CALLING FOR NEW DANCERS

Folks entering a new activity whether it's sports or social clubs, all face similar challenges. First there is mastering the skills necessary to participate at even an entry level, then there is adapting (fitting in) with the other participants. Beginner square dancers, in my opinion, face a more daunting challenge compared with other recreations because our entry program requires many months of progressive learning. Progressive learning is like a jug of water that gets more and more liquid added in every class. There is no way to skip any section of class and still be in the program. The grind of continually having new material introduced can be softened by encouragement from their peers and dancer angels who have already mastered the necessary skills. Furthermore, if a student has a "bad" week where nothing seems to go right but is followed by a "good" week, the beginner is apt to continue. Consecutive "bad:" weeks will drive anyone out of the class.

Probably one of he most important moments in a beginner square dancer's life occurs at their first open "new dancer" dance. This is the event that either shows the new dancer that they have learned the necessary skills and are feeling encouraged to continue in lessons or the experience goes poorly with the beginner dancer subsequently becoming an ex-dancer.

In a class setting where you have hours to spend with the group and weeks of recurring sessions, the caller/teacher has the opportunity to build a rapport with the dancers but an open dance setting is very different. "New dancer hoedowns", "new dancer halls", "halfway dances", etc. – the students find themselves in a strange hall, dancing with people they've never met, and probably a parade of callers they've never heard. This is where a skilled caller can move the beginner past these challenges, raise their self-confidence of new dancers through the roof and create a positive tipping point where the new dancers are convinced they've made the correct decision in choosing to square dance.'

Calling a dance for new dancers is the mot difficult and rewarding enterprise a caller will face. It requires an understanding of what is happening on the dance floor beyond trying to sight call to their corner. For the caller working with new dancers they've never met, here are some thoughts to consider along with tips for success.

- 1. Your voice is different from what the new dancers are accustomed. Different gender, accent, annunciation. Project your voice to the back of the hall and clearly enunciate your calls. "Voice Notes article in the November 2016 issue talks more about this topic.
- 2. Your terminology may be different from the new dancer's teacher. Can the dancers easily understand "Gents Star Right" versus "Boys Star Right" or "Men Star Right"? From

an ocean wave, will "Centers Trade" work as well as "Boys Trade" or "Men Trade"? If dancers don't succeed, even if the caller is using technically correct terms, then it is still an over-all fail. Dancers have to win, so watch how dancers respond to your calls and choose your terms carefully.

- 3. Your style of patter calling may be something like: "Heads Square Thru in the middle, in the middle four hands round to the tune of the fiddle and a Right & Left Thru" but the new dancers may be accustomed to simple commands like: "Heads Square Thru ... Right Left Thru". Your filler words may be a distraction to the new dancer so it's a good idea to omit them and even prompt your calls in this setting.
- 4. Stay away from anything that might be even the slightest offensive. This includes scolding dancers, pointing out their inadequacies, negative comments about their caller, club, or angels. Yellow Rocks this gimmick is out-of-touch with today's sensibilities, especially if you have young ladies being commanded to get hugged by strange men. Yellow Rocks are offensive to more people than you may know.
- 5. Be careful with music choices, especially for patter calling. Music with vocals in the background will create a cluttered sound for new dancers, making it difficult to discern your calls from everything else playing. Fiddles and saxophones in the music will also create distractions for the dancers. Choose simple music with a clear beat so the dancers will feel like they are dancing. When it comes to singing calls, choose songs with happy lyrics that everyone, including kids, will be comfortable with.
- 6. The new dancers may not know everything they are supposed to know so use calls that are well within their dancer's experience. For example, if the hall labeled "Mainstream", but it's for dancers currently in class, then chose calls limited to other "Basics" list. You will find calls that everyone is comfortable with while avoiding accidentally using a call they may have just learned but not have mastered. "Basics" when used with great variety creates great new dancer dancers. Next month's article will focus on using "Basics" for a new dancer dance.
- 7. Every one of the students already has a teacher. The guest caller should be entertaining, letting them practice their new found dance skills while having the time of their life. Avoid calling anything that would "test" their skills as it is inappropriate for the guest caller to be an examiner. If you are a novice caller, please use memorized patterns that are easy for the new dancers. This is not the time to practice your sight calling skills. It is the time for dancers to win as close to 100% of the time, as possible.

