CALLERLAB Viewpoints

Booking a Caller

Far too often I see or hear of an uncomfortable situation involving the hiring of a caller for a dance or a dance event such as a festival or convention. Upon investigation of these situations, I have found that the majority of problems are due to a lack of proper communication between the caller and the hiring entity. I really don't know if that is due to: 1) a lack of knowledge as to what is expected; 2) intentional subterfuge; or 3) sloppy business practices. None of the above is a justifiable reason for failure of a calling contract to be executed.

CALLERLAB has available for download on its website a "Caller/Club Confirmation Agreement" that covers all (except in extremely unusual situations) salient points of the contractual agreement between both parties. It is detailed and all inclusive regarding what is to be expected by both caller and club (or organization). Most of the time, any problem that might arise happens prior to the execution of this contract.

One of our primary means of communication these days is email. Almost everyone has an email address and most of the time; callers are first approached as to their availability and fee using email. Several problems can (and do) arise from this practice:

- 1. Once the date, time, fee, etc. are agreed to, one or both sides neglect to follow through on a written contract. Even though the email is considered a legal contractual arrangement, it rarely includes all of the details of the agreement. Therefore, a potential problem arises at the outset.
- 2. During negotiations, one or both parties are slow to respond. Maybe the club is talking with more than one caller or maybe the caller is waiting for a better deal elsewhere.
- 3. It is very easy to be misunderstood when conversing via email. Ninety-nine percent of all phone calls are free, so I strongly recommend that you use a phone call to finalize a deal.

Once the deal is reached, I implore you to use the standard calling contract to finalize the transaction. There is a place on this contract for special considerations. If you wish to have a cancellation clause added, I suggest you put it in this area. There is always that possibility that either the caller will have to cancel due to illness or some other viable reason, or that the event will have to be canceled or rescheduled. There should be some time limit for that to happen and a listing of recourse in the event it does happen. There should be no misunderstanding about this. Later on is not the time for "He said/she said".

Many times, after I have agreed to the details of a contract, the hiring entity will email me a copy of the contract. The proper procedure at that point is to:

- 1. Download the contract
- 2. Check it carefully before signing it
- 3. Sign and date the contract

4. Either mail the signed contract back to the hiring entity or scan it into your computer and email it back to the hiring entity. Either way, both of you should now have a hard copy of the contract.

Please understand that contract law in this country is just about the strongest law on the books and should be treated as such.

As to the emotional, cultural, and philosophical aspects there is no end to the complaints. Similar to "buyer's remorse" I hear clubs complain that they are paying too much and I hear callers complain that they booked for so little. Get over it guys! Decide BEFORE you sign the contract if it is a price you can live with. Once it is signed, it is too late to renegotiate (unless both parties are agreeable). To go back later and say "oops, I just found out I can't pay that much" is totally unacceptable. This is another good reason for the cancellation clause being included in special considerations.

Another scenario that occurs quite frequently is the change of officers or change of booking agents. If an officer of an organization makes a commitment to a caller for a certain fee, in my opinion, the new officer is bound to honor that contract. This is a good reason to stipulate this possibility in the "special considerations" area of the contract. Being aware of this possibility can save a great deal of headaches and hard feelings down the road. I very strongly request that all square dance organizations be aware of any standing commitments (in detail).

In summation, I would love to be able to say that the blame for the misunderstandings and subsequent hard feelings of mishandled contracts lies with one party more than the other, but I cannot do that since a lack of attention and due diligence lies both with the caller and the booking entity. The only thing that will prevent problems is communication. "Say what you mean and mean what you say!"

Square Dance Styling Final Part

As discussed in my previous articles, square dance styling, square dance styling is all about comfortably moving from one-call-to-the next and avoiding broken squares. It is usually the absence of proper styling that causes dancers to get rough, squares to fail, folks to become discouraged, and the secret cause of many good people leaving the activity.

Breaking down in squares is no fun, but it's not the "end of the world". Sometimes even the smoothest dancers break down in squares and YOU may have experienced a square break down yourself. Styling technique number four – WHAT TO DO WHEN SQUARES BREAK DOWN.

