

CALLER OF THE MONTH BOB BLAND - Miramar - In 1960 Bob & his taw Ethel learned to square dance with Earl Anderson at Hunter AFB, Savannah, Georgia. After graduation they became officers of the Hunter Hoedowners and under their guidance as President the club became known as "the friendliest club in Savannah"! Out of the 22 clubs in the city, that was a pretty good reputation! Bob decided to try his hand at calling in 1962 and taught his first class that fall. They started with 90 teenagers and graduated 45. He still sees some of them at conventions. He also was at this time editor of "Square Talk" magazine which is still being published. He remembers receiving complimentary copies of Bow & Swing in '63 Bob & Ethel were transfered to Little Rock AFB, Arkansas. The caller for the base club was retiring and they had no prospects for a caller. So they fell heir to a class

and club and again every Saturday nite Bob packed them in at the Base Recreation Center and this club acquired the same reputation, "the friendliest club in the Little Rock area". Bob helped to establish the Arkansas Callers Association, writing the Constitution and By-Laws. He participated in most of the area and state square dance functions. When he retired from the Air Force, Bob and his wife moved to Orlando. The late Je Curtis and the then FCA president Joe Johnson sponsored him for membership in the FCA. After about a year he and his bride of 27 years moved to Southeast Fla, where they built their home in Miramar. Bob has called on area, state and national programs. Since Bob has been in this area he has helped several callers get started. He vias recently elected Treasurer of the Southeast Florida Callers Association. He currently is teaching a class and shares calling for the Merry Twirlers with Bill Roundtree. Bcb is always working toward the cultivation of the Square Dance movement. In his words,"It is amazing what can be achieved if you don't care who gets the credit!"







FEATURE FIGURE FOR THE MONTH THE JACK LASRY CALLER'S CORNER

NEW IDEA - TURN & RUN AND CROSS TURN & RUN - Jack Lasry

These two new ideas can be used from a couple of set ups and each is easily taught and learned. The Turn & Run figure will always bring the dancers into a two face line while the Cross & Run will always end in an ocean wave (right hand).

For A Starting Teach - 1P-2P line Curlique - From the colums set up each foursome has the boys facing each other and the girls facing out of their foursome box formation. The Turn & Run action has the facing boys step ahead and catch right forearms and turn 1/2. The girls facing out of their formation will run right and become the ends of the two face line. From the columns you will end in two parallel two face lines. You can circulate the columns to set up having the two facing girls turn right and the boys run right to end in a two face line with boys on the end. The figure will easily dance and the following calls come from standard two face lines with good flow direction for wheel & deal, tags, bends and couples circulate. The same rule apply from Ocean Waves and best seen from a Box 1-4 Curclique set up with boys facing in and girls out. Ends in a long line with two face lines end to end.

Dancing Examples From Columns with boys turning & girls running

1P-2p Curlique - Turn & Run (boys turn-girls run) 1P-2P Curlique - Turn & Run Bend the line - box the gnat Tag the line right-bend the line Crosstrail-left alle. Crosstrail-left alle.

1P-2P Curlique - Turn & Run Boys cross run to the far end Wheel & deal - Pass thru - left alle.

Dancing examples from Columns with girls turning & boys running 1P-2P Rollaway 1/2 sashay-curlique Turn & Run - (girls turn & boys run) Bend the line - Zero to 1P-2P

1P-2P Rollaway - cirlique Turn & Run - wheel & deal Swing thru-turn thru-left alle.

1P-2P Curlique - 8 circulate Turn & Run-bend the line right & left thru-slide thru Left alle. Box 1-4

Turn & Run from Parallel Waves Box 1-4 Curlique - Turn & Run (boys turn girls run) Box 1-4 Curlique - Turn & Run Bend the line - box the gnat Right & left thru-Zero Box 1-4

Girls run - right & left thru Star thru-dive thru-Square thru 3/4 -left alle. Box 1-4

Cross Turn & Run is just as acceptable or possibly more as it ends in an ocean wave with right hands held. The action is similar to turn & run except the facing in dancers step diagonally forward to catch left forearms and turn 1/2 as the dancers facing out run right to become the ends of a wave. Note of caution for the fancers facing in and who do the 1/2 turn, the 1/2 turn starts from the point where they are left shoulder to left shoulder and still facing directly forward.

Dancing Examples from Columns, with boys facing in 1P-2P Curlique - Cross Turn & Rum - (boys turn left girls/run) Boys run - wheel & deal

Star thru - Zero 1P-2P


