Now about Chuck. Nothing definitive yet. They are still running tests, although he seems to be improving as time goes by. There are several things they have found and are treating, and they are hoping he can come home soon. Maybe all it takes is a brief stay under the watchful eye of someone with the demeanor of Nurse Nasty to make a guy get better and want to go home. I think we may see Chuck out of the hospital before long, but don't think he will be calling any dances real soon. I will keep my eyes open and report on his progress as they tell me.

The Ship is just about to the port!

Are you ready? The ship will be pulling in on Thursday, May 26 for the Trials End Dance at Strawberry Square Dance Center, 4401 Promenade Boulevard, Plant City.

Don't want you to miss out on anything, so below is a list of important information to make this a fun weekend for you.

- Accommodations: The host hotel is the Country Inn and Suites, 4500 Lakeland Park Drive (Exit 33 off I-4), Lakeland. They may be full by now, but the Howard Johnsons, at I-4 and Highway 98, has rooms available at the same convention rate as the Country Inn & Suites.
- Registration: Do you have your ribbon(s) yet? If you don't, they are still available through May 26 at the discounted price of \$27 per person for the entire weekend; they go up to \$30 at the door. Can't dance the entire weekend, well we have "split" prices as follows: Friday only \$12 per person; Friday and Saturday \$25 per person; Saturday and Sunday \$27 per person; Saturday Evening \$12 per person; Sunday only \$12 per person. These split "prices" can only be sold at the convention. Pre-ribbon sales are for the entire weekend. Oh!!! And don't forget to pack your ribbon(s) and badge(s)!
- Attire: Friday night pirate attire or pirate themed square dance clothes; Saturday club colors; and Sunday Mardi Gras costumes or themed square dance clothes. Square dance attire is requested for all evening sessions; casual attire is acceptable during the day.
- Program Booklet: The entire program booklet can be found at <u>http://floridasquaredance.com/convention/57/images/ProgramBookPullout.pdf</u>. You can print it off and start planning your schedule for the weekend!
- New Dancers: Encourage your new dancers to attend; there will be a Mainstream hall, and I've been told there will be some surprises in that room!
- Singles (and any others that would like to join us): Please come to the meet and greet on Skeleton Island. There will be lots of singles/solos at the convention, so come here to meet them. Even if you have a partner, please support this endeavor. There will be squares and rounds.
- Youth: Unfortunately there won't be a separate hall for the youth, but please come join the Singles on Friday night. The Youth Chairman, Jenny Green, has made ribbons with green frogs for dancers to pin on their outfits to indicate you will welcome youth and young adults in your square. As we all know, this is our lifeblood and we have to encourage their participation.
- Pirate Flotilla (Grand March): Participants in the Grand March will include the officers of the Florida Federation, officers of the Florida Callers Association, officers of the Round Dance Council of Florida, officers of each of the regional associations, FASSRD, and Square Dance Campers, four (4) representatives <u>only</u> from each club in club colors and carrying your club banner. Everyone participating in the Flotilla is asked to be at the Opening Ceremonies on the Black Pearl (Plus Hall) at 6:00 p.m. After the ceremonies, all participants will be dismissed to line up for the march on Treasure Island (Mainstream Hall). When you arrive on Treasure Island, please be attentive to the instructions for lining up.
- **Exhibits and Showcase**: Be sure to visit the exhibits and see the Showcase of Ideas exhibit from the Florida Federation which will be on display at the National Convention in Detroit next month.
- Entertainment: There will be entertainment each night on the Black Pearl at 6:30 p.m. Come early so you get a good seat! Friday night will be the Opening Ceremonies;

Saturday night will include a rendition of the National Anthem by Brenda Whitaker, introduction of the current crew, awards and the Pirate Flotilla; and Sunday night will include the introduction of the 58th (2012) Convention Chairmen and their kick-off and invitation.

