CALLERLAB VIEWPOINTS

Social Justice on the Dance Floor

Pamela Bailis brings up some very important points that should be on every caller, cuer, and dance leaders mind as they put on dances and participate in dance related events. Being inclusive in our dancing and socializing gives more people the opportunity to really enjoy this wonderful activity we all share and love.

Social Justice concerns equity and fair access, in many areas of our lives, including dancing. Creating caring communities of dancers wherever we dance, in class or at club dances, should be a major focus for social justice on the dance floor.

Social Justice on the dance floor implies that callers (at dances and in classes), class coordinators, club officials, and we dancers interact and work collaboratively, as "team-players" to insure that all dancers are engaged and included. Yes, "it takes a village" to support all of the players in our sport and to promote and insure the longevity and joy we all experience as dancers. It's about inclusiveness, building strong connections and bonds between us, and creating collegiality and compassion amongst all of us.

I would like to suggest that callers and club officials at all classes and dances take responsibility for setting the context for social justice on the dance floor. This would mean that announcements include reminders about:

- Pre-setting up squares is discouraged
- Sensitivity to including new dancers (graduates) who are ready to dance at the level of the dance
- Maintaining a solo dancers rotation
- Perhaps rotating plus and mainstream tips
- Share your partners
- Reminders about this are on-going and included regularly in club newsletters
- Truly welcoming all of us, as family, at all of our dances.

This isn't a big deal to do. It would mean that callers set the context at the beginning of each dance reminding all of us dancers that everyone should help make sure that everyone dances. Many couples have partners who don't want to dance every tip. Partners could dance with a solo person just once or split a tip. Also, having a place to meet (with a large, readable sign) for solo dancers is a good idea. This is usually done at large festivals and National Conventions.

It has come to our attention (again) that many club and non-club dancers prefer to dance exclusively with one another. Other couples (even experienced dancers) are excluded from their pre-set squares. Dancing with your friends and club members is fine and fun...but not for

every single tip. This practice is socially unjust, unkind and does not support social justice on the dance floor. Please save a tip or more for other folks who are visiting your dances.

Another area of social in-justice concerns folks walking out of squares when other dancers enter. This practice is selfish, inconsiderate and unkind. Would any of us like to that happen to us?

All dancers should be welcome, with or without partners. It would be everyone's responsibility to make sure that all dancers actually dance. I realize that many dancers from the same club prefer to only dance with one another. This practice is irresponsible, unprofessional, and demonstrates exclusivity. Many folks, including experienced dancers, are often left out.

This issue of solo dancers is important for many reasons. Many couples break up, or one partner is ill or dies. Should that mean that the other partner doesn't dance? Often times it's difficult to find a partner before a convention or a dance. Should folks stay home and NOT dance? In addition, there are many solo men and women who begin classes without a partner as a fun, social activity, but end up dropping out or reluctant to continue because they don't have a regular partner. Solo dancers should not be discriminated against. It's not some disease or handicap. Many folks will find themselves without a partner sooner or later. We, as a group of caring professionals, callers, educators, and dancers should embrace all folks who continue to dance — with or without a partner. Our sport will flourish if everyone is included and not excluded because of a loss of a partner.

One important strategy is for gals to learn the man's part, and vice versa. This would also help a lot, and should be encouraged (vs. discouraged) by class callers or class coordinators. Another strategy for including all dancers is to split or share the tip. Solo dancers can trade off, some doing the first part of the tip (pattern part) and others doing the second (singing) part of the tip. Also I've seen dancers "share" a tip by one person or one couple "jumping in and out" as appropriate. All of these work well, when given much support and reinforcement by callers and class instructors, practicing social justice on the dance floor.

I make these suggestions to keep our sport healthy, alive, and flourish. Not just surviving, but THRIVING! We don't want to lose caners who don't have regular partners or couples who feel excluded. It's up to all of us to take action and prevent this from happening. "It takes a village..." All of us interacting together to form a collaborative community of caring and responsive dancers...committed to forging pathways to Social Justice on the Dance Floor!

Breaking Records

The Reminiscing and Nostalgia Side of Square Dancing

(Little Things Mean A lot)

I know a lot of callers who enjoy calling in the retirement homes, nursing centers, assisted living communities and retirement villages. Some of these callers go in to perform demo dances while some even call Wheelchair Square Dances for the residents who live in these facilities. I've been fortunate enough to have been employed in the therapeutic activities departments in personal care homes for 20 years now, and I can honestly say that Square Dancing, to the senior audiences in these communities, goes far beyond just a music and dance therapy session.

