From the Editor...



What are you doing to bring new dancers into the activity we all love so much? More and more I hear of clubs that do not have classes. How do they plan to recruit new members for their club? Why do people find it difficult to tell strangers about square dancing? I can barely have a conversation without bringing up square and round dancing. If you're afraid to talk to people, do you

wear something that tells everyone you are a dancer i.e. shirts, jackets, buttons, etc. When strangers see these kinds of things, they will come up to you to ask about it.

I have a white jacket that promotes Single Square Dancers USA (SSDUSA) that I wore one time when I had to go to the day surgery center. I was sitting at a desk being checked-in and someone walking by noticed the back of my jacket and stopped to ask me about it. It's that simple! When you fly to square dance festivals or conventions, do you wear a shirt advertising the convention? When I used to fly to Dance-A-Ramas, the national singles convention, we all wore our t-shirts for the convention on the flight. I thought it looked neat to have all these convention shirts showing up all over the airport, in restaurants, and on the plane. It not only let strangers know about us, but we made new friends when we stopped to talk to someone wearing the same shirt as us.

The Florida Federation has created business cards that promote square dancing for the whole state. On the back of the card, you put either your contact information or the information of someone who can answer questions and provide information. Be sure to get permission from that "someone" before you use their information! You can carry a few cards in your wallet, your purse, or even your pocket and whenever you talk to someone about square dancing, be sure

to leave a card with them. You can also put these cards on bulletin boards in restaurants or stores where businesses are advertised. These cards are free to the dancers. If you would like some cards, please notify me (<u>sqdncfan@gmail.com</u>) or your association representative on the Federation Board. There are also some buttons that say "Square Dancing Friendship Set To Music ASK ME! They are only \$1 a piece and are available from Promenade Squares and Strawberry Square Dance Center. I have requested a supply but I haven't received them yet.

Recruiting new dancers is not a task for officers only. It is everyone's responsibility to recruit. Don't just recruit for your club; recruit for the activity. You also don't have to be a member of a club to recruit new dancers! Of course, not being a member of a club is a topic for a future article! If you talk to someone who lives out of your area (anywhere in the US), tell them how they can find out about square dancing or get their contact information and forward it to me. I would be happy to contact them and provide them with the information they need. If you talk to someone about your class, but the night of your class doesn't work for them, let them know about other classes on other nights.

Because of our struggle to recruit new dancers, we must start thinking outside the box regarding ways to get to these people. When you entertain at a hospital or nursing home, be sure to invite their families. In Lakeland, we are starting a handicapable class and I plan to invite their parents. This just might be a hook to get mom and dad to continue to Mainstream and Plus. Scheduling demos is also something that is just the job of the demonstration chairman. Anyone can talk to people about doing a demo.

He was able to bring the joy of square dancing to people around the United States and to 25+ countries around the world. He truly had a gift of calling, singing and making others smile with his music. He could tell a mean joke out of the side of the mouth while calling a dance. John's passion was always family and friends. He made every effort to give his family the best of everything, including driving advice from the backseat and never wanted to see anyone unhappy. When he wasn't working or calling square dances, he was coaching, cheering, and supporting his family in all their many activities. He would argue sports with anyone that would "take the bait" especially when it was about his favorite teams: the New York Yankees, the Duke Blue Devils and the Florida Gators. John is survived by his wife of 58 years, Linda. Their love of each other and their family and friends set the best example of how we are supposed to go through life gracefully and with laughs. His biggest successes are his five children, Michael (Rosemary), Michelle (Doug Adams), Christopher, Shawn (Shannon) and Susy (Bryan Peterson), 15 grandchildren, Lauren (Justin Alspaugh), Ryan, Adrienne (Derrick Jeffries), Nicholas (Monica), Benjamin, Zachary, Briel, Branton, Cale, Jasan Rice (Dayna), Corey, Cassidy, Brody, Clayton and Delaney and 5 great grandchildren, Kade, Carter, Olivia, Kimera and Colby. John is predeceased by his parents, Chuck and Margaret and granddaughter, Amanda Marie (infant). A church service for John's family members will be Saturday, July 8, 2017. A celebration of Life for family & friends with music & dance will be Saturday, July 22, 2017 from 2:00 to 4:00 PM at Prince of Peace Catholic Church, Ormond Beach, FL. John fought fiercely through diabetes, heart disease and cancer. While cancer took his life, it could not take his soul, his dignity or his sense of humor and that is why he is able now to be perched in Joe Girardi's ear "advising him" because the Lord knows that he needs advising. He is also able to eat pin wheels, biscuits and gravy and all of Linda's cooking as he controls the TV of his dreams showing only his favorites: Big Bang Theory, Love Boat, M.A.S.H. and Keeping Up Appearances. At John's request, his body has been donated to the Anatomical Board of the State of Florida for use in medical research & education at the University of Central Florida. Awarding the Best!

