West Coast Association Announces Merger of the West Coast Dancer with the DANCERgram

The West Coast Dancer has been the official publication of the West Coast Association since October 1968. Over the years, it has evolved from a monthly printed newsletter to a publication posted at www.floridasquaredance.com. Our West Coast meetings used to be called Folding Meetings. Before every meeting, stacks of copies were lined up down a 6' table (on both sides of the table) and several people walked down each side picking up copies and collating the newsletter.

When we stopped printing the newsletter and put it on the Internet, many people didn't like the idea because they felt they needed to have printed copies at their dances for people without email and visitors to their dances. I have to admit, I was one of those people. I never want anyone to be left out and I can just about guarantee that none of the presidents were printing off a few copies for their members without email addresses and for their flyer table.

Ed Henning was the editor of the *Dancer* for 15 years and had to retire last summer due to his and Ginny's health problems. We were inundated with volunteers! LOL. Kidding aside no one volunteered and the last issue that was published was the April/May/June 2018 issue.

In the early 2000s, I started writing a quick email newsletter for Buttons & Bow of Lakeland to communicate dance information to them. The email started growing and in 2005 it had become too large to send in an email and had to be produced as a Word document that was attached to an email. In 2007, at the request of many of the readers, a website was built. Cliff Reiss, a Temple Twirlers member, volunteered to fund and build the site. At the time, the DANCERgram was housed in his homeowner's association website so we had to be careful not to take up too much memory. A few years ago, we moved it to GoDaddy, which gave us a lot more space so we could expand the newsletter and post more flyers.

At the February 3rd West Coast Meeting, a motion was made and accepted to merge the *West Coast Dancer* with the DANCERgram and make that the official publication of the West Coast Association.

The target audience is the west coast of Florida which is 16 counties on the west coast of Florida. It's not only for the dancers but also for the callers and cuers. It contains a list of contacts; a list of all the dances in our area with the county rep information, the name of the dance, types of dancing i.e. Squares, Rounds, etc., dance level, and contact information for each dance; Health & Sympathy which is currently for Federation officers, West Coast officers, past presidents, callers, and cuers in the newsletter itself and for everyone else on the website list; Your Source which lists the items that I carry and sell i.e. ribbons, buttons, fundraisers, etc.; This Week, which is the dance schedule for the upcoming seven days; Classes and Caller and Cuer Schools; One-nighters and demos; reprints of articles with appropriate attribution; articles that I write, square dance travel; and, Looking Ahead which lists all the new information regarding dances, meetings, deadlines, etc. and then the information is moved to a chronological list by year and will re-appear in the newsletter when we get close to the date; and Links.

With the merger, we are adding a new section just for West Coast Association information i.e. President's Message and Club News. Cliff and I are currently working on the necessary changes to complete the merger. Eventually, we will also be taking advertisements.

I have tried to implement a sharing of information between the Associations, which is working with two Associations. Steve Adler writes an email newsletter to his people and he would take excerpts from the DANCERgram. He now just forwards the entire newsletter to his distribution list. Yes, the This Week section is specifically for the West Coast, but everything else is

applicable to all dancers, callers, and cuers in the state. If a caller from outside our area calls in our area frequently, they receive the DANCERgram on a weekly basis.

I have subscriptions to all the Association publications, the *Bow & Swing, American Square Dance*, and *USDA News* to gather information. I am also on the distribution list for national convention press releases so I can include them in this newsletter. I have also requested from all the clubs and dances in the West Coast area to add me to their distribution lists so I will receive their information and they won't have to do a second email to me (because a lot of times they forget to do that!).

If time sensitive information is received between issues, an addendum is sent out. The types of information include canceled dances, change in callers or cuers, health and sympathy information, and during hurricane season messages regarding damages or injuries to any of our dancers or the dance locations.

I'm at the point now, that due to the size of the distribution list (approximately 800 names) I am looking at Mail Chimp to use for emailing the newsletter. With Mail Chimp, it can be set up that there is a list of each of the sections explaining what is contained in that section and they click on a button that takes them directly to that section on the website for more details. This will eliminate having to email 30 +/- pages, the email servers will think there is only one name on the distribution list, and it will also have a feature where people can be added or deleted automatically without me having to do it. Since we will be taking advertisements, I am looking at Microsoft Publisher to create the newsletter. I am in the process of learning Mail Chimp and Publisher.

I offer some additional services i.e. consulting; the point person for class and dance information in our area; proofreading; Master Calendar; working with the convention chairman, I produce a Convention Fact Sheet each year and I was sending it just to the dancers in the West Coast area but the past couple of years I've sent it to the other associations so they can forward it to their dancers if they want to; notify the Florida Callers Association Goodwill chairman or the Round Dance Council secretary when I receive information on one of their members; maintain the list of West Coast dances, and maintain a list of Florida Square Dance Publication Deadlines. If I'm contacted about class and dance information outside our area, I know who to contact in the other Associations to get the information or refer them to. The Master Calendar is currently 51 pages long and goes through 2021. It contains all the dances in our area and as well as Association weekends, camping weekends, state and national conventions, West Coast, SCCA, and federation meetings and holidays that would affect building closings. And...I've just added the Super Bowl because we all know the attendance won't be very good on that day. February 2nd is Super Bowl Sunday in 2020 for those of you that don't know! As I add events to the Calendar, I sometimes find conflicts and I notify the person that is in charge of the dance. I have copies of a few of the calendar pages if anyone want to see what that looks like.

