It only costs \$6 per person to be a member of the West Coast Association and one of the benefits of membership is FREE attendance at approximately seven membership dances in the West Coast Association area. Submitting articles to the *Dancer* and the *Bow & Swing*, our state publication, is FREE; listing your dances and classes in the *Dancer* is FREE and for a mere \$15 a year, you can also list your dances and classes in the *Bow & Swing*¹.

And of course, don't forget the internet! I can't tell you how many inquiries I receive asking for information on classes and dances in the state of Florida. If your club has a website, please be sure to keep it updated! If you don't have a website, I suggest you contact Bruce Morgan at brucemorgan@embarqmail.com and he will help you set up a website for a very nominal price.

There is also the DANCERgram where you can list your dances and classes for FREE. All that I ask is that you provide current and up-to-date information on your dances. I don't have a very good feeling when I find out weeks later that a club has folded or didn't dance through the summer or were closed on a holiday and I wasn't notified. My goal with the DANCERgram is to provide you, the dancer, with current and relative information about square and round dancing on the west coast of Florida. I am unable to attend all the dances so I have to depend on club and county representatives to provide me with this information.

Let's all work together to promote square and round dancing! Take advantage of advertising opportunities, talk to your friends and family about how much fun you have dancing and let them know about new dancer lessons. Think about the terminology you use; someone not familiar with square dancing has no idea what Mainstream and Plus is and they don't understand the language of square dancing. And, just putting your advertising out at the dances and in square dance publications, isn't going to get you new dancers! You need to advertise in papers, local businesses, etc.

Together we can make a difference!

ARTS-DANCE - NEWSLETTER September - 2014

Message From Our Chairman -

Summer is passing quickly and those people whose clubs start square dance lessons in the Fall are starting to plan for their recruitment drives. This idea is much the same as 40 years ago and the lack of change is part of the challenges that face square dancing in 2014. Those of us who love this activity need to develop new ways of reaching potential dancers and advertising lessons.

Many dancers, myself included, are excited about the ARTS Dance current project to find a marketing company to help re-image square dancing. This project is a good idea, but it will not, by itself, cause hordes of new dancers to flock to our lessons and clubs. **ARTS** Dance has а fine website, you2candance.com which has good videos to show Square, Round, and Contra dancing to members of the general public in order to help change their attitudes about our activity. A website or a reimaging campaign will only help attract new dancers if we, the current dancing public, change our methods of advertising. How many clubs still put flyers on the local stores or think of buying a newspaper ad? How many of the existing dancers think first (or even second or third) about using social media? Younger people use social media to communicate. If they have a question, they look for the answer on the internet. If we do not put advertising for our activity on the internet, we will not find and attract younger dancers Do you have a Facebook account? I do not, yet. I do know that more dancers and callers are trying to put messages about square dancing on social media.

From what I have learned from a speaker at the past CALLERLAB convention, if you put a message on Facebook, it can be transmitted to your friends and then to their friends if you make the post sound fun and interesting. This is free advertising which we can use throughout the whole year to interest potential dancers. Then when a person gets an invitation or a flyer for a hoedown, open house, or new dancer dance they might be ready to try it. If each person tries to learn how to post to one of the available social media sites, we can help to get information about our beloved

activity to members of the public who are not involved. I noticed a course in Social Media listed in the catalog of a local college. Those of us with grandchildren can enlist their help in learning how to post items. ARTS Dance held its annual meeting on Sunday, June 29, 2014 following the National SD Convention in Little Rock Arkansas. In addition to representatives of the associations that form the ARTS Governing Board, there were 21 guests attending. This is the highest number of visitors we have had. In addition to the Old and New business, there was a presentation by Scott & Shawn Brown and Lisa Minton, who are callers from the Pittsburg area of Pennsylvania. They have developed a new teaching method that uses the name of "Modern Pattern Dancing". It combines the simplicity and excitement of Contra dancing with the smoothness and versatility of Modern Square Dancing. They have posted videos on Craigslist and You Tube. They are using social media and have been pleased with their results.

Michael Streby is creating commercials for TV. These will be 30 seconds long and will promote the benefits of the activity. He plans to air these on National television on a channel being introduced on DISH & Verizon FIOS. Initial cost estimate is \$10 per spot. He was given permission to include a link to you2candance.com in the commercials. Michael has posted much of his previous work on Facebook.

In conclusion, there are several people who are working on different ideas to promote Square, Round and Contra dancing. Their efforts are exciting, but we need more people to spread the word. Learn how to post a video on You Tube. Learn to Tweet or start a Facebook page. Help to spread the word about our wonderful activity.

Re-Imaging - (What The Heck Is That?)

Rebranding or "Re-Imaging" is a process where the positive perception of an activity or product is improved. The process has been used successfully numerous times for a wide variety of products and activities. As we all know, square dancing is a fun, healthy, social activity, and a good image needs to be marketed to non-dancers if the activity is to grow.

Several months ago The ARTS established a working group to begin the process of Re-Imaging square dance. Jim & Judy Taylor agreed to lead this group. They have presented reports on the progress of the work to several groups including the National Square Dance Convention and the USAWest convention. A large number of dancers have agreed to help with the many jobs to be done.

Major tasks include creating a logo and slogan which will become the nationally recognized identity of square dancing. This is known as brand recognition. The next step is to start using the "brand" in a national marketing campaign.

A. Develop a logo and slogan - establish a "Brand": Use a professional re-imaging company to develop a recognizable and marketable brand identifying who we are and developing the image we want to present to the general public

B. Make the new "brand" work: Send word to clubs about the campaign; ask them to start using the logo slogan, emphasizing repetitiveness and national marketing.

C. Raise funds for marketing by implementing various fund raising strategies and methods.

D. Start a national marketing campaign. Determine the best media including social media. Encourage all clubs to use the new "Brand" on all their marketing. Including the following:

- Create 10, 30 & 60 second video spots
- Create 60 second videos for U-tube release.
- Create print media for publication.
- Encourage use of the "Brand " on all web sites

Message From Re-Image Committee -

"At the ARTS meeting after the 63rd NSDC in Little Rock, the Re-Imaging Square Dancing project was discussed, and tentative approval to hire a Re-Imaging company was given, pending investigation of legal issues.

The survey to about 1200 dancers produced some interesting replies. About 160 people indicated they were willing to help and left their name & email. We have sent a list of jobs to those people, asking them to indicate what jobs they would be able to do and to indicate their preference. We have received some responses. These jobs range from help with online resources, help with administration, and other important issues. New Idea For Teaching New Dancers -

The basic idea of the proposed teaching system is to provide the opportunity to continuously publicize new dancer classes and allow new dancers to join a class at any time throughout the year. A participating

club will need a cadre of knowledgeable and capable "Narrators." These "Narrators" need to be experienced dancers who will show/demonstrate/teach new dancers the moves which can be taught using one or two couples. The caller will be in charge of the class and will be the "Instructor" to review, teach, and call all moves. Using provide the caller will review/practice and dancing for all moves, including those previously introduced by the "Narrators." The Nest teaching system is being tried in a couple of locations. None of these locations have enough experience at this time for a meaningful report on the program. For information contact Dale Bennett at: dale@the-nest.us.
