MACKINAC ISLAND TOUR

The 60th National Square Dance Convention will be held in Detroit, Michigan. Michigan is one of seven states that have the Great Lakes on its borders. Michigan’s magnificent coastland gives its reputation as a Water Wonderland State. The Tours Committee simply had to include several

tours that provide visiting square dancers a chance to enjoy a memorable tour of one of its renowned vacation attractions; one of them being Mackinac Island.

The Mackinac Island State Park is located off the northern tip of Michigan's Lower Peninsula. Visitors reach the island by a twenty-minute ferry ride from the mainland. The island culture is one that embellishes an early American history of fur trading and fortress life. One can feel the slow pace of the past as you walk the small town streets and appreciate the island's natural surroundings.

Motor vehicles are not allowed on the island. Mackinac Island transportation is strictly horse drawn carriages and bicycles with either single or double seats. It is a natural theme park of early America when the island was essentially an early military fort protecting the coast land from the British during the War of 1812. The quaint shops, its historical military fort, small cottages, and sweet confectionaries offering eating delights, such as pastry, fudge, ice cream, and taffy goodies, are fun experiences. It is a vacation spot that encourages you to relax and enjoy the scenery with family, its citizens demonstrating the island's historical 19th century Americana. The beautiful Grand Hotel is easily seen when the ferry brings visitors into the Island Ferry dock.

Being at the top of the Lower Peninsula of Michigan, it can be a little nippy in the summer evenings, so bring a light jacket or sweater with you. Sleeping at one of the fine hotels should be outstanding, especially when its fresh air wakes you up to picturesque sunrise just before breakfast. It will be unforgettable.

TORONTO-NIAGARA TOUR



Detroit shares the Detroit River across the way with Canadian friends of Windsor, Ontario. Detroiters have a heartfelt connection with its Canadian neighbors. The Tour Committee felt that an overnight tour to the great city of Toronto would excite any square dancer who seeks a little international adventure. Toronto, Ontario is known as the "New York" of Canada. Its metropolitan flamboyance is well known. Toronto has its unique flair of city life and culture that will dazzle anyone interested in experiencing Canada for the first time. The guided tour will take you to downtown Toronto to see the CN tower and a ferry to Toronto Island. The tour travels through a vast parade of ethnic communities in their neighborhood locations. Art and History Detroit Style (\$40): The newly renovated Detroit Institute of Arts is heralded throughout the world as one of the premier venues in the cultural world – Renoir, Van Gogh, Picasso! The Detroit Historical Museum captures the history of Detroit as the American Auto Capitol.

Motown Museum and Detroit City Tour (\$43): This guided tour includes the business, sport, historical and cultural centers of the city. Architectural history, urban parks, museums, theater districts, universities and unique neighborhoods will be featured. A stop and visit at the Motown "Hitsville" Museum will be a true highlight of the tour.

Point of Order

When To Move From Plus to Advanced

Here are commonly asked questions about Advanced dancing, as discussed on a recent panel on Advanced at the annual CALLERLAB Convention.

- Question:** How do I know when to move from Plus to Advanced dancing?
Answer: When you are bored at Plus. But, be sure you are bored with the [PROGRAM], not with the CALLER. Be sure to dance to a lot of callers and if you are bored at most of the dances, then consider taking Advanced.
- Question:** Should I move to Advanced because my friends are doing so?
Answer: Some people do this, but if they are not enthusiastic about it, they will tend to drift through lessons, only learning the bare minimum to survive. The result is they will be the cause of squares breaking down. If you don't want people to inwardly groan when you get in their square, only move to Advanced if you are enthusiastic about doing it.
- Question:** I'm tired of always having to pull dancers through the calls. I've heard that Advanced dancers are better so I suspect I won't have this problem if I go to Advanced. Is this true?
Answer: No. Simply being exposed to more calls does NOT make a person a better dancer. A good dancer knows how to dance to the music, use correct timing in doing the calls, and how to move themselves around the square. I have seen many Mainstream and Plus dancers who are much better than some people attending

Advanced dances. Never move on because you think you will be leaving the bad dancers behind. They are up there waiting for you.

4. **Question:** I danced to a guest caller at an Advanced club, and the floor broke down a lot because he used a lot of Mainstream and Plus DBD (Dance by Definition). Why did he call all that DBD?

Answer: Because that is what Advanced dancing is, Mainstream and Plus DBD should be covered thoroughly in Advanced class. Unfortunately, many callers do not do this – they only focus on the Advanced calls. The result is their dancers are top heavy – they know Advanced calls, but have no solid foundation in the basics of dancing. You know what happens to a building when it has a weak foundation – it crumbles.

If you are dancing Advanced and cannot do Mainstream and Plus DBD, don't blame the guest caller. Instead blame the person who taught you Advanced, and blame your regular Advanced club caller who does not call Mainstream and Plus DBD at every dance. Naturally, if a person would not enjoy learning Mainstream and Plus DBD, they should not move to Advanced.