Polk Chronicles: A Visit To Allen's Historical Café

On the occasion of Polk County's Sesquicentennial (150th) and Auburndale's Centennial (100th) celebrations this year, I thought this article would be of interest to everyone.

Published: Friday, May 20, 2011 at 5:24 p.m. Last Modified: Friday, May 20, 2011 at 5:24 p.m. Fourteen years ago, Polk County lost one of its most unique institutions. In fact, all of Florida did.

There's so much you missed out on if you never had a chance to visit Allen's Historical Cafe in Auburndale. Cracker foods such as catfish, alligator, rattlesnake, frog legs, turtle and swamp cabbage. The wild collection of historical artifacts that covered every surface. The bluegrass music on Thursday nights.

Located at 1387 U.S. 92 W. in Auburndale -- just west of where Bridgers Avenue intersects with the highway -- the barn red, wood-frame building with ALLEN'S in giant white letters across the top was an Auburndale landmark. It had white-painted hitching posts out front -- and if you'd come up on horseback, I doubt Carl Allen would have minded.

Allen's was founded in 1958 by Auburndale native Carl Allen and his wife, Jewell. It started out as a bait and tackle shop, but around 1964 Carl Allen started serving catfish dinners, according to <u>www.dizzyrambler.com</u>, a site created by Carl Chambers, one of Allen's regulars on bluegrass night.

"I had to take my wife all the way to Okeechobee to get a mess of catfish," Chambers' website quotes Allen as saying. "Then one day I got me an idea: I'm goin' down there and bring me back a load, and I'm gonna cook 'em in here. And that's how I got started. I put catfish on the map."

Allen's menu was wild. As in, most of the Cracker delicacies offered were wild animals. Allen hired hunters to bring in a variety of critters including diamondback rattlesnake, soft-shelled turtle, shark and even armadillo.

"I don't know why he started (cooking armadillo), but I think there was a governor at the time who loved armadillo," Jewell Allen told the Associated Press in 1998. "He was just searching for something unusual because we are unusual."

If the restaurant looked a little rustic on the outside, it was nothing compared to the historical feel inside. The walls and ceiling were covered with historical artifacts and antique oddities that Carl Allen started collecting as a young boy in Auburndale. Pictures of old Auburndale. One of the city's old gas street lamps. A variety of cooking implements. The keys and locks to the original county jail in Bartow. A bright green stove. Coca-Cola door handles. It was hard to just sit at one of the homemade wooden tables (each of them covered with pictures and heavy shellacked, made with a treadle sewing machine base) and not go wandering around the restaurant to see what curiosities you might notice this time. And Carl Allen could tell you stories about every one of them.

"I try not to give my customers just another place to eat, but a place where one can reminisce while taking a giant step back into the past," Allen told the Winter Haven News Chief in 1976. And then there was the music. In the 1970s Allen started welcoming local bluegrass musicians to the restaurant to jam together. It soon became a Thursday night tradition, growing so much that Allen added a large music room with a stage and sound system to the back of the restaurant in 1980, the Dizzy Rambler website states.

"There got to be so many pickers sittin' on my tables that I couldn't serve food," the site quotes Allen as saying. "They'd come in and sit down at five o'clock and didn't leave until 11. I don't blame 'em. They'll tell you 'If you don't jam at Allen's, you can't come to Florida.'"

Again, not that Allen minded. He founded the Florida State Bluegrass Championship in the 1970s and personally presided over it for 25 years.

Carl Allen died in March 1996 at age 78. Although the Allens had a lifetime lease on their building, Jewell Allen, then 72, chose to close the doors in May 1998. That July, the more than 7,000 antique collectibles that lined the restaurants walls were sold at the largest auction Polk County had ever seen. It took four days to sell 60 years' worth of collecting.

"It represents the end of an era of old Cracker Florida," Gov. Lawton Chiles, himself a Cracker and cafe regular, told the Associated Press in May 1998. "The cafe had a quality of what old Florida is really about."