For those of you that like numbers

- 1. The annual average traffic is holding steady at just under 1,300 unique monthly visitors.
- 2. The number of monthly visitors in 2018 peaked (as expected) in Q1 and Q4 because of snowbirds.
- 3. Despite the loss of a few clubs, the number of dancers is holding steady year over year.
- 4. It is too soon to draw any conclusions for 2019; we will need to wait for Q1 stats.

And for those that like fancy charts with colors, I have a printed copy of some charts if you want to see it.

The pluses of this merger are (1) by emailing, there is no postage expense; (2) the information is more current than a publication that is only printed once a quarter or even once a month; and (3) there's no printing cost.

I have a copy of the DANCERgram with me if you aren't familiar with it and would like to take a look. If you would like to start receiving it, just give me your name and email address and I'll be happy to add you to the distribution list. I also have flyers with me that advertise the DANCERgram.

Today's Square Dance Caller - The Whole Package

The term, "the whole package" may be new to you. It is a popular way to describe a person who meets the necessary criteria for the position they are holding or are being considered for. A perspective employee "wo is the whole package" would have the breadth and depth of experience, initiative, great communication skills, unimpeachable integrity, punctuality, etc. A perspective employee "who is the whole package" might be good looking, well-dressed with an impeccable sense of style, educated, great with children and parents, good sense of humor, etc.

Relating this to square dancing, our caller who is "the whole package" has he same traits mentioned above — breadth and depth of experience, initiative, great communication skills, unimpeachable integrity, punctuality. He or she probably adds the following:

An ear for good sound. Our caller is sensitive to the sound being too loud or too soft.
 He/she has quality speakers, amp, microphone that produce square dance quality audio
 sound that clearly carries to all squares without bounce while producing voice and music in pleasing tones.

- An ear for what sounds good. Aside from acoustics the master caller has knowledge and control over the quality of the music and voice. For example...
 - Music. Our caller eschews music from old scratched up records that has been run through software so now it sounds like it's playing from the bottom of the swimming pool. There is an abundance of high-quality music produced – today – by square dance music labels AND music labels that have nothing to do with squares. A caller has so much music at their fingertips at a cost so low that it could easily be stated that today's caller has the best music for square dancing, now more than any other time in our history. Quality music and a quality caller go hand-in-hand.
 - Voice. A knowledgeable caller will recognize when vocals are shrill, nasally, or similarly unpleasant and work to retrain themselves away from such qualities.
 Experience also teaches the caller that the sharpest, most unpleasant sounds are made by the caller who is scolding or has lost self-control.
 - A feel for musicality. In addition to playing quality music and producing a pleasant vocal, the good caller knows how to pitch their voice so it is harmonic with the music and in cadence with the rhythm. For example...
 - I a singing call, the caller who uses a "tic-tac" rhythm in delivering their calls is using a cadence proper for the patter style. If the caller uses the same "tic-tac" patter delivery in the singing call, then everything at the dance is patter calling, which is boring to the dancers. By contrast, a caller who does not pitch in harmony to the music nor deliver a patter rhythm is not using their music properly and probably forcing the dancers off of the music.
- A sense of musical purpose and variety. Consider this, when you sit down to listen to music, really listen without the distraction of driving or cleaning or working, who will choose music to fit your mood. Square dancing should be the same. Rather than a random selection, build a musical style that CREATES the mood for the dancers. For example, sing-alongs naturally encourage the dancers to join singing the chorus lines. They are a joyous act of audience participation. Create a jubilant mood by using singing calls like "When The Red Red Robin", "Can't Take My Eye Off You", or "Hallelujah" (all on Blue Star). The caller who knows his craft will make sure they are not delivering calls when the dancers want to sing stealing the mood from the dancers. He/she also knows that you can't do sing-alongs all night. Create variety, build a musical program that shapes the mood throughout the entire dance and watch how dancers respond in a positive way.
- Good judgment. Having empathy to feel that someone in the room could be offended
 by a song selection or a joke and then avoiding what is offensive. For example, joking
 about alcohol might have been okay in the past, but it is a sensitive issue for many today

so singing calls that try to cast alcoholism in a humorous light are not appropriate. A caller with a true depth of experience also knows to be careful if sing accompaniment with vocals making sure that the lyrics are not offensive.

- Dresses well. Tee shirts, shorts, and flip-flops are no more appropriate for a caller on stage than they would be for an attorney in court, a pastor at the podium, or a contractor doing work on my house. Dressing well doesn't mean expensive, but it does sow respect for yourself and your craft.
- Finally, the caller who is the whole package has a sense of responsibility and forward leaning. Perhaps best described as the caller who wants to leave the activity in his/her own area, better than they found it.

