From the Editor...



I occasionally find it necessary to explain the layout of the DANCERgram and how I do things. It's that time again!

When I receive new information on a dance, festival, or convention, it is listed under Looking Ahead as soon as I receive it. It is then moved to either the 2014, 2015, 2016, or 2017 chronological list of dances, which can be found at www.dancergram.com under Looking Ahead on the menu bar down

the left side of the screen.

The dances I include on my lists are local dances (the West Coast Association area), Florida regional dances, Florida State Conventions, national conventions, all the state conventions I can find information on, international dances, and special dance weeks and weekends that our local callers and/or cuers are scheduled at. The <u>only</u> cruise I list is the Paul Place Memorial Cruise, which is a fundraiser for the Paul Place Memorial Scholarship for Pride Callers School.

All West Coast Association Membership Dances, SCCA Student Balls, the West Coast Association annual charity dance, West Coast Association Fall Fun Fest, the state conventions and meetings are highlighted at the beginning of the newsletter about three to four weeks prior to the date. The week of the dance, all West Coast area dances and the state convention are again listed under "What's Happening This Week?" I also list events at Pride RV in Maggie Valley, and the schedules for Strawberry Travelers and Hitch-N-Go square dance camping groups as several dancers in the West Coast Association area attend these dances.

If I were to include the 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017 list of dances with the newsletter, I would have about a 50-page document to email out each week.

When I receive new information on classes, workshops, or clinics, it is added to the newsletter under "West Coast Classes and Workshops, National Caller and Cuer Colleges". This list contains information for our area as well as regional, state, and national classes that I think would be of interest to the dancers in the West Coast Association area. Square and round dance classes remain on the list until three weeks after the start date and they are removed since we don't take new class members after the first three weeks. The caller and cuer colleges remain on the list until after their week is completed.

All new dance and class information is highlighted in yellow so you can easily scroll down and just find the updated information.

Under "Health & Sympathy" in the newsletter, I only list information on callers (and spouses), cuers (and spouse), prompters (and spouses), West Coast Association past and present officers, Florida Federation past and present officers and Florida regional association officers. I occasionally also include information on vendors we know, and out-of-state callers or cuers who work in Florida. This information is in the newsletter for one issue and then is moved to the Health & Sympathy list on the website. If I receive information on dancers, it is listed under Health & Sympathy on the website. This information remains on the list for two weeks.

The intended audience for the DANCERgram is the West Coast Association area, however, over the years I have received requests from dancers in other parts of Florida and Canada. My original plan was that each club would print off two or three copies of each issue of the DANCERgram and put them out at your dances on the flyer table. I have only been to one dance where they do this. My distribution list is around 1,000 people. Some of the people of my list then forward it on to people on their distribution lists.

The DANCERgram newsletter and the DANCERgram website are really companion documents. If you want to know if something is scheduled on a certain date, you need to go to the website and check the chronological list. However, keep in mind that the dates on the chronological list are just special dances; regular club dances are not included on those lists. Again, I am trying to keep the lists at a manageable size. I maintain a master calendar, that isn't published, where I have every regular dance and other special dances in Florida listed. This is what I work from each week as I prepare the new issue. Please remember, the information is only as good as what you send me. If you don't send me the information, it may not get listed. I am unable to attend everyone's dances on a regular basis so many times the only way I will receive the information is if you send it to me.

You will also find many of the flyers on the DANCERgram website; separated by West Coast Association dances and other dances. The DANCERgram website shares space with another organization so we don't have room to post every single theme dance flyer.

The entries listed below are for callers, cuers, West Coast Association officers and representatives and other Florida associations and Federation officers and any others who are well known to the Florida square and round dance community. For all you campers or wanna-be campers, here is some great information from Vinnie & Lorraine Piecora, our Directors of Camping.



And I quote from their email: "There are 2 campgrounds not far from the Lakeland

Convention Center. One is the Carefree Lakeland RV Resort. It is not part of the Carefree RV Resorts which is a nationwide company. They are in the midst of some upgrading to their pool and the main clubhouse which will not affect your stay with them. They have given us a "special" convention rate again year for only \$20.00 per night. (Their normal rate starts at \$38.00 per night.) This includes full hookups with 30 and 50 Amps. They have 231 sites plus cabins and rental units, many of which are tree shaded and they can accommodate even some super sized rigs. They do not include cable for short term stays. They do have WiFi. I suggest you go to www.carefreervresorts.com/re-parks/florida/lakeland for more complete information. This resort is about 6 to 7 miles from the Convention Center. They are also a Passport America Park.

The second park is Sanlan RV Resort. This is a larger campground with over 500 sites but very little shade. They do include cable and WiFi but charge extra per night for each pet. Their rates start at about \$38.00 per night but they do not offer any discount for the convention goers or for Passport America members. They are about 5 miles from the Convention Center. See www.sanlan.com for more information. Although this park is more modern than the Lakeland RV Resort, the upgrades being done at Lakeland RV Resort will make it comparable to the Sanlan, in my opinion,

Recruiting New Dancers

This information was developed by the Education Committee of the United Square Dancers of America, Inc. and will provide a brief summary of just a few of the topics concerning the recruiting of new dancers. These same recruiting techniques apply to square, round, contra, clogging, and other folk dance clubs. Leadership Education material can also be printed directly from USDA website at www.usda.org.

