Florida Callers Association President's Message

My current class is getting very close to graduating, so I've started to challenge them. Hopefully, you're challenging your classes about the same things. I'm not talking about the moves on a list. Instead, I'm, referring to the little things that make a big difference.

Take the square dance dress code: I know there's a huge movement right now to do away with any vestige of a dress code. The thinking is that the dress code is one of those things driving

people away. When I talk to classes (and clubs!) about square dance attire, I'm not advocating frilly skirts, yards of bouncing crinoline or bolo ties for everyone. Jeans are fine, and I think prairie skirts are great. But I do think long sleeved shirts covering a sweaty arm makes the evening more pleasant for everyone. And call me old fashioned, but I like to tell the difference between he's and she's when they're moving in the square.

I'm also starting to wonder when we, as callers, stopped teaching a little dance etiquette. Things like filling a square instead of ignoring a begging caller and three couples who'd really like to dance. Or how to be more gentle and less of a "yanker". And, of course, the perennial favorite: if I can't dance in my "set" square, I'm not going to dance at all.

The new graduates are on their way. All over Florida, clubs are getting ready to graduate their classes, and the odds are good that some of these shy, but enthusiastic, new dancers may end up at one of your dances in the near future. How they are treated may well determine how many will still be dancing just six months from now.

Do you welcome these folks and adjust your program a little so that they can succeed, or do you just keep plugging along, and if they get there, great. We've sweated for months to teach and motivate them. It all goes down the drain if they don't have a good time when they head out into the wonderful world of Square Dancing.

Remember, we all started doing this because it was fun. Sometimes, we as callers forget just how much power we have to make or break an evening of dancing for everyone on the floor. Let's do what we can to make sure that all of this year's graduates are still whooping and hollering this time next year!

The Only Thing Constant in Life is Change.

Every article I read and every conversation I hear about the demise of square dancing always states that if we don't get new dancers and we don't shorten our lessons, square dancing will fade away. Well, I see another issue that may even be larger than the two aforementioned ones, that if not addressed will also cause the end of square dancing.

The way we treat people, which encompasses many things, i.e.

- Not accepting ideas from new dancers because "we have been doing it this way for 30 years".
- > Being critical of dancers who don't want to wear the traditional full skirt and crinoline.
- Preventing young people from joining clubs and associations by having a minimum age requirement in the bylaws.
- Avoiding squares with young dancers because they are too rambunctious and rowdy in a square.
- Avoiding squares with same sex couples.

- Preventing singles and same sex couples from joining clubs and/or associations by having a clause in the bylaws that states "Only male/female couples can join".
- Making singles or solos feel unwelcome at a class or dance by telling them they can't come unless they have a partner, not making sure they get to dance if they do come alone, letting them sit alone, etc.
- Not letting new dancers chair or serve on committees because they don't know anything about the particular project.

What are we going to do to change these behaviors?

We need fresh new ideas. Where are we going to get these fresh new ideas? From new dancers who have been involved in other organizations. If what we have been doing for 30 years is working, we wouldn't be in the predicament we are in now; declining attendance, less new dancers, no younger dancers, etc. So what we have been doing for 30 years must not be working! When new dancers suggest new ideas, we should listen with open ears, minds and hearts. These new ideas should not be met with criticism, negative attitudes or reasons why it won't work.

Attire; the age-old discussion of what is appropriate and what isn't! Attire doesn't make a good dancer. It also doesn't tell you if a person is a good dancer or not. Just because we say 'casual attire' it doesn't mean you have to come in casual. If you would rather wear the traditional full skirt and crinoline, then go for it. As long as the attire isn't offensive; and by offensive, I mean smelly, showing body parts that don't need to be shown in public, etc., then they should be allowed to wear what is comfortable for them. Many times you will find that people who come in attire that you don't like will eventually bow down to your good influence and start dressing better. Square dance attire is required; sounds pretty "military" to me. Perhaps it might be a little friendlier to say 'square dance attire <u>preferred</u>'.

Preventing young people from joining clubs and/or associations by having a minimum age rule -I think we all agree we need and want younger dances to keep our activity alive and well. But what sense does it make to teach young people to dance and then tell them "You can't join our club until you're 18." Do you think they're going to stick around until they're 18? If a young person is interested in joining a square dance club, why wouldn't we take them in and start mentoring them to become future leaders in our activity?