Evolution of Square Dance Attire

INTRODUCTION

At this particular point in time when just about anything goes – no hold barred – it is nice to know that at a square dance there is something "special" about the way we dress. It is special because ladies look like ladies and you don't need a program to tell the hims from the hers. At a square dance, even a usually plain – appearing damsel becomes a doll decked out in petticoats, colored slippers and a pretty, full-skirted dress. And the male – the man is a man, sparkling in western pants and shirt, perhaps boots or boot-shoes and – ah, yes, a tie – bolo, bow, string, or neckerchief – but nevertheless a tie!

Now why is all this such a big deal? Because SQUARE DANCING IS A BIG DEAL! Folks who see you dressed up know you're a square dancer. It's not a uniform; reflects the way we feel about square dancing.

We hope you find this information interesting and enlightening.

EVOLUTION OF THE SQUARE DANCE

Dance, along with music, has always dynamically expressed the spirt and personality of every culture. Modern western dance is part of this global language and its roots run wide and deep. They can be traced to the taverns of Ireland and to the ballrooms of Europe, to the Czars palaces of Russia and further back still to the fluid tribal rituals of Africa. Representatives from

all of these cultures brought their native dances wen they landed in America. Widely differing peoples who had little or no exposure to one another gathered and dances on common ground.

A Folk Dance is any dance created by the people without any influence of a choreographer. In other words, they just happen. The dance(s) are built up and practiced expressing the characteristic feels of the people, according to the peculiarities of any racial temperament. According to the genealogical chart, the roots of square-dancing started way back in 1emperament. According to the genealogical chart, the roots of square-dancing started way back in 1450, with two major ancestors, one English and one French. This country has been referred to as the melting pot of the world. People from virtually every European country immigrated to the "new and" during America's first 200 years. The Folk dances of America all have names of patterns that may stem from Russia, Germany, Ireland, Scandinavia, France, England, etc. as these lands gave us many different and varied cultures of dance. They brought with them their customs, languages, skills and their dances. At first, grouped into ethnic concentrations in different parts of the country, they enjoyed their dances in the pure forms of their homelands. As people spread across the land, migrated west and moved from one city to another, the various forms of dance became more and more integrated.

The following dance forms influenced the emergence of the American Square Dance into the activity we enjoy today.

The Minuet

The 17th Century Minuet was derived from the Branle. The name Minuet comes from he small steps that were taken during the dance. In its originality, the minuet was a lively, spirited dance, done around the room in the shape of an S. It developed into a slow and stately dance, elegant yet simple. Proper dress and courtesy were highly encouraged. Men would dance with swords on the waist and danced in their awkward boots. Women would sometimes wear riding habits. But the 'Code of Etiquette' created in the late 1600's changed all that. Swords were banished and the exuberant country dances became more graceful. The Minuet was preceded by at least two bows, followed b an offering of the hand, a salute to your partner, a high step and a balance, courtly gestures, bows and curtsies, and kissing here and there! It is said that George Washington's favorite dance was the Minuet.

The Waltz

The Waltz probably has a lengthy line of history slightly preceding the 13th century. The first tangible waltz tune appeared in 1670 in Vienna, Austria, in 1776. However, it did not become popular until 1788 when it was introduced on the Viennese stage in an opera. The waltz was said to be introduced to England in 1790. Later it was introduced into France from Germany by the soldiers of Napoleon I sometime around 1805.

As I Saw It

If you have been involved in square dancing very long you most likely have heard the name Bob Osgood. Chances are today's square dancing would not be what we now enjoy had it not been for Mr. Osgood.

"As I Saw It" covers the life of Bob Osgood from his early years in New York City to his passing in Beverly Hills, California. We get a picture of the Los Angeles area from a child's perspective during the Depression More importantly we see Bob discover square dancing in a small country general store in Northern Arizona and the effect that experience had on him. Later bob was reintroduced to square dancing at a leadership conference held at the beautiful conference ground at Asilomor, California, near Monterey. These two experiences changed Bob permanently, and he then went on to change square dancing. He studied under Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw, who was also very instrumental in organizing square dancing as we know it today. Pappy Shaw inspired Bob to teach some of the first classes in the Los Angeles area. In the post WWII era, Bob started a square dance magazine, Sets in Order, which was the most widely read square dance magazine in the world.

Bob took square dancing worldwide with a series of tours to all parts of the world. Bob saw first-hand the effect square dancing had on the military returning from the war and how square dancing had a profound effect on America. When the square dance activity became widespread, Bob saw the need to have callers use the same terminology when calling. Bob was the drive behind the formation of CALLERLAB, The International Association of Square Dance Callers. This book gives all readers a chance to meet a charismatic man who was educated to helping people have fun.

About the author, Paul Moore is a square dance caller from California. He is also a teacher, an author, an editor, and in general a good old boy! Paul is a feature writer in American Square Dance Magazine.

He has compiled and edited this book describing the life and career of Mr. Osgood. Mr. Moore provides an enlightening vantage point on the evolution and growth of the square dance activity. Much of the book is in Bob's own words, taken from his own articles, notes, and recordings.
