Charlie Newsome – Florida Federation Vice President - have been facing serious medical concerns of late. Val recently sent along an update on Charlie's health. "He's had a bad sinus infection since before February 11th...saw the doctor that day and got antibiotics and an appointment for a cat scan of the sinus, plus some blood work. Although he was not feeling well most of the time, we continued our daily life and did attend the Blue Grey dance weekend. On Saturday the 20th of Feb, he awoke to a nosebleed at about 4:30/4:45 a.m. By the time 911 arrived he had lost considerable blood and our house from the bedroom to kitchen and back to our master bath looked like a horrible crime scene. They had him at the hospital and the first blood pressure measured by 5:13 a.m. The hospital got it stopped, cleaned him up and we came home about 10 a.m.

We spent the remainder of the day resting at home. As we were preparing for bed Charlie once again began to bleed from his nose. Between our neighbor, who is a nurse, and myself, we couldn't get it under control so we called 911 again. They couldn't stop the bleeding either and Charlie was getting weaker and dizzy, so off they took him to the hospital once more. This time they put in a balloon packing with a tube down and taped to the side of his face and kept him for observation until about 2:30 or 3 a.m., at which time they again released him with page s of instructions on what to do Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

Charlie was experiencing a lot of vertigo and general weakness but by Monday he was feeling better. We followed up with the ENT Surgeon on Tuesday with hopes of removing the packing. He required two areas to be cauterized and general cleaning. The exam showed bleeding inside the ear canals as well. His type of nosebleed is called a severe and massive one." He and Val will continue to follow up with the doctor as we were advised that it may take 2-3 visits of cleanings and cauterizations and possibly surgery to get everything back to normal. For now, Charlie has no appetite and is severely limited in what he is able to do. He's not to bend too much, nor exert himself. He is not to travel nor stray too far from home.

"Anyway, we want you to know we will miss all of you from our weekly dances to the Federation Weekend dances, meetings and visits. We would appreciate your prayers during this recovery period." Cards can be mailed to Val & Charlie at 12368 Brady Rd, Jacksonville, FL 32223 (3.1.10)

Dancers Code of Conduct

Square Dancers everywhere are encouraged to comply with an appropriate Code of Conduct that will enhance the public image and the pleasure of the movement to all dancers and non-dancers, as well.

Among the unique aspects of this wholesome activity, is the attractive attire that is an intrinsic part of the image of the square dance. Accordingly, the wearing of appropriate apparel is as important to the enjoyment of the participants as it is to those watching. Not only should the clothing of the dancers be appealing to the eye, but also functional to the others within the square. It is generally recommended that this includes the wearing of long-sleeved shirts for the men and full or prairie skirts for the adults or local customs and events may require.

Avoidance of alcoholic beverages both before and during dances is essential to insure the enjoyment for everyone. A single drink can severely diminish the response time required to execute the intricate moves of the dance. Square Dancing in itself has the capability of providing sufficient exhilaration to warrant abstinence from alcohol on dance nights.

Courtesy to others is important at all times. This includes personal cleanliness, as Square Dancing is an energetic recreation that can be offensive should adequate precautions not be taken.

The welcoming of others into the dance and into the square is an integral part of the social aspect of Square Dancing. Walking out of a square at any time is considered a severe insult. At the end of the dance, no one should leave the square before thanking everyone who contributed to the joy and the fun of dancing together.

Conforming to the accepted and generally taught hand positions and maneuvers for execution of the movements help to eliminate any uncertainty among the other dancers. Proper styling while dancing is as important to the enjoyment of the Square Dancer as is the proper execution of the movements themselves.

Adherence to these guidelines should be encouraged from the very early stages of beginner's class. The best means of achieving this is through example by experienced dancers and leaders and by the incorporation of ethics into the educational process during the class.

It is felt that through the reaffirmation of these long recognized rules of conduct, dancers everywhere we will be reminded of the importance of courtesy, friendliness and person hygiene. All of these things are an integral part of the Square Dance activity.

American Callers' Association Viewpoints

This month's ACA Viewpoint was communicated from two outstanding square dance leaders, Mr. Charlie Holley from Montgomery, Alabama, and Mr. Mike Matsko, Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania. They looked at some of the issues that have plagued square dancing as a human organization for over forty years such as the problems of leadership, fewer volunteers, low retention rates, dress codes and "aging images." On the surface it looked like many of these issues cannot be rectified. Charlie Holley and Mike Matsco beg to differ with this train of thought and offer DANCE LEADERS VIEWS on how to HELP Dancing by reconnecting the dancers back to the national and local callers, round dance teachers, contraa teachers and line dance instructors. Charlie and Mike purpose that if all square dance enthusiasts would follow these logical ideas that the communications would improve and decreasing numbers of square dancers would reverse itself naturally.

Callers, Cuers, Contra Prompters and Line Dance teachers, what can we as dancers do to help you have better dances? Their answer is that dancers can help plan, promote, and greet the dancers and guests. What are we looking for? The answer is that we desperately need a more connected and cooperative **working together relationships** that will better the dancing activity and atmosphere. Dance enthusiasts know that dancing has physical and mental benefits and offers a social connection with many new friends.

