



Riverfront Rotary Fountain



The Riverfront Park Rotary Fountain is located on Howard Street at the South entrance to Riverfront Park. It is a popular attraction for beating the summer heat. The kids love it!

The fountain has five stainless steel columns that are 24 feet tall. These support a 30-foot diameter ring containing 40 overhead jets. The jets spray towards the middle of the fountain producing a dome of water and a waterfall in the fountain's center. Eight geysers shoot water upwards. The fountain also has dozens of mist jets, and the five boulders have jets that spray sideways. To conserve water, the fountain water is filtered and re-circulated.

Red Wagon

"The Childhood Express"

Have you ever seen a red wagon this big?

This "larger than life" symbol of childhood is also an interactive sculpture. The handle doubles as a slide! Relax on a park bench and enjoy the beauty of the park while your kids play. Or hey, slide down the handle yourself! (We won't tell anyone...)

Sister Paula Turnbull, a Catholic nun, designed the Garbage Goat in Riverfront Park for Expo '74 as a recycling/environment statement.

This corten steel sculpture of a goat will eat small pieces of trash with the aid of its vacuum digestive system. Don't throw your garbage on the ground, feed it to the Garbage Goat



Tour Train



All aboard...

Take a ride on the Spokane Falls Northern Railway open March - August.

Our tour train makes a 40-minute loop through the park. Enjoy the natural beauty of Riverfront Park and views of the Spokane River from the comfort of your seat.

From those beautiful spacious skies and amber waves of grain of eastern Washington to the purple mountain majesties of the Cascade Range above the fruited plains of central Washington

to the shining Pacific Ocean, Washington State is America and all that it stands for. Its diversity of not only landscape, but of people and their persuasions, speaks so well to our ability as a nation to grow and to change, yet still adhere to the principles this country was founded on. America the Beautiful, thank God for the land of the free.



Washington State's section of the Cascade mountain range includes the prominent peaks of Mount Rainier, Mount Baker, Mount Adams and Mount St. Helens. All are truly awesome to behold and dominate their surroundings for 50 to 100 miles. Mount Rainier, the highest peak in the Cascades, stands at 14,410 feet and Mount St. Helens, an active volcano, blew her top in 1980. The Cascade Mountains are believed by the FBI to be the location where D.B. Cooper parachuted from a Boeing 727, on November 24, 1971 after successfully committing the world's only unresolved air-piracy. The fate of the most audacious outlaw in contemporary American history has never been unquestionably determined.

Tours for the 61st National Square Dance Convention®

Washington State Tour: June 24 – 26, 2012

DAY 1: Depart Spokane at 8:00 AM and travel through Eastern Washington. Learn about its rich agricultural land, the farmers and the crops they grow. Visit the town of Leavenworth patterned after Germany's Bavaria. Experience the scenic Cascade Mountains on the way to Seattle, which are a part of the "Ring of Fire", that notorious formation of old and active volcanoes that circle the Pacific Rim. Dinner is on your own tonight. Upscale shopping is right outside your door. Tour the Seattle Underground including subterranean sidewalks and storefronts created when street levels were raised 8 to 35 feet following a fire in 1889.

DAY 2: Explore the Klondike Gold Rush Museum commemorating the city's role in the gold rush or visit The Museum of Flight that chronicles the history of aerospace technology and its pioneers; free time and lunch on your own at Pike Place Market. A century later, Pike Place Market is internationally recognized as America's premier farmers market. This afternoon visit the landmark Seattle Space Needle. Constructed for the 1962 World's Fair this structure includes a ride to the top for views of the Cascade Mountains, Puget Sound, Olympic Mountains, and greater Seattle area. Tonight escape on a cruise to Blake Island State Park for a Tillicum Village

Evening. As you finish your meal, the lights dim while the myth and magic come to life in the spellbinding performance of Dance on the Wind, featuring dances in the spirit of coastal tribes.

