CALLERLAB Viewpoints

What is B-51?

For many years, CALLERLAB has supported callers and dance organizations using new ways to give the opportunity for non-dancers to join our dance activity. In my recent travels to Oregon, I was introduced to the use of anew dancer program by several callers in the Portland area. Richard Lane has written information about the program that I would love to share. The following excerpts are from Richard's short explanation and if you have additional questions or desire a copy of his short and/or long essay, please contact him at stufftolearn@msn.com.

B-51 is short for Basic 51. CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, has divided the beginning program of Square Dancing into three parts: Basic 1; Basic 2; Mainstream.

Basic 1 and 2 combines for a total of 51 calls from Circle Left/Right to Ferris Wheel. The combination of Basic 1 and 2 (B-51) is a very good and varied program. If the callers take the time to study the possibilities, they should be able to put together a very interesting and challenging dance. It is up to the callers to take the time to familiarize themselves with what the B-51 Program can do. You would be surprised at what can be done with only the first 51 Basics.

There is something that you, the caller, nee3d to keep in mind. B-51 is a self-supporting program, not just a stepping stone to Mainstream. We will talk later about why that is true and necessary. Keep in mind that you (the caller) may find this program a bit limiting and even somewhat boring, but to the dancer this is their program. It's no different than comparing a Mainstream dancer to a Plus dancer. Each program may be considered "limiting" but it is its own program and needs to be treated that way.

Why Is It Necessary?

I believe that the B-51 program is a very important and even necessary program for Square Dancing in general. I know that everyone has his/her own opinion on why dancing numbers are down and what needs to be done to breathe new life into our activity. Many of the ideas are not only valid, but very insightful. I don't know if there is one perfect answer to why we are losing dancers or what can be done to bring Square Dancing back to a point that our numbers are increasing.

Maybe it's a combination of many ideas. Maybe there is no clear answer. I really don't know. If I did, I would not be able to find a hall large enough to hold all of the dancers that would show up at my dances. Wouldn't that be a nice problem to have?

But I do believe this; we need to stop making it so difficult for new dancers. If you remember a while back, Line Dancing was all the rage. I made a lot of money teaching it. I believe that Line Dancing was popular for many reasons. One of the most obvious

reasons was that you could take a lesson and you were a Line Dancer! You didn't have to go through a series of 18, 22, or even 30 weeks of lessons. Our society today has a fast food, microwave mind set. They are too busy to make a commitment to five or six MONTHS of lessons.

In the "old days" Dad went to work and Mom watched the kids. Supper was ready soon after Dad got home. The rest of the night was pretty much open. They had time for Mainstream lessons. For many people today, that scenario just doesn't happen. Both Mom and Dad are working full time (or more) and are tired. It's just a different way of life. We need to adapt and adjust or we could continue to lose potential dancers.

Who Can Use The B-51 Program?

Let me say right up front that I personally believe that most areas could use this program. Look around and honestly evaluate what has been happening to the dancing population over the last several years. For most areas it has declined and some areas to the point of being almost non-existent.

I believe that if any area experiencing loss of clubs and dancers, would start a series of B-51 Clubs, they could quite possibly see a growth in the number of dancers and clubs in a short period of time. The entry point is so much shorter.

I know that many areas are dealing with the same type of loss. It's been happening over the years and will probably continue to happen if we don't make a radical change. That change is an easier entry program, shorter teaching time, and B-51.

How To Get Your Area Involved

Getting your area to buy into this concept is a team effort. Generally, people resist change. For you "seasoned" callers, how long did it take to get Curli-Q off the list? Although it's a pretty looking call, it was very awkward for the women. Some of the long-time callers who had influence in CALLERLAB resisted the change. That's not to say they were wrong. It was their opinion and this is mine. Can you honestly say that you miss calling Curli-Q? Have you even thought about it in the last decade or two?

Change can be good. Change can be hard. But sometimes change is necessary for the betterment or even survival of something such as Square Dancing.

The first thing that is necessary to get the people in your area to begin talking about the B-51 program is to get the callers on board. If they resist it, it will never happen. The callers need to see the importance and necessity of trying a new program that could potentially bring in a lot of new dancers. If your caller is willing to try it, that's step one accomplished.

Next is to get your clubs to understand what this will do for them. Because of the shortened teaching time, you are no longer held to only one class per year. Currently, if you start classes in September and three or four weeks later there is interest in lessons from a group of people, you have to tell them "Sorry, we've already started. We'll call you next year and remind you about lessons then". How do you think that will play out? I'm willing to bet that they are lost forever.