While visiting several areas of the United States, Charlie and Mike observed the lack of supportive leadership from the Callers, Cuers, Contra Prompters and Line Dance teachers. They agree that this lack of support has hampered the efforts of dancers and dance leaders in their attempts to conduct promotional and recruiting activities. With a lack of good leadership, apathy, denial, confusion, and a sense of hopelessness sets in every quickly. Charlie and Mike further maintain that club leaders lose the enthusiasm and interest to continue to lead without the necessary support of Callers, Cuers, and instructors. The end results is that there is very little effort and enthusiasm placed on promotional and recruiting activities. What promotion is done generates little positive results or is ineffective and reinforces the negative frustrations and negative feelings of the dancers. Perhaps, Callers/Cuers/Instructors are not showing real concern about the current declining trend of the number of dancers or the hazy future of Square, Round, Contra, and Line Dancing. This lack of "connection" is not being discussed and elevated among dancers and leaders within their state and regional groups.

Charlie and Mike advocate that organizations like the American Caller's Association, Callerlab, Roundalab, Contralab and the National Teachers' Association, etc. need to aggressively

encourage their members to become more proactive and offer strong leadership and active support to their state, regional and club leaders. This includes, but is not limited to, emphasizing the need to hold periodic meetings to address ways to support the clubs leaders, become active contributors to state and regional groups by selecting a caller and cuer delegate to attend all meetings.

There is a composite noun called "Synergy". Synergy proves the traditional saying that 1+1=7. The translation of this short equation is the two people working together for the good of all far exceeded the results of seven people working for their own benefits. Both Charlie and Mike have observed that when everyone is working together, very positive results are achieved. Their voices cry out **LET'S DO THIS!**

The American Callers' Association is indebted to Charlie Holley and Mike Matsko for composing and organizing their well-presented thoughts and feelings on ways to improve dancing. Along with Charlie Holley and Mike Matsco, the American Callers' Association is dedicated to publicize, promote and preserve square dancing and continuously invests all its assets, time and funds to communicate with callers, dancers, and associations to bring the dance enthusiasts back together to unite as one group with a common goal.

This information was developed by the Education Committee of the United Square Dancers of America, Inc. and will provide information on dance ethics that all dancers should follow to ensure the best possible relations between organizations, clubs and club members.

I. DEFINITION OF ETHICS

Ethics is basically defined as rules or standards for governing the relations between people to benefit all concerned, with mutual respect for the needs and wants of all parties involved.

The essence of ethical behavior is:

- A. To conduct all relations between parties in friendliness, honesty and good faith;
- B. To honor fully, in word and in spirit, all agreements, once made; and
- C. To continue any confine any critical comment to a reasoned and temperate discussion of actions and practices.

II. DANCERS RIGHTS

- A. Dancers should realistically evaluate their own dancing abilities and dance within those abilities.
- B. Dancers should be aware that some of their dancing habits may be uncomfortable or undesirable to other dancers in the square and should make every effort to avoid such actions.
- C. Dancers should treat other members of the club and its visitors and guests with courtesy, friendliness, and helpfulness. They should assist the less experienced dancers.
- D. Dancers should enthusiastically take part in the activities of any club that extends to them the benefits and privilege of membership and should accept all the responsibilities of a club member.
- E. Dancers should be concerned that the relations of their club with callers, other dancers, and other organizations are conducted in an ethical manner.
- F. Dancers should keep within the club and criticism of the conduct of club members, club officers, or club caller or teacher. Any such criticism should be offered in a constructive manner.
- G. Dancers who feel they can no longer accept the rules and practices of the club should resign from the club.
- H. Dancers should not wear the badge of a club if they are not members in good standing of the club.

III. ETHICS FOR CLUBS AND CLUB OFFICERS

- A. Club officers should have as their primary purpose and concern the welfare of the club and the square dance community as a whole.
- B. Club officers should conduct all club business and honor all club contracts in an ethical manner. As honest effort should be made by the club officers to resolve any problems prior to dismissal, the new officers should be made fully aware of any outstanding club commitments. The new officers should consider themselves and the club to be legally and morally bound to fulfill any official commitments made by the previous officers on behalf of the club.
- C. Upon change of club officers, the new officers should be made fully aware of any outstanding cub commitments. The officers should consider themselves and the club to be legally and morally bound to fulfill any official commitments made by the previous officers on behalf of the club.

- D. In contractual matters, club officers should assure that all expectations and requirements, such as schedules, lives, expenses, etc., are clearly stated in writing and are understood by all contracting parties prior to signature.
- E. Clubs should plan and sponsor beginner classes to promote and perpetuate the square dance activity. Graduating dancers should be accommodated by the club, or the club should provide information regarding dancing opportunities in the area.
- F. Clubs should assure that visitors and invited guests are informed of club admission polities, such as attire and admission fees, as well as dance levels.
- G. Clubs should discourage "set squares" and cliques, in order to promote the fun and fellowship of square dancing.
- H. Clubs should use officially defined dance levels and should conform to the official definitions of the level.