DAY 3: This morning, Ride the Ducks! Seattle's hilarious Coast Guard certified adventure, tour on the ground, then SPLASH into the water to cruise on Lake Union. Lunch is on your own. Travel through Snoqualmie Pass in the Cascade Mountains and return to Spokane late afternoon.

The Seattle Underground City

THE CITY THAT BURNT DOWN AND THEN REBUILT ON TOP OF ITSELF

Beneath the City of Seattle, a thriving metropolis, a modern city, the gateway to Alaska, there exists another world. That is the world of pioneers, the original settlers of Seattle.

In 1851 when Seattle was first settled, the streets were at sea level causing the city to flood quite often. This caused significant damage to the streets. Huge potholes formed in the roads and some were so deep that people actually drowned in them.

When indoor flush toilets were introduced, they became the real rage in Seattle. This added to the dilemma they already had with the flooding. When toilets were flushed, sewage would wash back through the sewer pipes during high tide. Fountains of sewage were forced back out the toilet bowl. Even closing the lid would not stop these mini sewage geysers.

Seattle really was in need of remodeling. That chance came when in 1889, sixty-four blocks of Seattle's business district burnt to the ground. Following the fire, City Management decided to rid the city of the flood problem by building high retaining walls along the streets and filling them in with rubble from the fire, therefore, the streets were at the second level and the sidewalks and store fronts below the streets. At the intersection one would have to climb a ladder at street level, cross the road, and then climb down a ladder to the sidewalk on the other side of the street.

Eventually, the sidewalks were rebuilt at street level so now the store's upper levels became the new entrances. The old sidewalks and old storefronts were still underground, but were forgotten for many decades.

When a gentleman, by the name of Bill Speidel, heard about the guys with the ball and chain demolishing all the old buildings in downtown Seattle, the area that also contained the forgotten "Underground City," he went out and collected 300 signatures to try and preserve

these old historical landmarks. He accomplished this, by conducting a tour of Seattle's Underground City, to show the significance of these buildings to Seattle's history.

It is a legendary story that there is a teller's cage that is still haunted by the ghost of the teller who bought gold from miners returning from Alaska.

The underground has been featured in movie and TV shows, such as Frasier, Scooby Doo, and the most famous of all was the TV movie, "The Night Strangler" starring Darrin McGavin, where it was the major setting.

Bill Speidel's daughter is still conducting tours today. A special night tour, for adults only, tells of the city's seedy past, and the part prostitution and corruption played in securing the city's financial position prior to the fire.



Tours for the 61st National Square Dance Convention[®] Glacier National Park June 24 – 26, 2012

Day 1 Depart Spokane at 8:00 AM and travel across the North Idaho Panhandle learning about the geology, Native Americans, and miners of the Silver Valley. More silver has been mined in this valley than any other location in the world. At Kellogg tour the Crystal Gold Mine, the only authentic 1880's underground gold mine tour in the Northwest; pan for gold and precious gemstones. Next, travel along the banks of Flathead Lake, the largest natural lake in the western United States. Visit Lonesome Dove Ranch for a "down-home" Montana ranch dinner with host and hostess Hal and Sharon. The Forsbeys, a husband and wife duo, will entertain you with true Western music. (Overnight in Kalispell, MT.)

Day 2: One of the most amazing highlights of Glacier National Park is a drive on the Going-tothe-Sun Road. This engineering marvel spans 50 miles through the park's wild interior, winding around mountainsides and treating visitors to some of the best sights in northwest Montana. This is the only road through the Park. Sit back and enjoy the park's spectacular scenery in a historic Red Bus. On clear days, the canvas roofs are rolled back and the buses are transformed into convertibles. Along the way stroll the trail of "The Ancient Cedars" and enjoy lunch and a cruise on glacial-fed St. Mary Lake. Dinner is at Glacier Park Lodge built almost a century ago by the Great Northern Railway. The Blackfeet Indians named the new lodge "Omahkoyis" or "Big Tree Lodge". The immense timbers that support the Lodge were probably 500 to 800 years old when they were cut and all of them retain their bark. There are 60 of them, 36 to 42 inches in diameter and 40 feet long. The timbers in the lobby are Douglas fir; Cedars from Washington support the verandahs. Return to Kalispell for the night. **Day 3:** Tour the Conrad mansion and hear about Charles E. Conrad, a founder of Kalispell. He arrived in the Flathead Valley in 1891, when this lovely town with its tree-lined streets was still but a dream. But Conrad had vision, and he felt that not only had he found a good investment opportunity, but also a permanent home for his descendants. Along with establishing the Kalispell Townsite Company and eventually the Conrad National Bank, he hired Spokane architect, Kirtland Cutter, to build this gracious Victorian home in 1895. In scenic North Idaho, stop at Sandpoint on the banks of Lake Pend Oreille and shop at Cold Water Creek. Arrive in Spokane late afternoon.