Also, I believe that the greatest new dancer recruitment tool is the new dancers. When they have successfully completed lessons and are now "Official square dancers", they are excited. They want to tell their friends about it and invite them to the next set of lessons. Traditionally, that means graduation in April and then waiting until the next September to get their friends involved. With B-51, they can tell their friends that lessons start next week. No long wait between graduation and start of lessons again. It's an opportunity to keep the momentum going and build your club.

It's The first Night...Now What?

It's really not any different than any other lessons that your club has given. I will just explain how I have handled the first night of lessons and see if you agree.

Here are some ideas that I always try to include in lessons. The very first thing is to educate your Angels on how to treat the new dancers and what NOT to do or say. The Angels have to be told that they need to have empathy for the way the new dancers are feeling scared and nervous. I always have two to four people at the door wearing a big smile and greeting every person who walks in the door. They take them (not just point) to the sign-in table and introduce them to the smiling person standing (not sitting) there. That person will ask them to write their names down and also ask for their email address and/or cell phone number. It is explained to them that these are needed so they can be notified if there is a change or cancellation on a particular night, and assured that they will only be used for that purpose. People are protective of their personal information and should be.

Next, they are introduced to their Angel. This is the person or couple who will be personally assisting them when they need help forming circles, lines or squares. The Angel should not assume that they will know this already. Angel responsibilities include introducing them to other Angels and new dancers to help them feel that they are an important part of the class, and to help them form a bond with other students. Contacting the new dancers following the lesson is very important. It not only shows a genuine concern, but can also be done to answer any questions or to ensure that they have transportation to the next lesson. If that is an issue, they should offer them a ride or help them find transportation. Finally, the Angel should introduce the new dancer or new couple to the caller. Learn their names. The most important word to anyone is their name. Use it and make them feel welcome.

What's Next?

That's really up to you. Are you ready for a change? Are you ready to try something new? Do you NEED to try the B-51? It all depends on your area and your opinion of the dancing in your area. If you have healthy clubs with a large member base, this might not be necessary. But if your clubs are stagnant or even declining in numbers, you might want to seriously consider this program. It really is a lot of fun!

All Things Considered

European Mindset Vs. United States Mindset

The past two months this column has looked at the history of how and why European dancers became so much better at dancing Mainstream and Plus than U.S. dancers. This month we look at the philosophy underlying the approach to dancing that is taken in Europe and the U.S.

EUROPEAN MINDSET (also the mindset of Australia, New Zealand and Japan); "We want to have FUN, and FUN means not braking down. Therefore, we will study the calls hard, understand them thoroughly (ie. Dance by Definition – D.B.D.), and then no caller will be able to break us down."

UNITED STATES MINDSET: (We want to have FUN, and FUN means not doing "work." It is "work" to have to study call definitions. So therefore we will study calls the absolute least amount possible. D.B.D. is "work," so we are not interested in this."

The question is sometimes asked: "Will the U.S. ever adopt the European mindset?" The answer is "No." Why? Because these mindsets are deeply ingrained, and thus they are part of the respective cultures. Europe has seen a full generation grow up with its mindset (Europe has been dancing D.B.D for over 25 years).

It is almost impossible to change the culture of a country. So while isolated dancers in the U.S. may desire to do strong D.B.D. at Mainstream and Plus, they will always be a very small percentage of the total dance population.

WORKSHOPS IN THE U.S.: There are readily available, but they exist primarily to improve dancers' abilities to do calls well from one position. If a caller shows a second position, the dancers are not expected to remember it long term – it is just something to do for one night.

Some workshops in the U.S. are labeled "D.B.D." but this is usually just a marketing gimmick to get dancers to think they will learn a lot. In reality, the caller will "expose" the dancers to a variety of positions, but will not e3xpect the dancers to "understand" the calls, or even expect them to remember what they learned for the future.

Why? Because "understanding" requires "work" and callers know the dancers do not want to "work." In addition, it is rare that all positions of a call will be shown, because these will never be called at open dances – where most everything is done form one position – so why bother?

Actually, dancers in the U.S. like to do workshop, because they are not expected to know anything. Everything will be taught, and they are not expected to remember what they learned the next week. So it is very easy for them to workshop. Some people are permanent "workshop dancers," because to go to a regular dance means they will be expected to know calls.

There are isolated "true D.B.D." workshops in the U.S. but these are generally by invitation for private groups. They have to be by invitation in order to have only those attend who have the interest and ability to handle the material that will be presented. If a D.B.D. workshop is open to everyone, which most have to be in order to pay the hall rent and the caller, it means that too many people will be there who do not have the ability to handle true D.B.D. The result is a watered down event.

SUMMARY: The mindset in Europe is to "understand" calls and be able to do these calls from all positions, and to do this long term for years to come.

The mindset in the U.S. is to know calls from one position. Workshops may "expose" dancers to various positions, but long-term understanding is not expected.