Volunteers in square and round dancing are paid such handsome salaries that there is no need to say thank you or to recognize them for their hard work, the many miles they put on their cars to visit your clubs/special dances and attend meetings, the toner and paper they use to print off flyers and newsletters, their time to come to the dance early to set up and stay late to clean up, to be at the classes to angel, etc. (LOL)

You hear the names of some volunteers all the time and others you never know their name; some have danced for many years and others are new dancers. If it weren't for our volunteers, there wouldn't be any dances because you wouldn't have anyone to advertise, set up and clean up at the dance or recruit new dancers. Often we get busy and forget to even say thank you to those many people who work to make our activity possible. Have we lost some dancers because they have worked so hard and they didn't feel appreciated?

Let's talk about the various forms of recognition/thank you available in square and round dancing. A simple "thank you" can always be done on the spur of the moment and requires no prior planning. At the dances, we want to be sure to thank all the members who help set up for the dance, who greeted, who set up refreshments, and who will help clean up after the dance. We also want to thank the dancers for coming to the dance, as well as the caller, cuer and their spouses/partners. If there are any "VIPs" in attendance, i.e. callers/cuers (and their spouses/partners), Federation, Florida Callers Association, Round Dance Council of Florida, and Association (all Florida regional associations) officers and past presidents, county Reps, square dance publication editors, other Association officers and past presidents, anyone along these lines, should be recognized. They can be recognized at the beginning of the dance or during the announcements.

Below are the awards that are available, along with the guidelines, nominating procedures and the nomination deadlines. As you read them, is there anyone you can think of that you would nominate for any of the? (NOTE: The nomination due dates are listed at <u>www.dancergram.com</u> under Deadlines).

Circle of Service – The Circle of Service was the brainchild of Mori Soglow of Strawberry Square in Plant City, Florida, during the spring of 1985. Mori, who at that time had been asked to be a moderator of a LEGACY panel on Awards and Recognition, conferred with Chet Vetter, also of Strawberry Square, who at the time was chairman of LEGACY's leadership and education committee and coordinator of Legacy Panels to the National Convention to be held in June 1985 in Birmingham, Alabama.

The original title of the circle was "Wheel of Progress", but while Kit Waldorf of Pensacola, Florida, who was asked to design the emblem, was completing her artistic enterprise, the title

was changed to the "Circle of Service". The new title, together with Kit Waldorf's original design was more than acceptable and ready for presentation by Legacy in June 1985.

This award for DANCERS ONLY, was introduced to the panel on awards and recognition conducted by Legacy at the 34th National Convention held in Birmingham, Alabama in June 1985. The "Circle of Service" presentation was acted upon with favor, being made a part of the square and round dancing activities by the committee. Those initially receiving this honor at the Panel meeting were: Brock and Mary Brockwell, vice chairman of panels at Birmingham; Bob and Dottie Elgin, chairman of Legacy from Pennsylvania. The following day at the Legacy Board meeting, Don and Mary Martin of Georgia, Ernie and Barbara Stone of Indiana, Bill and Colleen Wilton of Wisconsin, Gordon Goss and Partner Valarie of Mississippi, Vivian McCannon of Texas and Vera Chestnut of Wisconsin were all presented the "Circle of Service".

The citation accompanying the presentation reads: This circle is a symbol of service to Square and Round Dancing. It is designed to be worn with PRIDE by dancers who, for three or more years are determined to have made a significant contribution to the Square and Round Dance movement. The stellar hub of the Circle, formed by a pattern of ARCS, symbolizes the importance of each such individual to the total picture. The same circular shapes flow outward to help define interlocking squares and stylized musical symbols. This linear interplay suggests the strong bond between the two "sister" dance activities, Square and Round Dancing.

