President's Message - Florida Callers Association

There is a spirited discussion going on in the FCA about what differentiates an apprentice caller from a fully qualified caller. As I've been involved in this, it's made me kind of step back and ask myself the basic question: what is a caller? The easy answer is a caller is a person who calls a square dance. But as we all know, there really is so much more.

To me a caller is someone who likes our activity so much that they are willing to put in many long hours learning the craft and put in many dollars getting the equipment to perform the craft. Some callers go on to national prominence, others never leave their backyard, yet both are important to the activity.

A caller is an entertainer and a teacher, and must be good at both jobs. Everyone I know began dancing because it was FUN. It is up to the caller to make sure it stays fun. I know some callers who get so hung up on level that they refuse to call for clubs that they feel don't dance well enough. Where's the fun in that? I call for clubs that can dance with the best of them, and I call for clubs with what some would characterize as slightly weaker dancers. I approach both type of dances the same way: what can I do tonight to insure that everyone in the hall has fun.

A caller's role as a teacher may be the most important of all. The teacher's role is not just teaching lessons. It's walking folks through a move or sequence at a dance so that they can succeed. It's the non-verbal things we do to teach etiquette and so much more to the dancers. It may be the most important yet most overlooked part of what separates a caller from a good

or great caller. A caller who does not take the time to learn to teach correctly is doing a disservice to themselves and every dancer they touch. I've been in halls and listened to a supposedly experienced caller teach a move incorrectly. I feel sorry for the dancers when that happens, because they deserve better.

A caller is a leader both on and off the dance floor. A caller is a role model and ambassador for Square Dancing everywhere. A caller, a really good caller, is someone who puts the dancers and their needs ahead of everything else. What could be more important than that?

This E-News release is NOT an endorsement of this event by The ARTS. Our goal is to help "Spread The Word" regarding information of interest to the dance community.

Here is the information:

This conference may be of interest to some. The event is sponsored by Sun Assembly English Country Dancers and Triangle Country Dancers, with support from the Country Dance and Song Society, New Leaders, Good Leaders Fund. The attendees will be mostly contra, English, and traditional squares folks. But as these groups have been better than Modern Western at attracting younger dancers in recent years, there might be some things we can learn from them. There will be at least a few folks from the gender-role-free English Country Dance group in Durham, NC.

The location is a former Episcopal Church camp & conference center. It is a lovely rural location, and the accommodations are comfortable cabins with private bath (i.e. not rustic).

Southeast Dance Leadership Conference: Tools for a Vibrant Dance Community, October 1-3, Haw River State Park, Summit Conference Center, Browns Summit, NC (near Greensboro)

Presenters will be: Diane Silver (NC), Bruce Hamilton (English caller from CA), Shawn Brenneman (VA), Rob Harper (Atlanta), and Tyler Johnson (NC-sound)

The Leadership Conference will be an opportunity to gain tools for growing, nurturing, and sustaining a thriving dance community. It will be a time to network with other organizers, callers, musicians, and dancers from the English, Contra and Square dance communities. Learn about the business of operating a dance, marketing your skills or organization, sound operation, care of a dance floor. Share ideas for dealing with challenges like under- or overattendance, different skill levels and generations, atypical (unexpected) events, getting and keeping help, developing talent, fulfilling your vision and recognizing when it's time to revisit your vision. Southeast Dance Leadership Conference Organizing Tools for Vibrant Dance Communities October 1-3, 2010 Haw River State Park, North Carolina

Southeast Dance Leadership Conference Topics Learning The Lines Starting a Dance:

First things first: crafting your vision. What do you picture your dance series to be like? Next, an overview of what will you need to do to implement your vision. Forms of organization (e.g., non-profit or proprietary small business). Creating interest, finding reliable spaces, connecting with the network of talent. Refining your program. Getting help. Financial and liability considerations. Putting on a dance can be a big and highly rewarding job!

