square dancers are super people."

Case in point. A square was not always easy to come by. Folks in Buffalo, Wyoming, put together a square just so the Robeys could dance. The man who ran the local square dancing group in Worthington, Minnesota insisted the Robeys stay at his house and got a square together for them as well.

"Square dancers are very special people," Donna said.

So, the Robeys must have a nice RV in which to tool around the country, right? Nope.

"We motel it," Donna said.

And their choice of vehicle? A Toyota Corolla that gets about 35 miles to the gallon.

"We've talked ourselves in and out of an RV 16 times," Donna said. "Should we, shouldn't we?"

The Robeys said they spend about \$100 a day in their quest, including gas, food and lodging.

"We're pretty easy keepers," Donna said.

The Robeys were asked if they'll feel let down once they reach their goal in Hawaii.

"Oh, it will be exciting because not many people have done it," Donna said. "But I also think it will be a real sense of accomplishment. It's all just for fun."

And then what?

"Then maybe we start on countries, I don't now."

Cuer's Corner

Lisa is taking a break for this issue and so we are sharing the 'Round Dance Tips' by Harold & Meredith Spears, reprinted from the March 2009 *Calls 'n' Cues*, magazine of the Wachington DC area.

Three Gentle Reminders

Recently, three different teachers have taken us aside and urged us to change our ways, and we thought you might enjoy thinking about these features of your dancing. If you had been there, would they have chided you, too? These are not terribly complex or sophisticated features of dance styling, but that doesn't mean that they are easy to master, especially if they have been cemented into habit over time.

1. Don't scuff your feet.

In different dances, we are asked to glide, brush, drag, pull, limp, scoot, and maybe to do a "floor" ronde, but we are not really supposed to scrape or shuffle our feet along the surface of the floor. If those in the seats can hear the "shoosh, shoosh" of our passing, especially if it goes so far as to interrupt their quiet conversation, then we need to pick up our feet. Am I so hard of hearing that I can't hear these scrapings? Am I weak or lazy and unable to pick them up? Probably I just can't think of too many different things at the same time. Skim just above the surface of the floor, but not on the floor.

2. Don't look at your partner.

It's ironic. Here, we have our partners in our arms, the music is sweet, the lights are low, the mood is romantic and we can't gaze into their eyes. We really do need to keep our heads up and our eyes left, most of the time. It is a question of our individual balance and our counterbalance related to our partner. If we look at our partner, whether it is adoringly or questioning, we shift our own balance toward her. Both of our positions are disturbed. She will feel pushed. Our frame loosens, and she won't feel a clear lead or will feel the wrong lead. Men, you may worship your partner, but do it a bit from afar.

3. Don't grimace or scowl.

The casual view of dancing is one of lightness and joy. It is the carefree flitting of the butterfly among soft, meadow breezes. But we dancers have a more complete picture. Some of those routines are demonic, requiring hard work and concentration. So what do you do as you listen to the cues, furiously struggle to turn those sometimes

meaningless words into coordinated action, think about what your partner is doing and what you might do to facilitate and mesh with all that, and maybe keep an eye on nearby dancers with a view to avoiding collisions? Do you frown? Squint with the effort and purse or twist your lips in concentration? Do you emit little grunts or squeals of pain and frustration? Well, don't do that. This is fun; it's your recreation-smile.

Round dancing is not a simple activity. There are over 20 different rhythms and hundreds of different figures. Choreographers and cuers throw these steps at us faster than we can think. On top of what they tell us to do, we need to layer extras like lead and follow, rise and fall, footwork, maybe sway and slice, a little Latin hop here, some contra-body over there. The old joke is about how hard it is to do two things at one time (walk & chew gum). Round dancing certainly gives us more than two. And on top of all of this, I need to lift my feet, look left, and smile.

According to the New England Journal of Medicine, Dancing lowered the risk of dementia. Based on studies, the Journal rated the results from dancing higher than for those who read, playing board games or musical instruments. The frequency of the activity also plays a large roll in its effectiveness. Those people who participated more than once a week in a dance activity realized a lower cost.

A Washington Post Article dated June 19, 2003 presented the following statistics: Dancing lowered the risk of dementia by 76%; playing board games lowered the risk of dementia by 74%; playing a musical instrument lowered the risk of dementia 69%; working crossword puzzles lowered the risk of dementia by 38%.

This study further emphasizes the Mayo Clinic Study in 10984. That study showed Dancing can burn as many calories as walking, swimming or riding a bicycle. During a half hour of sustained

dancing you can burn between 200 and 400 calories. One factor that determines how many calories you'll expend is distanced in one study, researchers attached pedometers in square dancers and found each person covered nearly the five miles in a large evening.

Dancing further provides cardiovascular conditioning regular exercise can lead to a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure, and can improved cholesterol profile. Regular exercise also helps strengthen bones. Dancing is appositive alternative to aerobic dance or jogging. Dancing also contains a social component that solitary fitness endeavors don't. It gives you an opportunity to develop strong social ties which contribute to self-esteem and a positive outlook

Live Ten Years Longer!!

Square Dancing will add 10 years to your life, a surprising new study shows. Dr. Arron Blackburn states. "It's clear that square dancing is the perfect exercise. It combines all the positive aspects of intense physical activity with none of the negative elements"

The study was based on their physical examinations which indicated that both female and male square dancers could expect to live well into their '80's.

The square dance movements raise the heart rate like any good aerobic exercise should. All the quick changes of direction loosen and tone up the muscles, but not so severely as to cause injury. In square dancing, when you're not moving, you're clapping hands or tapping feet, which all contribute to long term fitness.