When new dancers are able to dance the calls smoothly in time with the music then they feel like dancers, not just students. Keynote Address by Eric Henerlau Presented at the 66th National Square Dance Convention, Cincinnati, Ohio

- Partner with your local callers and callers association. If there are any restrictions on how your organizations can work together, remove the restrictions. Have dancers and callers serve together in organizations that promote square dancing. Form a tight teamwork relationship with your club caller. If you don't have a club caller, enlist local callers whom you respect. Solicit their advice. Listen to the issues they see from their side of the microphone. Most callers have a vested interest in attracting and retaining dancers. They can see what works and what needs improvement, even if it's not popular or goes against tradition. Be open to suggestions, and then partner together to create solutions.
- Involve the club caller financially. Structure the caller's compensation to have some
 correlation with dance attendance. This makes the caller have a reason to attract as
 many people as possible to classes and dances. He or she is more motivated to teach
 and calling ways that retain the most dancers. Callers should take an active role in the
 club's marketing efforts.
- Run more than one class per year. Running only one class each year is not very effective. The non-dancing public expects multiple entry points to any recreational activity. It's very bad PR to tell a person interested in learning that he or she must wait 9, 10, or 11 months before another class will be offered. It's highly unlikely that person will return. Many groups have redesigned their teaching program and are successfully running multiple beginner classes each year. Experiment with multiple entry points and overlap the classes to allow the club members and new dancers to mix.
- Use technology. Technology is available in multiple dorms to help you grow square dancing. If you are uncomfortable or unfamiliar with the variety of technologies in use, find someone in your group who can step in and do some of the work. Often the caller can help out as he or she may be using the various tools.
 - Website. If your club's website is out of date, have someone volunteer to keep it updated. It's a bad sign to visit a club's homepage to find out about all the dances coming up in 2006...If you don'thave a website, get one! They cost from \$0 to \$1000, depending on how robust you want it. Several companies offer free websites and website tools in exchange for advertising on the side. The club's on the homepage should be designed for the non-dancing public. When a visitor lands on the homepage, the site should communicate the social and fun aspects of the club, along with when the next class will start. All other club information and business can be on other parts of the site. The homepage is the most critical for a new prospect.
 - o Facebook. Keep your Facebook page up to date with current and relevant club activities. Facebook and your club's website are the public's perception of who

- you are. Anyone considering joining your class or club will visit the website and Facebook pages first make sure they are attractive and inviting.
- Email distribution lists. Use email group lists for communications within your club. Be clear, and concise with club communications so that everyone is fully informed. These emails strengthen social bonding. Your web hosting service may provide email groups; if not, Yahoo and Google both provide this service for free.
- O Google phone number. Get a unique phone number for your club that you can give out to people. Google offers phone numbers for free, and you can have any incoming call to that number redirected to a person who is designated to receive it. This allows the leadership in a club to change while still keeping the same club phone number. It also keeps personal phone numbers private.
- Twitter/Snapchat/Instagram. You can use these to send out news and pictures about the club, club events, and recent activities.
- Free or near-free online services. Use Craigslist, local "patch" news sites, meetup, com, etc.
- Groupon. Living Social and other web-based coupons. Some clubs have had success in using promotional coupons through the Internet. Explore this avenue to see if it may work for your club.
- Prospects database. Once you get a person who is interested in learning to square dance, capture that person's name/email/city and phone number and put it in a database (spreadsheet or document). Use an email processing tool to send out email invitations to your prospects for upcoming classes.
- Ads and keywords. Both Google and Facebook have abilities to promote your classes when people use certain keywords to search. Look for keywords that someone might enter that would make that person a square dance prospect. Bid on and buy those keywords, so that when a person enters them, your ad is displayed on the sidebar.

Finally, the most important thing you can do to grow your club; have the right attitude!

• The number one key to success: Attitude. A club that truly wants to grow will find a way to grow. The members will generate enthusiasm that is infectious. People want to be around people who are happy and having fun. Capture that attitude and do whatever is necessary to bring people in the door. Some groups say they want a class but then can't get enough beginners to justify it. Other clubs run successful classes and grow. What's the difference between these groups? ATTITUDE! Those groups who are excited and happy about coming to a dance create an energy that attracts others. They exude fun and friendliness that make others happy. They don't have to remember to smile – they are already smiling!

Summary:

So, what's right with square dancing. Every person might have a different way that square dancing appeals to him or her:

- Social activity with friends
- Community
- Exercise
- Mental stimulation, brain exercise

Respite from the anxiety in the world today

There are so many ways square dancing is the right activity right now. We all know that people would love this activity if they tried it. The call for action is now. Get the whole club involved. Make it fun. Seek out and find success stories from other clubs and callers. There is a wealth of information on the internet on marketing ideas; however, resources are useless without action. Inspire and motivate your club to take action. Keep emphasizing all he reasons why square dancing is right for everyone. Your classes will be more successful, your club will grow, and square dancing will continue to be the best entertainment for people all over the world.

