E-mail from Patty Wilkerson regarding Dan:

First of all we would like to thank all of you for your prayers and concerns. The surgery Thursday night was supposed to take about two hours. It took at least three and a half hours. Friday the leg was immobilized and he just rested. Yesterday the doctor took off all the bandages and the drain out of his leg and put the immobilizer back on. He also got out of bed to the chair. They gave him some medicine for the severe muscle spasms he was having in the leg. But all in all he is doing well. It will be an uphill climb but at least now we know that he will be getting better. The doctor said that he will be on continuous IV antibiotic at home for many many weeks trying to kill any bacteria left in the knee. He also took a lot of infected tissue out of the knee. He can't put any pressure on the knee or leg. He will be getting up on the walker today and can only touch his big toe for balance. Please continue to keep him in your prayers. He will be coming home and not to a rehab center sometime near the end of the week. Patti

Email from Don Slocum:

We met with Dr Guerrier, Radiation Oncologist, today to discuss the future treatment. The decision is to combine hormone therapy with external radiation. I will have a pelvic CT and a full body bone scan on Oct 6th for comparison to the ones before surgery. I will meet with my surgeon, Dr Smith on Oct 20th to discuss and hopefully start hormone therapy (depending on the results of the CT & bone scan). I will meet with Dr Guerrier on Dec 1st for a pelvic simulation from which the final radiation program will be established. The actual radiation treatments can't start until 8 weeks after the start of hormone therapy. The tentative date for start is Dec 20th.

Supplies are being gathered for a long trip to Port Lakeland, and everyone's help is needed to ensure we have enough supplies. The Sew 'n Save for this convention will be called Pirates' Treasure Chest. Nancy and Dennis Taylor are busy making plans to showcase sewing techniques, craft ideas and new tools to inspire you. There will also be raffles for exciting goodies. You can help make this a success by donating the following items:

- Yarn black, white and red worsted or sport weight
- Embroidery floss black, white, and red
- Plastic mesh canvas 7 count, clear and colors, 4" x 4" minimum
- Paper Cardstock weight, black, white and any color; regular weight solids and patterns in black, white and red
- **<u>Ribbon</u>** $1/8'' \& \frac{1}{4}''$ black, white and red
- Fabric Cotton, any color or pattern, small pieces OK
- Felt any color, small pieces OK

These items are needed now so they can work on some "give aways". Also, they are working on prototypes of some "make and take" items.

In addition to supplies, they need people who are willing to work on plastic mesh canvas. Kits are being made to pass out which will contain directions on how to work plastic mesh canvas and specific directions on how to do this pattern as well as a picture of the finished project. Kits can be mailed to people for distribution or possible arrangements can be made to deliver them to dances. Recruiting and Retaining New Class Members: A Tried and Proven Method

Recruiting and keeping new class members seems to be an ongoing problem in the square dance community. It seems that everyone has exhausted the list of names of people they know whom they have attempted to introduce to square dancing. Individuals, dance organizations, and caller associations, have tried various methods to promote square dancing such as community dance programs and even the crash course of weekend classes. Nothing, it seems, retains dancers.

One comment we frequently hear from people is that, "It takes too long to learn to square dance." Another is, "there are too many movements and too much to remember, much like a foreign language." As a result, callers/instructors are often pushed by clubs to rush the new dancers through the program, perhaps only showing a movement once or twice before going on to the next. After graduation, when the new dancers attend a public square dance, they may consequently have difficulty dancing the program of calls in the area and/or get frustrated and embarrassed. As a result, they often leave the activity shortly thereafter.

In addition, there are also clubs that start classes with 20 or more new people, yet class graduation pictures only show five to ten new dancers. Where have all the class members gone? Clearly, this shows a problem with retention. We believe we have the solution. We learned of a program that a local caller in Indiana tried, and it interested us. We have a caller-run club, the Hi-Timers in Columbus, Ohio, and we decided to experiment. This is what we did:

We decided to bring "the demo" and the potential new dancers to us. We blanketed the restaurants, churches, Laundromats, etc., in the Columbus area, with flyers inviting everyone to a free dinner dance party (note: we did not mention "square dance"). Our club dances in the fellowship hall of a community church and with a little encouragement, they helped us sponsor and advertise the event. As the callers, we provided the meat and the club members brought side dishes. We had a group of over 125 people come out to enjoy the free food and free dancing. We provided regular dance music, performed D.J. functions and taught some basic line dances. Following that, we got everyone in a circle and showed a few square dance basics. We danced simple movements like circle left, circle right, make a star, star promenade, etc. It was, in other words, treated as a one-night party with minimal teaching, 90% dancing, and not like a class tip. Other dancing followed this.

