

Greetings Parade Participant:

Thank you, again, for agreeing to participate in the James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital's (JAHVH) 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Veterans' Day Parade. It's just a few weeks away. This year the parade route will exit Freedom Lot heading onto Livingston Avenue and enter our hospital campus from Richard Silver Way (back gate) and disband in the Diamond Lot of the main campus. <u>All Floats</u> will disband once passing Haley's Cove-CLC and turn left onto 131<sup>st</sup> street returning to Freedom Lot and <u>all car show participants</u> will turn right onto 131<sup>st</sup> and return to the Richard A. Silver Way Entrance from Bruce B. Downs and enter the Diamond Parking lot area on the main campus.

#### WHAT IS AN "OK" CORRAL AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

### A California festival committee's efforts to bring single/solo dancers back to their weekend event

Harvest Hoedown is a 3-day festival sponsored by the Associated Square Dancers of Superior California and held the weekend containing the fourth Saturday of October each year. Through the years we have seen an increasing number of our single/solo dancers staying away from weekend festivals and our Saturday night hoedowns because they fear not finding a dance partner. Combining the continuing decline in the overall number of dancers with the aging of our dancing population and the cost to attend weekend festivals, the Harvest Hoedown committee decided to try something new to attract more non-partnered dancers to our festival.

In keeping with our "Harvest" and "Barnyard" themes, we decided to call the concept the "OK" Corral. After sharing our idea with our local clubs and representatives to the California Square Dance Council, we started an email outreach campaign with the promotion below:

Are you a single or solo dancer who usually stays home from weekend festivals because you fear you won't find a partner? Are you a dancer who likes to dance every tip but find your regular partner doesn't have quite as much energy? Do you like the challenge of dancing the position opposite your gender (girl dancing "boy" or boy dancing "girl")? Then we have the place for you! In following along with our "Harvest/Barnyard" theme, we are introducing the "OK" Corral where it is "OK" to form a square or join a square without a partner – the idea is that another single/solo/non-partnered-for-that tip dancer will fill in the open spot next to you. This is an area where it will be "OK" for two men or two women to couple up as long as they know the respective roles they are dancing. This is an area where it will be "OK" to kick up your heels and have a great time and meet new friends! There will be a special area set up in both the Plus Hall (The Barn) and the Advanced Hall to encourage more of our "solo" dancers to come out and enjoy a festival and get the opportunity to dance. We will still have our designated "solo" areas where you can sit and meet with other "solos", and we will still have "solo" ribbons available to help you find other "solos" on the dance floor, but even if you haven't had the opportunity to make their acquaintance yet you can do so on the dance floor when you join them for a tip or two. Help us spread the word – hopefully we can make this area a success so that others will try it.

Since we came up with the concept for the "OK" Corral just a few short weeks prior to the festival it was important for us to spread the word quickly. We used email and word of mouth extensively, plus sent the information out to registered attendees with other program updates.

As Advance Registration and General Chairman for Harvest Hoedown, I started seeing an increase in single dancer registrations once the "OK" Corral was announced, plus I got many more calls about it before the weekend ("we hear you are supporting the single dancers this year ... is that true? Oh good, then I'll come").

For the festival itself we put up bright yellow and orange banners designating the "OK" Corral area in the Plus and Advanced halls; did smaller signage and put an explanation of the concept in our dance program/schedule. Once the event got started several people noted that there really weren't any people dancing specifically in the "Corral" area. However, what we DID see were more singles on the floor rather than sitting on the sidelines, and our "OK" dancers were spread throughout the halls. Our featured calling staff (Randy Dougherty, Dan Nordbye and Charlie Robertson) fully supported our efforts by encouraging those solos to get up and fill in squares. One young man was seen on a several occasions standing under the banner and holding up his hand until a partner "found" him. What we found was that we had more singles in attendance, the dancers seemed to welcome them anywhere in the hall, and those singles were not sitting out on the sidelines – they were up dancing!

In general we heard quite a bit of buzz and interest about the concept, with many anxious to see whether or not we felt it would be successful, hoping to take it back to their own clubs or areas to try (including our featured round dance cuers!) All in all our festival committee considered the experiment a success and we plan to continue the promotion next year. Going in we knew it would take time to build, but the concept was embraced, the dancers were open to it and many applauded us for trying something new. For 2012 we are going to keep the large banners as a visual reminder that it's "OK" to square up however and wherever you want, but we won't designate a specific area in the halls as they "un-partnered" dancers were welcomed into squares throughout the hall and we don't want to promote any kind of segregation of our dancers.