INTRODUCTION

Recruiting new dancers is a never-ending task within the square dance movement. Square dancing is a great form of entertainment, therapy and exercise. It is also a great equalizer, as there are no income, education or culture barriers. PhD's dance along side of clerks, mechanics, engineers, sanitation workers, small town folk, city dwellers, politicians, world travelers, dentists, ministers all looking for the same thing fun, fellowship, entertainment and relaxation in a friendly, family atmosphere. No one is too old or too young to join in for an evening of square dance fun and fellowship.

How do we find new prospective dancers? How do we approach them? How do we persuade them that square dancing is the hobby for them? WE RECRUIT, RECRUIT!

RECRUITING PLANS

To conduct a successful and prosperous recruiting program, a club must design and develop their recruiting plans and guidelines well in advance. Their plans should consider class dates and schedules, length of class sessions, class size, class fees, class facilities, caller, angels or club helpers, attire, training materials, handouts, literature, interaction and interface with the club members and the club activities, class publicity and promotion, and club member support and involvement with the class. Educate the club members (recruiters) by developing an information sheet that provides answers to questions that will most likely be asked by the new prospects. These information sheets should include data about the club as well as the total square dance activity.

RERUITING METHODS

Personal Contact: the most successful method of recruiting new dancers. Solicit your friends, family members, acquaintances, business associates, etc. Encourage these potentials to bring their friends. Transport your prospects to the early lessons until they establish a rapport with our students.

Exhibitions/Demonstrations: Perform square dance exhibitions or demonstrations at shopping centers, malls, fairs, community events, church events, etc. Be sure to present a colorful, fun and friendly atmosphere to the spectators. Wear proper square dance attire. Involve the spectators, if possible, to demonstrate how easy it is and how much fun can be experienced in just a short time. Pass out flyers regarding your club and its class information.

Party/Benefit Dance: Offer to sponsor a Western Square Dance Party for a church group, civic organizations or business group. Sponsor a Benefit Dance for a charitable cause that is open to the public. Demonstrate the club dancing and then involve the spectators, to let them taste the fun and fellowship that goes with square dancing. This recruiting method offers the potential of signing up a complete group of prospects at one time for the lessons.

Advertise: Design, develop and distribute posters and flyers advertising your class plans. Place flyers in malls, stores, community bulletin boards, Chamber of Commerce, Welcome Centers, Welcome Wagons, Community Service Centers, waiting rooms, business officers, etc. Advertise via electronic billboards and the community service features of local radio and TV stations. Advertise and publicize by writing club, class, square dance articles for local newspapers and local square dance publications. Build a dynamic=, live dancing club square dance flat for use in various community parades and pass out flyers along the route.

Recruiting Tools: Flyers depicting all the pertinent information can be passed out at exhibitions, malls, dances, placed in publications or news media, placed on bulletin boards or stacked in convenient places for people to pick up. Homemade or special made posters may be placed in high visibility areas in malls, centers, stores, bulletin boards, etc. Handouts may be made and distributed person to person, which will also spark conversation and an opportunity to meet potential dancers one on one. Invitations may be developed and sent to prospects or to previous dancers that have dropped out of the dance activity.

R4ECRUITING PROCESS

Preparation: Preparation is essential for a successful recruiting program. Recruiters should be a near expert about the club, class plans square dance movement on a local and national scale, and should be knowledgeable regarding costs, methods of payment, schedule, location and other class details. Recruiters should have flyers, posters, handouts and other attractive material available for distribution.

Personal Contact: Promote the square dance activity as a wonderful source of wholesome entertainment, exercise and an opportunity of gr4eat fun and fellowship. Sell the "club" concept, its members and its activities to the prospects. Promote the class lessons as an inexpensive evening out on the town, with the finest people, learning something new while exercising.

Follow through: Off to pick up your prospects and take them to the first few lessons. Meet with your prospects for a light snack before or after class. Call prospects immediately if they are absent from class. Keep your "recruits" under your surveillance until they mingle with their classmates and have become a solid member of the class. Keep fanning the spark until it glows and burst into a full flame!

Drop Out?....NEVER!!!

The next time you get discouraged in any square dance class or workshop tip remember this true story. SMILE, and TRY, TRY AGAIN!

Dorothy Surratt is proof that to be a good square dancer one must first be a good listener.

She has been square dancing for three years and blind for 17 years.

But her lack of sight has not been a problem, she says, although when she first decided to take square dance classes, she wondered if her classmates and the instructor might feel uncomfortable with a blind student in the class.

But Eddie Fulps, the caller at the Southside YMCA where she took lessons, told her, "I'm game if you are.'

She and her husband, J. B. Surratt, took the 20 weeks of lessons and now are regular members of the Texas Twirlers Square Dance club and the Cowtown Cloggers. 'I just can't say enough good things about how much I enjoy it (square dancing)," she said. "It's the most fun thing I've done in years."

She says she and her husband decided to take the lessons because they had been looking for an activity they could do together.

The idea of making that activity square dancing was spurred one night when they were around a group of square dancers and decided they also liked the costumes square dancers wear.

"I enjoy the quality of the social contacts we make in square dancing," Mrs. Surratt said, "but I also like the opportunity it affords me as a blind person."

She's looking for some round dancing lessons and wants to be a good clogger as well. She thinks her blindness may turn out to be an advantage in those activities, too.
