The National Square Dance Convention

What is this National Convention?

The National Square Dance Convention[®] is a convening or gathering of a large number of dedicated square dancers, round dancers, Contra dancers, cloggers, folk dancers, country western dancers, calls, cuers, leaders, organizational officers, and suppliers, at a convenient location for the purpose of discussing common objectives, exchanging ideas, trying out new techniques and dancing together. All aspects of the total square dance movement are normally present at the national Square Dance Convention[®].

Who puts this convention together and makes it work?

Without question, the National Square Dance Convention[®] is one of the largest, most successful gatherings anywhere in the world. The most awesome and unbelievable fact to sophisticated, professional convention planners is – the 4-day convention is planned and conducted by amateurs and volunteers who devote thousands of hours just for the

love of the recreation. It is a Labor of Love. When you see a committee member, or any worker at the convention, take time to shake their hand and say thank you for making this possible.

Is it expensive?

Let me answer by asking, where can you go dance for four days and nights to the best callers in the world except at the National Convention? Space does not allow listing of all the great callers, but some of the more frequent names of our top callers like Marshall Flippo, Ken Bower, Jerry Story, Gary Shoemake, Tony Oxendine, Wade Driver and so many, many more that give of their time and talent to entertain us. We get to dance with the stars of tomorrow such as Justin Russell, Hunter Keller and Ashley Parker. Obviously most of us cannot dance for 12 hours a day, so take advantage of the many educational seminars that are offered. USDA will be holding several seminars during the convention. Stroll through the "Showcase of Ideas" and see what other states are doing. And, of course, there is the ever popular Fashion Show, Sewing Clinic and many other activities besides destroying your feet. By the way, First Aid stations are available for foot blisters and other health problems if needed. If you are not already danced out by 10pm, there are other parties so you dance a little longer. USDA is also hosting a couple of those. Friday night we have an after party featuring the Ghost Riders Band and the Saturday night we sponsor the Youth After Party. This is worth attending just to see the fun the young people are having. Their enthusiasm just might rub off on you, but I am pretty sure their energy will not. But they have a great time and I love watching them. And let me also mention the vendors that attend have all the latest square dance apparel, accessories, badges, pins, that are so hard to find except at the conventions.

The National Square Dance also gives us the opportunity to broaden our horizons by visiting parts of our country. I never planned on visiting Spokane or Oklahoma City, but because of the convention I went to both and loved it. I was quite impressed with each and am so glad I got to visit them. The convention committee preplans tours, but there are a lot of areas you may want to visit on your own. And if you are participating in the *USDA Travelers Program* you might be able to pickup state or two while traveling to and from the convention as we[II] as the convention state.

What is the outlook for future conventions?

Let's take a look at where we have been. In the past 62 years 906,144 dancers have attended a National Square Dance Convention. The first National Square Dance convention was held in 1952 in Riverside, CA with an att4endance of 6500. In 1976, 25 years later, the convention was held in Anaheim, CA and had grown to a record crowd of 39,796 attendees. That is the largest gathering of square dancers under one roof ever recorded. A fact that will probably never be repeated. Move on another 25 years and we again find the convention in Anaheim, but with only 13, 011 dancers. That was in 2001 and the last year with a convention attendance in 5 figures. The first 3 years of the convention ranged from 5000 to 6500, while the last three conventions have ranged from 3737 to 5545. In 62 years we seem to have come full circle and we're back where we started. In the last 12 years we have averaged 6598, but during the past six years that average has dropped to 5111. Bring that down to the last three years and we are averaging only 4489. Does that answer your question?

The National Squa4e Dance Convention should be the highlight of the year for any square dancer. Anything you ever wanted in square dancing can be found at the convention. Square dancing in general is down, but there are plenty of dancers not taking advantage of the greatest show on earth. If the convention is to survive and continue in future years we must take care of it now.

Little Rock, the site of this years convention, is pretty centrally located and easily reached from most anywhere in the country. If you have not already made plans to attend I encourage you to do so now. Not only will you have the time of your life, but we need you. Isn't it a great feeling to be needed?

Rock-N-Little Rock Convention Facts You Need to Know

Live music, we've got live music. Each evening in the main arena "The Ghost Riders Square Dance Band" will provide the music for a continuous line-up of callers. The Ghost Riders Band is a live band from California. They have playing for square dance groups and conventions since 1972 and have been featured at fourteen national square dance conventions. Mainstream only while the Ghost Riders are on stage.

Contra dancers will have a musical treat each evening. Three nights, three different bands will provide the music. All groups are from the Little Rock area and will add to this fun way of dancing.

What do you want to dance? With 135 square dance callers, 72 round dance cuers, 13 contra callers, 5 clogging instructors and several country western/line dance leaders they will keep all eight dance floors moving throughout the convention.

Try something new while in Little Rock. Introduction to Clogging on Thursday & Friday, 12:00 – 12:50 PM.

Wood flooring will cover all rooms with carpeting. Concrete floors will be polished and sealed for smoother dancing.

There will be several Grab & Go food kiosks inside the State House Convention Center. Depending on the time of day will depend on the type of food. There will also be Lunch and Dinner Buffet food for a sit down meal inside the convention center. The \$13 price will include the meal, drink and dessert.

BID SESSION for the 67th National Square Dance convention will take place of Friday morning, June 27, from 9:00 – 10:30am in the Robinson Music Hall. If you have never attended a Bid Session this is the year to attend. The Missouri Federation of Square and round Dance Clubs will make their bid for this 2018 convention. Their Bid committee will present information about their city's ability to provide us with the things needed to host convention of our size. The Bid Committee has 20 minutes to show us that they can provide Convention facilities with adequate dance halls, hotel rooms, restaurant facilities, transportation, RV/camping facilities, tour and tourist destinations, and other amenities that will be needed by the dancers.

Following this presentation the NEC Member will have a 10 minute question and answer period with the Bid Committee. Then, later on Friday afternoon, the Bid Committee, their city delegates, mayor, or marketing representatives will meet with the NEC to review the finer points of the presentation, ask and

answer additional questions. And then, during the Closing Ceremony on Saturday afternoon, the decision on where the 67th Convention will be held will be announced. It is very interesting and when more than one bid is placed, it can become very exciting.

There are so many things to see and learn. There will be a Sew-N-Save with many new ideas for our wardrobe, besides the give-a-way items. Did you order your 63rd National Square Dance Convention[®] Cookbook? It is more than just a cookbook. Check out some of the interesting recipes like Hummingbird juice, or just the story about some "Burned Biscuits".