All Things Considered

The Rest of the Story

You may have heard that the 2017 National Square Dance Convention in Cincinnati set a new Guinness World Record of the world's largest square dance. This means the number of people dancing at one time to one caller. Here is the rest of the story.

The previous Guinness record was set about 15 years ago in Riverside, California, with slightly more than 1,000 people dancing to a caller. I am told that this year in Cincinnati there were 207 squares dancing to one caller, which is 1,656 dancers. So Cincinnati claims it has set a new record. But is this the true record? No. It is only the Guinness record.

The true record was set at the 1981 National Convention in Seattle, Washington. At that convention 10,000 peopled dance in the University of Washington football stadium to a single caller. An aerial photo was taken of the event, and thus photo has been widely circulated (see page 44 of the October issue). If you want a copy of the photo, send me a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Did he people in charge of the National in Cincinnati know about the Settle record? Yes. The chairman couple was notified at least six weeks ahead, and I sent them a copy of the photo. So why did they proceed? No one knows.

According to an article in American Square Dance Magazine in 1981, Guinness was notified in 1981 of the record set in Seattle. But Guinness never accepted the results. Guinness has a variety of rules that people must follow when seeking to establish a record for its book, and obviously it felt that Seattle did not follow its rules.

I have heard that Guinness has been contacted by someone and set a picture of the Seattle even, saying that the photo proves that the Cincinnati "record should not recognized. It should be noted that if you to a Barnes & Noble and look at either he 2017 or 2018 edition of he Guinness World Records, square dancing does not even appear as a category. The old Guinness

record from California does not show, so it is logical to assume that this new "record" will not show in subsequent editions either.

Bottom line: Even if the Cincinnati event is shown in a future edition of Guinness, you now know he real story. The true record is 10,000 dancers and was set in 1981 in Seattle.

No matter the reason, the caller must first and foremost entertain. The dancers are there to enjoy the fun of the activity, the social camaraderie and you as the caller are the grease in the wheel that makes the machine run smooth or seize-up.

Many variables in presentation must be considered. Remember, it is not just a single bracket (tip) you are presenting; but yourself, and your future in this business. Some of the variables include tings that you alone control and can improve upon, like your level of ability, your voice, your choreography, and music choices. Others that you cannot control must be considered and factored into the entertainment experience. These could include such things as dancer ability, age of group being entertained location variables such as acoustics, set up, stage calling or floor calling, other callers on the program, and the list goes on.

In all of this, they key is preparation. A Prepared Presentation Prospers the Professional Person. Being prepared and delivering with a flair that engages, informs, challenges, but most of all entertains an audience is a learned ability. There is no such thing as a natural showman. The natural showman" is a person that has self-taught or learned to have a flair for the dramatic, and has developed a style which distinguishes him/her from both other callers and the material being presented.

In square dancing, presentation and showmanship s mire than just being a larger than life presence on the stage. It is the verbal and non-verbal interactions between the caller and the dances both on and off sage. It is he methods in which choreography and music is used to differentiate you from the other callers. It is a public persona that you have with the dancers both and off the stage.

Once again, this persona is crafted through preparation.

BEFORE THE DANCE – Knowing your material, practicing your songs, having the hall set up so you can greet the dancers as they come in, personal appearance and confidence (real or otherwise), and most of all your smile.

AT THE DANCE - What you do when you are off stage is as important as when you are on stage. Get out and walk around and talk and establish rapport with the dancers between tips. Have your evening programmed with what choreography you will to emphasize, what focus you want to highlight and set the tone of the dance early. If you have special get outs or event gimmicks; use them wisely and sparingly to tease the crowd. Likewise; use your music wisely – keep it upbeat with hoedowns and adapt your singing calls to be you (not someone else). Be dynamic with your music and change it to guide the dancers on a staged and stepped escalator of rising enthusiasm.

AFTER THE DANCE – They should be left wanting more. Ensure you come down from the stage and say farewell to the dancers. If there is an after party, participate, but use judgment in your conduct. Lave the equipment pack up until an appropriate time. Focus on the dancers. They will all want to associate with you if you have done your job correctly. It is important to entertain throughout the course of the entire evening.
