Cory-Ography In The Classroom

THE CALLER WEARS MANY HATS

If you are a caller, going into the schools for the first time, you immediately want to gain acceptance and appreciation. Try not to set any barriers for the students. When teaching in the schools one of the best investments as a caller is to purchase either a wireless hand held or head set microphone. You will learn very quickly why these are essential tools of our trade.

Being on a stage or standing behind a table isolates me from the students. I like to be right there dancing with them or even instructing close beside them. One of the hats that a caller wears in the schools is that of a coach. But in order to teach teamwork effectively, I think the caller should be a team player by taking on more of a role as a quarter back. Get out there, call the shots and be there...and wear a helmet too.

Try not to be too loud...voice and attire. If you are comfortable, the dancers will feel a little more at ease. Humor is always a selling point, but try not to be too much of a comedian. Being hip and cool isn't as important as focusing on being a good entertainer, showman and professional.

Besides being a teacher and a singer you must also take on the duty of being in charge, but not a disciplinarian. That is why the teachers are there in the room with you. Don't let the teachers leave you all alone with the kids or you'll just be hanging yourself. And finally, the most important thing to wear, is a smile. And have fun!

Tips for Your Tips

A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer By Jan Thompson

Whether we look to square dancing for an opportunity to socialize, exercise to music, or challenge our little gray cells, we all want to have FUN!

Squares sometimes break down; that is a fact of square dancing life. However, I believe that having one's square frequently break down detracts from the fun, and it is stressful to feel completely lost in the square. On the other hand, there is a feeling of shared accomplishment and exhilaration when your square successfully finishes a sequence. With this in mind, I will be offering tips in my column to help your confidence and increase your enjoyment on the square dance floor.

The Value of Hands

As Neil Diamond sang: "Hands... touching hands... reaching out... touching me... touching you." Square dancing is a social activity, and the touching of hands constantly reminds us that our square is a team of eight people working together.

- 1. Take care when taking hands. Do not grab, squeeze, or pull. Sometimes a touch is all that is needed. Respect signs such as badges that indicate an injury is present.
- 2. Take hands to establish formation. That will help to keep your lines and waves straight. Clear and neat formations make for easier dancing.
- 3. Touching hands momentarily at the end of all calls helps you to respond more confidently and quickly to the next call by identifying your partner at the moment (especially useful if the next call requires interaction with your partner); recognizing the square's formation and your position in it (in a line or wave, you know instantly where you are a center or end ends touch one hand, centers touch two hands), and allowing dancers who are lost to more easily see the "open spot" an open palm can act as a

signal to an unsure dancer and guide him/her to the correct spot). An outstretched arm and welcoming hand have saved many squares from a breakdown.

- 4. Another hand signal is the pointed finger ("go there"). Use this signal judiciously, when a dancer looks lost or you are certain he/she is headed in the wrong direction.
- 5. Touching hands help you as well as the dancers you touch. Many times a momentary touch helps another dancer feel confident that he/she has executed the call successfully and is in a correct position and among friends.
- 6. Sometimes, it is helpful to momentarily touch hands between the parts of a call. During Load The Boat (a Plus call), the centers touching hands after each of the four parts helps the dancers identify with whom they should do the next part.
- 7. Hand contacts during the execution of a call help to synchronize the dancers involved. During Spin The Top, momentarily forming a wave after the trade helps to synchronize the foursome while helping the dancers identify whether they are now the "casters" or the "Move up-ers." During Spin Chain Thru, the various hand contacts help to synchronize the two halves of the square.
- 8. Taking hands while moving together makes it easier to match your speeds and adjust if necessary, which makes for smoother dancing.
- 9. Know when to let go! For instance, during a Pull By, let go when you begin to pass another dancer so as not to injure him/her.

Happy dancing!

ANGELS – PRO AND CONS

Helpers or "angels" can, on occasion be a great assist to the caller. However, the caller may wish to do entirely without assistance. This should be his prerogative. When it comes right down to the purpose of angels, the object is to make use of competent, experienced dancers, a minimum of three couples at any one class event, to assure that all class members will have an opportunity to dance.

A HELPER IS NOT A TEACHER

His prime function, when filling in a square is to do correctly those things the caller is teaching and to do them in the style the caller is presenting. A helper who talks or tries to instruct, distracts attention away from the designated instructor. A person who yanks, pushes or pulls new dancers in order to get them aimed in the right direction is certainly doing a disservice to the learner. The person at the microphone is in the best position to see where help is needed. Occasionally a word from the helper to the caller or teacher between tips may alert him to something that needs attention.

Those who come to the class ostensibly to help have just the opposite effect when they sit or stand on the side lines talking while the caller is trying to instruct. Many callers will make a definite point of meeting with the helpers before each session. In this way, they can spell out what they want and do not want in the way of assistance.

There may be times when the teacher will, as a representative from the club, say something over the microphone to the new dancers, but this again is his prerogative and he may choose to make all the announcements himself.

While those things we are covering here may fit 90% of the class situations, there are always exceptions. Due to the lack of available, competent, experienced caller leadership in some cases, a brand new caller may be given the teaching assignment and, because of the caller's obvious inexperience, the sponsoring group and the teacher may agree to apportion the work load in different ways. However, it has proven over the years that a single voice at the mike, a well thought out plan of instruction, and definite goals are best achieved when the responsibility is given to an experienced caller/teacher leader.

From the Mail Room

Dear ASD [American Square Dance],

I believe, strongly, that dancers should not be persuaded or put on any kind of a "guilt trip' to move onto higher levels in square dancing. They need to move at their own pace. One of the neatest things our activity has to offer is DBD. Think about it. You're taking the calls you already know and are experimenting and having fun with them from all different formations and positions. This really helps the individual dancers in so many ways. By dancing by definition, I firmly believe that if the dancer ever chooses to move onto Advanced, the pathway will be a lot smoother and the transition not as traumatic. Being rushed into another level means learning a lot more calls. Dancers need to make this decision on their own. Sometimes, they have to learn the hard way. Too many jump into the next level and get discouraged. I wish more callers would teach DBD/APD from the very beginning.

CALLERLAB has a wonderful guideline and advice I'd like to share fro all the readers, dancers and callers alike:

"What Next?"

The CALLERLAB dance program committees want to encourage quality dancing at all CALLERLAB dance programs. The primary impediment to achieving this goal comes from dancers moving through dance programs too quickly.

Each of the CALLERLAB dance program committees recommends that dancers stay and enjoy each program for as long as possible. Moving on is not a recommended way to become proficient at one's current dance program. Also, moving on is not implied nor expected simply because subsequent programs exist.

Please take a look at Recommended Dance Time for CALLERLAB Dance Programs for more information about the recommendations for dance time for CALLERLAB dance programs.

There should be no pressure put on dancers to move from one program to another once they have graduated. Dancers should be encouraged to take their time, enjoy the fun and fellowship, and learn to dance well at that program before moving on to another program."