Continuing to work on the website "You2CanDance", I am starting to compile the list of 10 Reasons to Dance". I have listed ones off the ARTS-Dance info flyer as well as some others, and am looking for more, as well as any comments on these. I am also looking for any pictures, illustrations or graphics that could accompany each "reason". Thank you in advance, Roy G.

These are in no particular order.

- 1. Cardiovascular Fitness Dancing is a safe way to exercise. The level of exertion is up to each participant. You can rev it up for a high intensity workout or take it easy for a relaxing, yet beneficial workout. Dancing regularly can lead to a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure, and in improved cholesterol profile.
- 2. Healthy Environment Square Dance, Round Dance & Contra Dance clubs are smoke and alcohol free.
- Body & Brain Boost Square, Round, & Contra dancers react to calls as they are given. This forces the body and brain to be tightly coordinated. A number of the calls are memorized which keeps the brain sharp.
- 4. Caloric Burn Dancing burns between 200 and 400 calories every 30 minutes of dancing. That's equivalent to walking or riding a bike.
- 5. Distance The President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports recommends 10,000 steps per day to maintain physical fitness. It is estimated that typical square dancer can expect to clock 9,000 to 10,000 steps per dance.
- 6. Sturdy Bones s- The side to side movements of dancing strengthens weight-bearing bones, tibia, fibula, and femur, and helps prevent the slow loss of bone mass.

- Rehabilitation Dancing is a way to get back in the swing of things if you are recovering from an injury. Dancing keeps your joints moving, and is a nice alternative to jogging or other high-intensity activates.
- 8. Social Aspects Square Dancing and Contra Dancing are great ways to meet people in a non-threatening, relaxed social atmosphere. You never know who you are going to meet. Lifelong friendships are formed, and many have met the love of their life There are clubs for singles, couples, Handicapable, gays and lesbians, campers, and youth, although usually everybody is a welcome at all clubs.
- 9. Stress Relief Since these 3 dance forms, Square Dancing, Round Dancing, and Contra Dancing, are all led by a leader giving commands, you become so focused on the "task at hand" that your other mental worries are forgotten, at lease for a couple of hours.
- 10. Mental Health Studies have shown that activities that involve both physical and mental activity at the same time help to slow the onset of Alzheimer's disease.
- 11. Balance Studies have shown that adults, who have a history of activities such as dance, tend to have less incidents o falling as they get older.

What To Do If A Caller Uses An Incorrect Definition

Most callers know the definitions of calls. However, sometimes newer callers have not studied the definitions thoroughly, and sometimes more experienced callers may not know that a definition has changed. This is more likely to happen at Advanced and Challenge, but it also occurs at Mainstream and Plus. As a dancer, what do you do?

It is most important to never voice objection out loud from the set. This will embarrass the caller, and your status with other dancers will drop because of your having caused this embarrassment. Simply go along with whatever the caller wants for the rest of the tip.

When the tip is over, group and talk privately with the caller. Be sure the caller is wrong, it is best to avoid saying so right away in your conversation. Instead see if the caller can figure it out for himself/herself, because the caller will accept the idea better this way. Do this by asking what the caller wanted and as how this fits with the definition as you understand it.

At this point one of two things will happen: (1) The caller will admit that he/she might have been stretching the definition, or (2) the caller will defend his position and keep using the call in the same way.

If the caller decides to continue using the call improperly and you know you re correct, then you should point out to the caller how his/her definition is incorrect. Do not hesitate to say you have danced it differently to other callers if you a have done so, and even consider naming these callers as your authority. The caller's mind may not change, but you have done your part by planting the idea. The caller may research this after the dance or change his mind later on if other dancers say the same thing.

Dancer responsibility. It is the responsibility of every dancer to tell a caller when material is being used in violation of established definitions.

Some dancers cringe at this idea. They say, "I would never tell a caller he is wrong." Unfortunately, such thinking works to the detriment of the square dance activity. If a caller is using material incorrectly, this is adversely affecting hundreds or even thousands of dancers. Every time the caller uses the call incorrectly, the dancers think this is the correct definition, and thus the dancers learn a wrong definition. If a dancer knows the correct definition and refuses to bring it to the caller's attention, then that danc3er must share the blame equally with the caller for the spreading of incorrect definitions.

May dancers today know more about call definitions than some callers. These defacers may dance to many callers and take time to actively study definitions. If these dancers share their knowledge, this can only serve to help the square dance activity, especially when those who don't know (such as callers) are in a position to influence hundreds of dancers.

What if the caller takes offence at being told he is calling something wrong? Two bad. The activity is bigger than any caller. If a caller takes force at being told a call is being used incorrect, that is the caller's problem and is a sign the caller is unsecure The activity is best served by the caller being told when incorrect call definitions are being used, so that other dancers do not continue to be taught wrong.

One word of caution: Be sure you know what you are talking about when the cussing all definitions with a caller, be able to defend your position, and be sure you are correct. Otherwise, the caller will have on the defensive instantly. But if you are correct, then it is your responsibility for the good of the square dance activity alert callers when they have used an incorrect definition. Be sure you are right, then go ahead!