A certificate and a small dangle are presented to each recipient. This award must be presented by someone who has already received the Circle of Service award. The dangle can be purchased from SuzieQ Creations.

West Coast President's Choice Award – This award is presented by the current West Coast president either at the President's Ball or at the annual Fall Fun Fest. A deserving square or round dance couple or single is selected by the president(s) for extraordinary effort in promoting square and round dancing in cooperation with the West Coast Square and Round Dancers' Association. An engraved plaque is presented to the recipient(s).

West Coast's Distinguished Service Award⁶ – The purpose of this award is to recognize a member(s) of the West Coast Square & Round Dancers' Association (WCSRDA) who has given service to the (WCSRDA) beyond the average dancer. The committee shall consist of the five (5) most recent recipients of the award. Each year a new member will come on and the longest serving will resign (unless someone resigns or stops dancing). They will elect a chairman from within. A quorum, a simple majority, is required to transact any business. This committee will review all nominations and select a winner by vote of the majority attending the meeting.

The recipient(s) will not be revealed until the presentation. Any WCSRDA member may make nominations. Nominations will be submitted in the form of a resume. The resume shall include, but not be limited to: (1) number of years dancing; (2) number of years member of WCSRDA; (3) club membership; (4) offices held or holding at all levels. List the special contributions which you believe qualifies the nominee for the award.

Nominations shall be submitted no later than July 20th of each year. The award (an engraved plaque) will be presented annually at the Fall Fun Fest.

Extra Mile Award - The purpose of this award is to show appreciation to both Callers and Cuers who go beyond the norm in giving freely of their time and talents to the square and round dance activity. The criterion for the award is that the caller or cuer be a member of the Florida Callers Association or the Round Dance Council of Florida.

The procedure for nomination is (1) the board of the Florida Federation shall be the selection committee, with current president as chairman of same. New members coming on will replace one going off; (2) any dancer may submit a name of a caller/cuer to the selection committee prior to February 1st of the year in which the nominee is to be selected. The choice should include a brief autobiographical sketch and at least three (3) events at which the caller/cuer has demonstrated his or her contributions to the square dance activity; (3) the selection committee to meet during the February working weekend to review the nominee(s) and arrive at a final decision. A nomination form has been created and it is posted on the Florida Federation website (www.floridasquaredance.com). The nominations should be submitted to the Federation president by February 1st. The award(s) should be presented at the following Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention by the current president of the Florida Federation. The award(s) presented shall be a framed document and an "Extra Mile Award Recipient" bar or dangle.

Hall of Fame - Nominees must have a minimum of 10 years statewide involvement in the Florida Square and Round Dance activity. Their contributions must encompass the entire state of Florida, not just one or two areas. This should require unselfish dedication of time and labor. Being an Area president, Federation president, Caller/Cuer Association president and/or State Convention chairman is not enough. The Hall of Fame is seeking individuals or couples whose efforts have affected the majority of the State of Florida.

Preparing a nominating resume will take some time and investigation to make it complete. Talk to other dancers, callers and/or cuers for dates, places and times the nominee was involved in statewide participation. Follow the who, what, when and where rules as you investigate and prepare the resume. The more information submitted the better. The Resume Outline contains the following information: Nominee Name(s), Full Address, Phone Number, Email, Began Dancing-Year, What Dance Club(s) do they belong to, Held Club Office(s) & Dates, Member of which State Association(s), Office(s) Held & Dates, Please explain what the Nominee(s) has done using this format: Who (Names), What (They did [This can be done in resume form or as a

story], When – Dates [If the exact date is not available please give the year], Where – Area of the State. Once the résumé(s) is finished there are two ways in which to present the information to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume(s) may be submitted to the Board of Directors of any of the five associations, callers association or cuers association. The Area or Association Board of Directors will review the resume(s) and vote to reject or pass it on to the Hall of Fame Committee chairman. The resume(s) must be received by the Hall of Fame Committee by November 1st of each year. It is suggested that any association not submit more than two (2) resumes for consideration per year. The Hall of Fame Committee shall meet and review all resume(s) presented and vote by secret ballot before forwarding such resume(s) to the Selection Committee for the final vote.