First, remain calm. Most squares can easily get back to dancing within a few seconds so there is no reason to panic or become agitated. In fact, the panic dancers are often the ones who are roughest, putting on

hands and pushing people around. If you have a panic dancer in your square, take a moment with them AT THE END OF THE TIP to share this with them.

Second, remain quiet. Using a hand gesture (be careful) will indicate to your fellow dancers what you want to happen and is more effective than trying to talk over the caller. You may not realize that audio learners (see previous article) cannot take any amount of talking in the square as it creates a block to hearing the caller. Dancers with hearing aides are similarly disadvantaged by people talking in a square. Sometimes the first hand gesture needs to be "shh".

Third, KEEP MOVING, quietly and calmly toward facing lines of four dancers, boy-girl-boy-girl also known as "normal" position. In my opinion, moving towards "normal" lines facing the side walls with ANY partner is the easiest to remember and quickest to execute. I encourage dancers in my groups to use their hands in large sweeping motions to indicate to their square mates how the line should be formed. Only once dancer in a leadership role is needed to make facing lines, but every dancer needs to be on board.

Once you've created facing lines, stop and watch the other squares that are still in motion for the moment they are in facing lines too, then jump back into the dance. Though you may not end up with your original partner, it's better to be square dancing than square standing. Caller take note, a good caller will be watching for this action and will bring the other squares back to lines so the broken square can start moving again with the call "lines go up and back".

Teaching proper styling is NOT AN OPTION and is not limited to the caller's lesson plans. In fact, many experienced dancers will show a newer dancer how to do a fancy twirl or bump so we need every dancer to understand proper square dance styling AND to share that information with others. Go back to my previous three parts on this topic, re-read it so you can share it. Watach, bookmark and share our video series on the internet. Secret Hints for Dancing Load The Boat

If Load the boat is going to break down, it will be due to the centers. The reason is that the initial Pass Thru in the center is too big. This happens because the dancers take two full steps after passing shoulders in the Pass Thru.

The result is the center box is now so big that people lose their orientation, which causes the square to break down. Or, if the square does not break down, it takes too long to finish the call, which means the square is now behind the other squares on the floor.

SECRET HINT: The centers Pass Thru must be VERY SHORT. In other words, after the centers pass right shoulders in doing the initial Pass Thru, they must IMMEDIATELY turn their back on the flagpole center of the square.

As a caller, how do I get them to do this? By painting a visual picture of what should happen. I say these specific words: "You must stay very close to the person with whom you are doing the Pass Thru. This means the material on your sleeve should be in constant contact with the material on the other person's sleeve – during the "turn out" par and also during the Partner Trade."

I also tell them that they are too far apart if any daylight can be seen between their shoulder and the other person's shoulder during the "turn out" and the Partner Trade."

Then as a joke, but also to paint the visual picture, I say: "Think of it as a no-hands Yellow Rock." Dancers will often treat this as a fun thing and start bumping each other intentionally, but it means they have gotten the idea.

I have found that these three visual pictures: material on the sleeves, no daylight and the Yellow Rock, get the job done.

If you are a dancer helping out a Plus class, and the caller does not emphasize this ideaof being very close in the center, be sure and tell people what has been mentioned here. You will be helping them a great deal.

NOTE: Sometimes the centers, after the initial Pass Thru, will face in (instead of out) and then slide sideways. This puts them in the correct position, but they have made two mistakes to get there. I have seen this done by people who have been dancing for years.

For some reason, it is always the girls who do this, never the boys. Perhas it is a psychological thing that girls do not want to turn their back on someone.

If a person is doing this, they need to be corrected right away, because if they keep doing this for a long time it will be very difficult for them to break the habit later. If they encounter a caller at a workshop who starts fractionalizing the center part, they will break down the square. It also means that anyone seeing them dance this way will think they are a poor dancer.

If you are a dancer helping out in a Plus class, and you see someone doing this, be sure to say something to that person during the break. The action is so subtle that the caller may miss seeing it while calling.

WHAT TO TELL THE OUTSIDES: They have the easy part – just pass 3 people and face in. The only thing they may do wrong is go too slow. If this happens, tell them to speed up.