How are we going to recruit these young people? It's not going to be by putting ads in the newspaper or flyers in the grocery store or even in doctors' offices. In order to communicate with them, you'll have to communicate in their world which is texting, Facebook, You Tube, and My Space. Young people don't read the paper version of the newspaper; they read it online (if they read it). Many of them don't listen to the radio; they're listening to iPods, DVDs and CDs. This new world of communication even applies to many 40- and 50-year-olds – the "empty

nesters". So what good does it do to run ads in the newspaper or even put flyers up in grocery stores? Many young people don't go to grocery stores; they go to fast food restaurants!

Avoiding squares with young dancers because they are too rambunctious and rowdy in a square. We are always advertising that square dancing is such fun so why can't they have fun? When I watch the current square dancers, I wonder why they are dancing because they look like they are in pain or having a terrible time; no smiles, no moving to the music; just slowly shuffling around not looking anyone in the eye. Maybe kids would bring fun back to square dancing! Even though these young people are rambunctious and rowdy when they dance together, they always "calm it down" when they dance with us older dancers.

Avoiding squares with same sex couples. It is very unfortunate that people have a problem dancing with same sex couples. If you are a really good square dancer and have learned the correct definition of all the calls, the sex of either side of the couple shouldn't make any difference. Anyone who can dance both sides of the couple is a good dancer. You should be glad that there are dancers who can dance both sides of a couple, as there are many times where if there wasn't a dancer who could do either side; you wouldn't be able to fill a square. In the West Coast area of Florida, there are several women who can dance both positions of a couple, which is very useful. She can fill in anywhere and these women are also very good at ensuring that singles/solos have an opportunity to dance.

Preventing singles and same sex couples from joining clubs and/or associations by having a clause in the bylaws that states "Only male/female couples can join" - I shouldn't have to point out that this is discrimination. This isn't the place to get into any discussion (and I don't want to be a part of any discussion) about who is right or wrong or what anyone's beliefs are, but it's not our place to make that decision. Also, because someone has had the foresight to learn both sides of a couple so that they are able to dance, you are not allowing them to join. Women do it more than men (learning the other position) and sometimes they have another woman they dance with on a steady basis. They shouldn't be barred from joining any club because they have worked out a way to dance and are not sitting because couples don't think to ask them to dance.

Making singles or solos feel unwelcome at a class or dance. 'Singles or solos cannot come to a dance or class without a partner' – don't you think that statement kind of takes the 'friendly' out of square dancing. When singles/solos come to a dance and they are left sitting all night, not getting to dance and no one speaking to them, do you think they'll ever come back? I don't think so! More and more people are waiting later to marry and with the increase in divorces, there are more singles today than there were when square dancing started. Solos are people who are married but for some reason their spouse or life partner is unable to dance. Many of our older dancers are starting to fall into one of these categories. I predict that over the next few years there will be a lot more singles and solos in this activity and we need to acknowledge that and start making them feel welcome. All of the couples are just a heartbeat away from joining them and when you need a partner, you will be glad this situation has changed.

Not letting new dancers chair or serve on committees because they don't know anything about the particular project. Seasoned dancers think they are the only ones that are experts about bylaws, parliamentary procedure and the "ways" of Florida square dancing. The seasoned dancers have to start letting go and letting younger dancers get involved and learn the 'ropes'. Now is the time to start turning things over to the younger dancers; not after you are gone and it's just "dumped" on them. Let's start taking these new dancers under our wing and mentoring them so they can start taking over some of these responsibilities before it's too late. Unfortunately, we aren't being swarmed by young people wanting to become active in the workings of our activity, but when there is one we need to take them under our wing and start mentoring them. I mention this because my daughter is one of these young people and she is on the West Coast Ways & Means Committee, Singles Chairman for the 2011 Florida State Convention and delegate to the Florida Federation and she's only 23. Is she going to be excluded because she is so much younger than the rest of you?

Change is difficult for everyone but we have to face it and go with the flow. Many times change makes things better. We won't know if it will be better until we try it.

As I stated previously, the only thing that is constant is change and there will continue to be change for as long as there are people to come up with new things and ways to do things.

It is counterproductive to get 'up in arms' when a change is suggested or implemented. If we are going to get to these younger people, we are going to have to communicate in their world and accept them on their terms – texting, IPods, jeans, t-shirts and all. Remember, square dancers are supposed to be the friendliest people. When I see these types of behaviors, I wonder what happened to the friendly people.

We need to bring the fun and friendly back to square dancing in order for it to survive!
