

Moore Thoughts

Were you Ever a KNOTHEAD?

Surely there are still some of you around. You were the folks who loved square dancing, loved a challenge, and were enamored with square dance badges and dangles.

One of the favorite dangles of us diehards (besides the Diehard badge, which could be earned by continuing to dance is over) was the Knothead. We just had to show the world how crazy we were.

A KNOTHEAD DEFINED

Knotheads are popping up all over the country and no one person seems to know for sure where the idea originated. In Bow & Swing, the Florida square dance paper, Editor Harold Emery defines a Florida Knothead thus: "to become a Florida Knothead, you and your partner gather up three other couples who are also non-knotheads and travel in this pre-arranged Square 100 miles or more one way (map mileage to govern between cities and towns) to attend a Club or Open dance given by other Square Dancers. (Festivals, Conventions, Institutes, or Dance Classes do not count. Odd couples do not count.)"

When your square has been arranged, you should take a prepared letter with you, stating thereon the names of dancers, showing from where you came and the name of the town or city to which you travelled. This letter should be certified by President, Secretary, Call or MC. Of the dance you attended and MAILED FROM THAT TOWN. In

some areas of the country there was an additional requirements – you had to return home on the same evening. No fair staying over. (Definition from Sets in Order, October 1956)

Not too long after the Knothead was introduced, a companion badge came along: the Idiot badge, which you earned by going to a caller's house with at least a full square at some really obnoxious hour and forcing him/her to call a tip for you. The several times it happened to me, the dancers also demanded refreshments. By the way we are all still good friends. I think doing foolish things together is one of the best ways for a group to bond.

The creation of new special event badges exploded. Do you have a Grasshopper badge? Dance in the grass. And some grassy areas are not as smooth as greens at the local golf course. Come to think of it, I do not recommend trying to set up a dance on a golf green, unless maybe you go barefoot. And a Barefoot badge is another one you can earn.

However, if dancing in the grass is not for you, you can earn the Tar Baby for dancing on asphalt. Do not try this one in the summer or barefoot. I would recommend wearing older shoes.

How about strange locations: there are badges for dancing on an airplane while it is in flight. I can imagine how TSA would respond to that. Make sure you have bail money for your caller. Or if you can't get a plane that is big enough (I had friends who were cargo masters for the Air Force, so it was no great difficulty to get onto a C130), try to talk the Navy into letting you square up on the flight deck of an aircraft carrier. Be careful, though: it is a long drop from the flight deck to the water. If dealing with the military is out of your range, try dancing in the gondola of a hot air balloon (maybe you could save some money by telling the owner it would not cost so much in fuel because you have a square dance caller with you).

If these are too exotic for you, how about a Crackpot badge for dancing the full square and the caller in a bathroom? Too risqué? Go for a Glow Worm": Dance in the dark with flashlights. Are you hungry? Set up a square at a pizza parlor and get your Pizza badge. I got to call a dance on Boulder Dam (Lake Mead between Nevada and Arizona) and the dancers all earned their Dam Dancer badge. I can think of a handful of dancers who probably deserve a Jail Bird – dancing in a jail cell (no names). Hi-Level Dancer badges go to those who dance at an elevation over 10,000 feet (though the Dancing Bears of Big Bear, California – at 7,200 feet – feel that anyone who can finish a three hour dance with them have earned their Hi-Level Dancer badge).

One of my favorites, both as a dancer and as a caller, is the Purple Heart. This in no way is meant to lessen the value of the military Purple Heart which is awarded to our servicemen. It is intended simply to attest to the pain callers can put dancers through. You need at least four callers: one to call the tip, and three to dance in the square. If the callers in the square do it right, the other dancers will have no idea what happened to them as the callers keep shifting positions. My most memorable Purple Heart tip was one I danced in. Andy Rawlinson, one of the really popular callers of Southern California was on stage. He took one look at our square, but try as he might he could not ignore us. Andy was sharp enough to know that he had to call memorized material or the whole flour would break down. The square consisted of one couple of new dancers, (pretty good ones, or at least good sports), one round dance cuer, one couple where both the man and the women were callers and two more couples with one caller each. Add that up, folks. That is nine dancers. We started straight, but then the cuer cut a caller out. All of a sudden the cuer's partner did half sashay with him and continued to dance. The couple (cuer and his partner, half-sashayed) ended up in an ocean wave with the new dancers. On swing thru, the centers did not finish the call. Nobody can remember what happened next, but at the end of the tip, everyone had their own partners and the square was rotated for the singing call. Poor Andy had to hand the mike over to someone else to finish the tip because he was still laughing too hard.

More on this silly stuff some other time.