Given the level of interest we received about our experiment we decided to share with our experience with others. ### **CALLERLAB Viewpoints**

#### **Smoothness and Dance Mechanics**

**THIS IS DANCING**: Square dancing should be dancing; it's not just "getting through" the figures. The movement calls for a shuffling step. When we walk, the heel hits first. When we dance, the ball of the foot is the first to touch the floor. It's also important to think about how we look. Stand tall. Be proud of how you look when you dance.

Square dancing is also something that we do with other people. It's not a solo activity. The interaction between us is sometimes called "counter dancing". When we turn, we should counterbalance each other. A swing is not two people walking around each other. The swingers should become a single unit. Some have described the interaction as "giving weight". The same is true of hand or arm turns like Allemande Left and Swing Thru.

Another aspect of counter dancing is the way we move to make dancing easier for others in the square. Actions like Separate Around One require the inactive people to move also. In a run, the runner moves into the space the runner came out of and on Ladies Chain, the men should move to their right and start the turn before the ladies get to them.

**COURTESY:** I hope that courtesy is not yet dead in square dancing. If you want to dance with someone, ask them. Don't stand in a square and yell or gesture to them. It's best if you go together as a couple to fill squares and it's not polite to pass a square that needs a couple so that you can dance with your friends in another square.

If you must save a place for a couple that is late getting onto the floor, at least fill that place by separating a couple to put one person in the position you are saving. If you don't want to dance this tip, leave the room if at all possible, so that you don't seem to be refusing to dance with the people who are in the square that needs a couple.

Sometimes it is necessary to leave a square. Never leave because you don't want to dance with people, but you might become ill. If possible, get someone from the sidelines to fill in for you and, certainly explain to the folks you left as soon as possible. It's also nice to applaud the caller's performance and the pleasure of dancing in your square. THEN, thank those who shared this tip with you including the partners.

Some dancers seem to enjoy gimmicks like extra spins and twirls. These are not usually a problem, unless you have new or fragile dancers or folks you don't know in your square. Be careful that your enthusiasm doesn't spoil the dancing for others. Sometimes your eagerness to help others leads you to yank, shove or yell at someone – DON'T. The best way to help is to dance your part of the action absolutely correctly with NO unusual styling.

**TIMING**: One aspect of square dancing is not under your control. Callers call it "timing". The best timing happens when you know what the calls mean and the caller delivers the call just before you need to hear it. When the call comes too late, you have to stop for a beat or two between each action. That gets tiring. When the calls come too soon, you have a tendency to rush to keep up. The dancing then becomes scrambling. Sometimes when the dance pattern is unusual, you need a little more lead time to figure out what you're supposed to do.

All square dance music is based on 8-beat phrases. Your action fits the music best when the caller lets you start each action on the first beat of one of those phrases. Because our actions are not all 8-steps long, you can't get the first beat every time. That would interfere with good timing. But there are a couple of calls where you should always have the first beat. These are Grand Square and an Alamo Balance.

**ACCEPTED STYLES**: There are a few "accepted standards" of styling in square dancing. Sometimes these are so often ignored that they may not seem so accepted, but it's good to know what they are anyway. Most important is that grabbing and tight hand grips are never right.

In a Promenade, the men should have palms up and the women palms down. In arm turns, the forearm hold does not mean "grab the elbow". The palm should be flat against the other person's forearm with the elbows bent to encourage counter dancing.

When in Ocean Waves, a forearm hold is common in many areas. The CALLERLAB recommended style for Waves is hands up at (her) shoulder height, palm to palm. In Canada and most areas outside the U.S., everyone uses the recommended styling for ocean wave actions, including Swing Thru and Spin the Top.

The recommended style for Stars is the "Palm Star" with all elbows bent to touch hands with the fingers pointing up. The exception is a Thar when everyone holds the wrist of the person front of them (CALLED THE "Pack Saddle" hold.)

**CONSIDERATION FOR OTHERS**: There are few calls in square dancing that have become sloppy in execution. Most often the action of the men causes the women to do something uncomfortable. They've done this so much that they often don't even notice. From the stage, every time I call Star Thru, I see most of the women duck to avoid getting a man's elbow in the face. Men should keep the elbow high; and if she's too tall, don't insist on keeping the hands joined.

Another of those troublesome calls is Ferris wheel. The men usually head directly at each other dragging the women behind them. When Don Beck created this call, he described it by saying the couples facing in move straight ahead until they have formed a Two-Faced line in the center. Then they do a Wheel and Deal.