Cory-Ography In the Classroom

DIFFERENT LEVELS AND LEARNING STYLES

People learn in different ways. There are many unique ways of teaching square dancing to the different ages of students.

When I have the 1st and 2nd graders, I like to have fun with the music. A cake walk idea is fun to get the children to listen to the music as well as musical chairs. The Hokey Pokey and the Birdie dance are great songs to perform. Don't forget the Bunny Hop and a Simon Says square dance. The child learns to look and listen at this early age and develops rhythm.

Even into the 3rd and 4th grade levels, circle dances and contra (line) dancing is a great way to introduce square dancing. I think 5th and 6th grades are the perfect age to have the kids actually square dancing. But make sure you use a variety of mixers in your program.

The junior high level is the age that Trios, Sicilian Circles and Mini Squares are very appropriate and effective. When teaching at the high schools, try teaching a call three or four different ways. This helps the caller to become a stronger teacher and communicator.

When entering the colleges, make sure that the square dancing program is organized by the schools. CPD is a good method to use. Joe Uebelacker has two great books for callers and teachers to have for use in the schools.

Tips for Your Tips

A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer By Jan Thompson

The Eyes Have It!

Just as hand contact is valuable for comfortable dancing and successful squares, so is eye contact. It also makes dancing more enjoyable.

- 1. Eye contact is social contact. You are dancing with people. Enjoy the smiles of your fellow dancers.
- 2. Keep your head up! See the whole picture, not just your feet. Your feet will carry you where you need to go, whether or not you are looking at them.
- 3. Look at the formation. Use your peripheral vision as well as looking straight ahead. Stay aware of where you are in the formation (center, end, facing in, facing out, left or right side of a couple) Since this is constantly changing, your eyes will always be moving. When you hear a call, identify where you should move and with whom you should interact. Don't just start to wonder.
- 4. Look at the person with whom you are going to interact, whether to pass through or to make hand contact. Make eye contact with him/her. This helps both you and the other dancer. During boys/Girls Trade, for example, dancers look down their wave/line to find the person of the same sex; he/she may be any of the other three people in the wave/line. "Trade The Wave" (a Plus call) is frequently preceded by the helpful reminder "Peek" because it is easier to successfully complete the call when you first see with whom you are going to trade.
- 5. When the caller starts a tip by saying "Bow to your partner, bow to your corner," don't just bow actively note who the people are. During a singer, every time the women move on to their corner, once again take note of your new partner and corner. Ladies: during a singer, your corner will become your new partner after each figure choreography. If the square has a problem, you'll know with whom you should be when the caller says, "Swing your partner." You will return to your original partner before the closer.

7. Be aware of the flow of the dancers in your square. During Four Ladies Chain, for example, an uncertain woman can watch and follow the other women put in their right hands to form a star and turn it halfway.

8. Look for the open spot, especially if you are unsure of where to go. If there is a line of four dancers and a line of three, chances are you should be in that fourth spot.

9. If you are uncertain, look for helpful hand signals (a welcoming open palm, a pointed finger).

10. If you see a "deer in the headlights" look on a fellow dancer, gently assist him/her if you can

11. And don't forget to smile – the other dancers have their eyes on you. Happy dancing!