Basics of Volunteer Organizations:

What are the elements required to have a non- profit. Incorporation, non-profit status. How to find and develop board members. Effective committees and committee structure. Responsibilities of directors. Finance and Responsibility: Whether you are part of a non-profit organization, run your own dance, or are a caller or musician, this will introduce you to the business end of the dance community. Basic financial requirements of small entities. Recording and reporting rules. How to manage accounting. Balance and pay. Liability and Insurance: The need or not for insurance.

Getting the Word Out:

Both internal and external communications are critical for smooth operations. What do you need to do to maintain accurate internal communication among the various people helping to put on your dance? Keeping pertinent and up-to-date publicity. How are last minute changes communicated both internally and externally? As a group grows and takes on multiple functions, such as multiple dance series and special events, how do communications needs change?

Operating your Dance:

How to have a well-run venue and happy dancers, talent and workers. Balance and coordination. Having fun without too much work. Happy dancers, happy sounds, happy feet.

Bringing Together Talent:

This session is an opportunity for organizers, callers and musicians to hear each others' perspectives. What are the resources for connecting talent and dance providers? Compensation and usual practices. In addition to money, what else attracts talent? Developing your local talent.

Sound Basics - The Idiot's Guide to Good Sound:

Components of a sound reinforcement system. Hooking it all up. Gain structure & the secret to good sound. Keeping the band and the dancers happy without going crazy.

Sound in Depth:

Hands-on microphone techniques for voices and instruments. Maintaining safe and intelligible levels throughout the hall. Sharpening your mix with equalization. Controlling feedback. Listening exercises.

Live Sound Lab:

Participants in the sound workshops will have an opportunity to run sound themselves (with instructor assistance) at the famous Greensboro Grange. This popular venue has hosted contra dances for many years and was a favorite of caller Gene Hubert. Come experience this historic dance and help bring the magic to life!

Facilities – Ins and Outs:

What do you need to know when talking with hall owners? Use and overuse of floors, booking, operating. Dealing with local school systems, churches, etc. Working with dance floors. The making of a dance floor, how built, how to build and maintain, proper care, systems.

Riding The Waves

Rescuing an Evening:

What to do when things don't go as planned. What to do when the caller or a musician are not up to the task, or are not working well together. Who decides what steps to take.

When the Gears Don't Work:

What happens when there are factions, competing elements. Or what if those responsible don't perform? Growing pains, trials of over-organization.

How to Say "No":

What to do to prevent burnout. Broadening your volunteer base. How to keep your best talent fresh. Maintaining a deep bench. Bringing new organizers on board.

Managing Dancers of Different Skills:

How to have reasonable unity and enjoyment by all. Dancing inclusively. How to satisfy the needs and interests of both inexperienced and inexperienced dancers.

Handling the Unexpected:

How to manage and react when there are incidents on the dance floor, medical emergencies, interference from outsiders, when conflicts manifest. Dealing with difficult people. Who decides, how to decide, and when to intervene, How to be firm yet sensitive.

Dancing The Journey

Marketing Your Vision:

What is your marketing plan? Developing a publicity and outreach plan. Marketing yourself or your group. Having a clear vision for communications.

Four Part Harmony:

What Makes a Great Evening: The Organizer, the Caller, The Musician, the Dancer. Leadership role of the caller and musician. Programming the evening. What makes for a fun dance event. Progression of difficulty; building dance upon dance. Caller-Band relations: what are the elements necessary for bands and callers to be effective together. How to get a seamless performance.

Having a Family Dance:

What are the ingredients needed to have a dance where children can feel comfortable and included? How to serve families with small children. Children and adults together. What models work the best.

Intergenerational Issues and Opportunities Youth vs the Old, Summit of the Ages:

A look across the generations, relating across the span of time and experience. The energy of youth and the wisdom of age. Getting all this to work together.

Leveraging Resources:

Identifying and making the best use of resources. The value of networking with others of similar interest. Coordinated scheduling. What can you gain by working with neighboring dance groups? What does CDSS offer? Leveraging other resources in the community, such as arts councils or schools. Non-profit alliances. Insurance pooling.