I started calling Wheelchair Square Dancing in these homes and centers when my square dancing grandfather's own Parkinson 's disease reached its advanced stages, back in around 1991. My grandmother would go in with me, and as I called the dances, she maneuvered my grandfather in his wheelchair with some of the other volunteers and residents. Just like old times, I was calling and my grandparents were dancing to me.

There were smiles everywhere lighting the room.

As I was recently rooting through Christmas decorations, which were packed into the eves of my house, I stumbled onto some flyers, videos and notes I had collected in the early 90's when I first became interested in Handicapable Square Dancing, I found a note that I had written way back in 1995, at one of these dances. I apparently was talking, and I guess interviewing several little old ladies about The Square Dancing Days of Yesteryear. The thing that blew my mind was that I was recently calling in a nursing home and a little old man wheeled up to me, after one of the dancing tips, and told me almost the same kind of story. Fortunately, I wrote his talkings down as well. Just comparing these two stories, written 20 years apart, was mind-boggling to me. Most of us love square dancing for the exercise and fun of it. But square dancing, to these folks, is much deeper, more emotional and quite personal.

Millie, age 98, resident

Summer of 1995

I was talking with this little old lady, and quite the lady she is, named Miss Millie. She used to be a school teacher and all her children referred to her as "Miss Millie". We began talking

about square dancing, and three of her table buddies (these good folks all sit at the same table for breakfast, lunch and supper every day) go in on the conversation. I immediately had to talk to these golden girls after I set down the microphone because during the first tip, they were singing, smiling, clapping and nearly dancing out of their wheelchairs. This caught my attention right away, and I just knew there had to be a good story.

Milled was all dressed up, and had on her best 'rouge', as she filled me in to why her cheeks were so jolly red. She and her buddies all had their hair styled that morning at the beauty salon in the home. They all told me they had to get their hair done because of it being 'square dance night in the hall' (the dance was actually held at 2:00pm in the afternoon). I complimented them all on how nice they looked, as one of the gals referred to their attire as their "Sunday's Best". (I was barely 23 years young and just learned about rouge, Sunday's Best and also the 1920's slang The Bees Knees).

Millie's comrades, Ethel and Lily, filled min a little bit more about why they were all so decked out for just a Square Dance activity at their retirement home. "You see," said Lil, "Millie met her husband at a square dance way back before WWII in an old grange hall." As my posture straightened out, I told them "I'm all ears". Lily continued with "Ethel met her hubby at a barn dance and Ruby over there, who's sound asleep, met her spouse at a 4H Dance as well. No one had any money back during the Great Depression, so we all had to get a little creative for our entertainment. Square Dancing was such great fun, during such a gloomy period of time."

Ethel added, "We would often pay the callers and their bands with homemade cooking, lodging or by throwing a few pennies in their tip jars. These guys needed the money, we all did back then, but THEY truly did it for their love of music and dance." I asked Ethel if she met her husband at a square dance as well as the others and she replied, "Are you kidding? Ralph had two left feet and couldn't carry a tune in a bucket. I was a music teacher and he was the janitor at the same school. That's how we met. We both thoroughly loved music, I would often play our piano and all of my kids would sing along, but Ralph...oh, how I loved him...was a tone-deaf son-of-a\$%#@, so he hummed along to everything. He would have absolutely have loved to see all of this square dancing with all of those old-time songs you are singing. You are rekindling a lot of good old memories."

The activities director told me, after the next tip, that 'a bunch of these folks met their significant others at some kind of a square or barn dance back in the day.' She also informed me that 'they get all done up hoping to meet some more boys their own ages at these square dances'. She told me that these ladies will be talking about you and this square dance for months, or until you come back again.'

I will be perfectly blunt, my eyes were like Niagara Falls. How absolutely beautiful. "All of these memories took them back into the midst of time to a square dance, of all things."

There were smiles everywhere lighting the room.

Fast forward to the present day, a few months ago. I'm calling a wheelchair square dance at a nursing center at a summer patriotic themed picnic they were throwing in mid-summer for the residents, staff, family and friends of their community. A little old man, followed by a little old lady, drove their little scooters up to my calling table.

Bob, 88 & Mary, 85, both residents

August 2016

"Young man!," bellowed bob, as I thought I was in some kind of trouble because his eyes were watering nearing his approach. "I haven't heard that song" Sentimental Journey in years! How in the world did you know THAT was my absolute favorite song? I asked my wife to marry me after the war was over, and that song was playing on the radio in my car when I got down on my knee."