A similar problem occurs in Recycle which was intended to be a Hinge, Fold and Follow action. Often, these days, it seems to be "women reach across and get dragged by the men around the corner. Small wonder that so many women find this an uncomfortable call. **ACCURACY**: My final point is to encourage accuracy in your dancing. This is particularly important in the Basic actions like Runs, Trades and Circulates. A large share of dancing errors occurs with these fundamental actions, even among dancers in the Advanced programs.

In every line, touch hands (and that includes Ocean Waves.)

On the call Run, only the runner changes facing direction. The runnee just moves sideways into the vacated spot.

In Trades, both people turn around – and change places.

In any Circulate, the people facing in walk straight ahead with no turn. Those facing out will always make a turn to face in.

Three-quarter turns are tough. Practice being very precise. Try turning half and a square more. Another technique is to count walls as long as the hall isn't circular. Three good-sized steps will usually work too. Find something that works for you and then try to be accurate every time.

One-quarter turns are tough too. Many people turn too far on Hinges. Try taking just one small step. It's better to turn too little than too much for one-quarter turns.

**DANCE WITH PRIDE**: Square dancing is a wonderful recreation. At its best, it provides both physical and mental exercise, and all the company of some of the nicest people you will ever meet. Please do your part to make it the best it can be!

### All Things Considered

#### What does Graduation Mean – Part 3

In previous months we have examined the lack of knowledge of new graduates and how everyone is graduated, no matter how little they know. We have also looked at how this results in experienced dancers dropping out of the activity due to the frustration of having to pull dancers through after graduation year after year. Last month we looked at the mindset of the club regarding new dancers. Now we will look at how new dancers think.

**CLASS MINDSET**: Dancers in class know they must learn the calls. N At least they know this deep inside. But on the surface they get no reinforcement for this, because club members convey the attitude of: "Don't worry about mistakes – we'll pull you through." So this tells the class members that they don't have to think much about call definition. If they remember how to do a call, fine, but if they don't, so what? Usually class members are never told to review

what they have learned during the week, because the club thinks this will feel like "work", which would then cause people to drop out of class.

There is also a major component lacking in the mind of class members: PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY. I would be devastated if I knew that my lack of knowledge was the cause of seven other dancers breaking down. But this doesn't seem to both today's class members. They just don't seem to care that their lack of knowledge is reducing the fun of other dancers. Perhaps they have never thought about this.

WHAT SHOULD BE DONE: There are several things that clubs can do to improve the situation.

- 1) DO NOT AUTOMATICALLY GRADUATE EVERYONE. Clubs must be willing to not graduate those who cannot meet minimum standards of proficiency. Clubs need to recognize that graduating everyone, no matter how poor a dancer they are, hurts the club by causing long-time members to drift away out of frustration. It can also reduce the number of guests.
- 2) CLUB OFFICERS AND THE CLASS TEACHER MUST AGREE. THE DECISION TO NOT GRADUATE EVERYONE MUST BE DISCUSSED WITH THE CLASS TEACHER before CLASS ever begins, so that everyone is one the same page at graduation time. The minimum standards of proficiency must be agreed upon.
- 3) CLASS MEMBERS MUST BE TOLD AT THE BEGINNING THAT SOME MAY NOT GRADUATE. Explain that there are minimum standards and that some people take longer than others to understand the calls. Explain how graduating people who don't know the calls would hurt the club, and that they will be invited to take the class again. This eliminates the surprise factor. If someone is told to take the class over, they can be reminded of the discussion about this which was held at the start of class. This presentation at the start of class should be made by someone who has good people skills and good command of words, so that at the end of the discussion all the new class members are in agreement that this is a good idea.
- 4) CLASS MEMBERS MUST BE TOLD TO TAKE RESPONSIBILITY. They should be encouraged to review what they have previously learned prior to the latest lesson. Class members need to be reminded that if they break down they are causing other people to break down also, thereby reducing the fun for everyone. If this is presented correctly with the right words, all the class members will see the wisdom in this.

**SUMMARY**: The practice of graduating everyone, no matter how poorly they dance, because "we need their money", or because "it is socially unacceptable not to graduate them", just hurts everyone. It causes frustration in long-time dancers who will simply drift away from the activity. It also causes frustration among class members who work hard to learn the calls only to see the caller and club members cater to those who have not put forth any effort.

The square dance activity needs to stop graduating every person who comes in the door regardless of whether they learn anything. This is simply hurting our activity more than it helps.