Chair Etiquette

I've been to many dances where finding a chair has been difficult even though there are plenty of chairs with nobody in them. How can that be you ask? The problem is that people "save" them by putting items on the seats. Even though they are not using them (they are dancing), they will not allow anybody else [to] use them either. I have been to very few large dances where there are enough chairs for every dancer to sit down all at the same time.

Back in 2011 when the National Convention was in Detroit, Michigan, I had just come from one dance room to another exhausted, needing to rest for a while, and every chair was vacant save for items on the seats. I had to sit on the floor (and eventually I had to get off the floor-no easy feat). So I developed the following Chair Etiquette for Square Dancing.

At dances (especially conventions, dance weekends or special callers), there are often not enough chairs for every dancer. Please note that you do not "own" the chair. Please be considerate and allow the chair to be utilized when you are dancing. Here are some guidelines:

- You may put a jacket or sweater on the back.
- You may sit in a chair with someone else's jack or sweater on the back.
- You may put purses, shoes, drinks, bags, etc. under any chair.
- You may not place items on the seat of any chair.
- You may move any items left on the seats of a chair and place it underneath so you can sit down.

Of course, if there are reasons for needing "that" chair (e.g. you have to be near something, physical limitations, etc.), then it is perfectly acceptable to "save" that chair, but please be considerate of others.

Bow & Swing Editorial Comment

This month I want to talk to callers and dancers about hand holds. I have been to several dances and festivals where someone wants to firmly interlock thumbs. I try and discourage this by politely locking my thumb to the side of my hand and some dancers still try to pry it away and I just will not allow that. Why, because this is a very easy way to get a broken thumb.

Hands up or hands down. Callerlab years ago designated hand up, (I do not know if they have change it or not) and many dancers who have danced up North learned this way. In the South, the majority of us learned hands down. For the most part, both are correct. One of my suggestions is that dancers are shown both ways and then I tell my dancers to go with the flow of the majority of dancers. This is a recreation and it is not worth squabbling in a square over who is right – just have fun.

On the subject of hand holds. Traditionally the man, holds his palm up and makes a nice comfortable platform for the lady to rest her hand on, he does not place this thumb over hers, just leaves a comfortable palm up resting platform.

In lines or circles many times you will right hand palm up, left hand palm down, makes for a nice comfortable arrangement.

When you are asked to "shake" right hands, such as a right and left thru or right and left grand, do not really shake the hand, a gentle touch as you pull by, squeezing hands with rings on can be painful. Be gentle.

Forearm, is not a forearm grip, if you leave your thumb alongside of your index finger and do not wrap it around someone's arm you cannot squeeze or bruise anyone.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Some dancers from Florida participated in this a few years ago and it was not a good experience. Square dancing is probably isn't the type of "talent" they're looking for. They were booed off the stage, rude judges, etc., which is what probably sells the show. It was a very long and arduous process.

In lieu of auditioning, they would be happy to have a group of square dancers in full regalia to dance for the camera for their intro spots, opening/closing credits, filler, etc. This may be more appealing to the groups in the Tampa area, since that's where the audition will be held...next month!

So You Think You Have Learned Everything at Your Dance Level!

So you think you don't need to go through class again? Or you don't need to angel because you already know it all and you don't want to dance with new dancers?

Think about this -

- 1. When you learned to dance, there may have been calls on the Advance list that are now on the Mainstream or Plus list. Do you know how to do them?
- 2. Callerlab sometimes changes the way to do a movement or the definition. Do you know those changes?
- 3. When you were in the labor market, didn't you have to continuously keep current on your skills and knowledge? Why is square dancing any different?

Just to point out a few things that have changed over the years –

- 1. Did you know that a courtesy turn is no longer taught with the woman putting her right arm behind her back? This change was made because if a woman stumbles or falls with her arm behind her back being held by her partner, her shoulder could be dislocated. (See #16 of the *Illustrated Basic and Mainstream Movements of Square Dancing*)
- 2. Did you know that in a courtesy turn, the man holds his left hand up for the lady to place her hand on his with palm down; not in a handshake hold? (See #16 of the *Illustrated Basic and Mainstream Movements of Square Dancing*)
- 3. Did you know that in the promenade position the man's hands are palm up, right forearm over the lady's left arm? Lady's hands are palm down in man's hand (not in a handshake hold). (See #6 of the *Illustrated Basic and Mainstream Movements of Square Dancing*)
- 4. Did you know that Recycle is not a hand hold move? The definition is "Starting formation ocean wave only. The ends of the wave cross fold as the centers of the wave fold in behind the ends and follow them around, then face in to end as two facing couples." no hand holds. This also applies to Linear Cycle. (See #69 of the Illustrated Basic and Mainstream Movements of Square Dancing)

I wonder what else may have changed or you may have forgotten. Perhaps you should come angel a class and find out!