I stuttered a bit and said to him, "I sure hope you liked it, sir." He nearly wheeled over my toes and then reaches out and puts me in a firm bear hug and yells, "LIKE IT? I LOVED IT!!! I can just see my wife dancing up in heaven right now. You're a good old boy, ain't ya? Your pappy raised you right, son." He lets me loose from his big squeeze and points his finger at me, and with that Robert DeNiro face he exclaims, "Sentimental Journey at a square dance! Ha! You know I'm not going to get that song out of my head for a week now!" He turns away, shaking his head, and singing the words to himself as he peels out.

The little old lady trailing Bob on her little moped scooter comes up to me, next in line and requests a song. "Do you happen to know Beautiful Brown Eyes?" I said, "Yes, I have it right here. Would you like to hear it? I will call it for the next tip." Mary is her name and she tells me that her husband used to sing that tune to her all the time. I informed her that my version would not be a waltz, which they apparently used to dance in their living room after her kids all grew up and moved out. She looked a little bit bummed with me.

After the next tip and 'Brown Eyes' was my singing call (I kid you not) she waddles and wobbles back up to me and said, "Do you like making old people cry? Because you are really good at it!" Which sounded like a bust to my chops, was actually a very well-paid compliment, after the activities director filled me in. The administrator actually came over to me and said, "Do you realize that this program you offer is far more than just a square dance? This reminiscing program has a lot of layers and levels to it." This boss was in her late 40's or early 50's and she then told me after the dance, as I was packing up my equipment, that "this music and dance program was, without a doubt, the most uniquely entertaining activity I have ever seen." She'd been in this field ever since she was old enough to work back ion her teenage days and was absolutely floored with resident reaction and responses to Wheelchair Square Dancing.

And, there were smiles everywhere lighting the room.

I love square dancing namely for the fun and fellowship...and the choreography. Square Dancing now opens up some doors to great memories and lets me revisit my grandparents who are up there dancing on Cloud 9 somewhere. I'll call some choreo and remember what my pap

liked to hear, or call "Double Bogey Blues" and recall how much my golfing Granny loved that singing call.

These good folks, I mentioned in this article, were truly touched by something much more powerful than just a song and a dance. If you ever get a chance to dance for any of the shutins, please think about these few paragraphs. Ask them some good questions besides, "How are you doing?" or "Did you like that last dance?"

I have learned so much over the years in our activity, especially that "little things REALLY DO mean a lot."

The future Of The National Convention

In recent years the National has seen a sharp decline in attendance. Much of this can be blamed on the reduced number of dancers. But other factors, such as high hotel rates and the desire of many dancers to attend a weekend with a few well-known callers instead of a large event, have also had an effect.

For the first time in history, no city has bid to host a National. 2020 has no sponsoring city. The Executive Committee of the National, in an effort to save the Convention, has decided to run the Convention itself in Spokane, Washington. Naturally, the Executive Committee will not want to do this every year. So how is the National to survive if cities do not want to bid? Here is a solution.

- 1. Eliminate the idea that the dancers of a particular region will bid and run the Convention. It is too much work for too few dancers. No one area is likely to want to commit the time and effort involved, given the reduced number of dancers everywhere.
- 2. The National Executive Committee will select the city, based on where it can find the best financial arrangements, while also making an effort to move the event geographically around the country.
- 3. Committee chairmen will be selected nationally from those who volunteer. The Education Chairman might be from Massachusetts, the Program Chairman could live in North Carolina, the Registration Chairman could live in Texas, the business Chairman could live in Oregon, and so on.

There is absolutely no reason why everyone has to live in the same region as the event, given the ease of communication these days. Communication with the convention center and hotels can be done by phone and email. Committee chairmen and their staffs can communicate the same way.

4. Committee chairmen and their staffs can stay in office for multiple years, as long as they do a good job. Staff people would report to their respective committee chairman, and committee chairmen would report to the National Executive Committee.

This will eliminate the unnecessary situation of reinventing the wheel every year. No wonder every National has problems in various areas — new people with no experience are doing the job every year. Having permanent committee chairmen will result in their gaining valuable experience that will then be carried forward to future Nationals.

5. The number of people involved in running the National is larger than necessary. The 2012 National had about 170 people involved in its operation, while the 2015 National had about 140 people. With efficient committee chairmen and their staffs remaining for multiple years, there is no reason why the number of people running the National can not be reduced by 50%.

The best people from the entire country would be selected, not just those from a small area. As they gain more and more experience, the number of support staff needed for each committee would be reduced, because each person would be operating with more knowledge and thus more efficiency.

Summary: Is this a drastic change from the present? Yes. But it would result in greater efficiency put forth by fewer people. This is a change that must be done if the National Convention is to survive.