Later, we paired our guests with club members and put them in squares. We called nothing more than what we called in the circle. The people had a great time, and they were interested in coming out for square dance lessons, which were scheduled for the following Monday night. We informed them of our program for lessons. Classes are two nights a week for 15-18 weeks. To sell this, we explained that square dancing has its own "language" and reminded them that one cannot fluently learn a new language by going to class only once a week. We found that by having classes twice a week, which we did on Monday and Wednesday, the class members did not have as much time to forget what they learned, so we were able to introduce various positions as well.

On Monday night we taught five to six movements. On Wednesday, the first tip included only movements taught on Monday. Very minimal review was required because they did not have time to forget. Two to three new movements were then introduced that same night. The following Monday we reviewed the movements from Wednesday and then added five to six more movements. The whole program progressed this way. We did the heavy teach on Monday (2 ½ hour class) and light teach on Wednesday (1 ½ hour class). Wednesday was also our weekly club dance so the new people were able to get to know the club members. They were invited to join in the first tip of the night and this made them feel more welcome.

We had great success with this program. Twenty-three new dancers were recruited for the class and a 100% retention rate was maintained through graduation, and on into the square dance world. This past year, we had a class of 14 people, 100% retention, and they are still dancing. An important point to note is that these new graduates began dancing at other area clubs and the veteran dancers did not know they were newly graduated. These new dancers danced that well!

We are currently trying to promote this program to all 10 clubs in our area. The numbers read as follows: 10 times 40 dancers (5 squares per club) equal 400 dancers already in the area. If every club only graduates 10 new dancers per class and sponsors 2 classes per year, this could increase their club membership by 50%. Multiply this times two years and you have 100%

growth, minus normal attrition. For 10 clubs, that would be 400 new area dancers in 2 years! So the numbers are there and just think of the possibilities when you incorporate this program into your area on a continuing basis! With a combined total of 70+ years of teaching classes and calling square dances between us, using the current dancer accepted CALLERLAB dance programs, we are totally convinced that this is the best way to promote, recruit, teach, and most importantly, retain dancers.

Swing (Your Partner) is one of the few square dance calls that requires much physical coordination; it also takes most people the longest to learn to do well. In fact, even some experienced dancers don't swing especially well (shudder!), and many simply refuse to really dance this call. This is sad, as swinging can be a lot of fun. If you haven't had much practice yet, so don't worry if you still feel clumsy at it.

It's difficult to put into words what makes a good swing; nevertheless, listed below are some suggestions to think about (not necessarily all at once) as you practice swinging. We also strongly encourage you to seek out club members who do swing well and ask them for practice and feedback. Pat and I are certainly more than happy to help people out this way.

Your right foot moves barely at all – just enough to trace out a tiny circle around your central pivot point. It is your left foot that propels you.

There should be essentially no vertical motion; you are moving in a smooth circle, not bouncing up and down.

The strength in the position is in the man's right arm, with the right hand securely in the small of the woman's back; there is also some firmness in the woman's left arm. The remaining arms are held only lightly for balance – too much tension here makes the swing less fluid, and getting out of it clumsy. In fact, it should be possible for the woman to drop her right hand (man's left) entirely and not substantially affect the swing.

Give weight. Sometimes we say "Lean back." This doesn't mean lean your head back, but rather your whole torso, a bit like starting to sit down. The idea is to let some centrifugal force

play a role in the figure. Try this physics experiment most of us have done in our youth at one time or another: Take your partner's hands in yours, lean way back, and spin around. Feel that force in your arms? Notice how, once you got started, the centrifugal force let you spin rather smoothly, and you didn't have to work very hard except to hang on? A good swing should have some of this feeling, except your arms are in ballroom position.

Look into each other's eyes. This isn't essential (some people are shy), but it's friendly and may help you keep from getting dizzy.

If you want lots of practice, try out contra dancing some time. A significant fraction of most figures is Swing.
