Shamrock Swing:

2014 (Ailene Picheco):

There were was a good turnout at the Friday night dance, and ribbon sales have been pretty good this year. Last night's half and half returns were \$146.

Food purchased for the event was more than needed, and nonperishable excess food will be allocated to the next 5th Saturday dance and the party weekend. A figure on the funds devoted to this event for food will be determined in discussion with the Treasurer. in order to roll up the fiscal reporting for the event.

The baskets donated from clubs this year for the basket raffle, needs some more attention by the clubs, and more should be encouraged to do this. Reminders via email were made difficult, because the email lists for Keepin' Posted need updating. Club contacts were often incorrect.

2015 (Richard & Carol Douget):

Richard and Carol reported that the Shamrock Swing would be held in Titusville at the Elk's Club next year, on the 20th and 21st. Mac McCall and Jack Lewis are the callers, and Dick Nordine will be the cuer. Action is currently underway to negotiate a hotel block for the event. 

Physically hand out flyers in front of stores after getting permission from the store owner/manager.

Two or more clubs combine classes.

Try shorter class times – 14 to 16 week mainstream lessons.

Bill Boyd has a workable lesson program.

Maintain positive attitude

Involve everyone: callers, dancers, greeters.

Follow up – call class members when they miss classes – even if only "we missed you; hope to see you next week."

Put FUN back in square dancing. Show how much you enjoy it. Give class members a "Welcome Packet". i.e.: welcome letter, copies of square dance publications, links to websites, links to square dance history, etc.

Public Awareness and Publicity

Advertise, Advertise!

We just can't emphasize this enough. The more the better.

Send in advance press releases when fund raising. Invite the press to events to write an article and take pictures. If the press is not able to attend, do it yourself and submit your article to the newspapers.

Don't throw square dance publications away. Leave them in your doctor/dentist offices, repair shops, hospitals and other waiting areas

Have club Business cards to leave in various establishments you visit. Bookmarks for libraries.

Announce conventions – state & national – at all functions.

Place ads in publications well in advance of the event.

Provide discounts for early registration for all special events – for instance "\$15 per person or \$20 for two (any combination of two dancers).

down the square because someone cannot assist them with only the small surface of a palm hold, it is certainly not a pretty sight. When dancers appear unstable on turning-motion calls, even though they do not break down, it is not attractive. Forearms solve all these problems.

(2) "Forearms can result in bruises if improperly used." REPLY: True. But Palms Up can result in twisted fingers and thumb grabbing if improperly used. Indeed, a case can be made against square dancing itself, because an occasional foot may be stepped on. Aside from the fact that Palms Down and Forearms make it easier to break a death-grip handhold, injury considerations are not relevant here — rough dancers will tend to cause injuries just by being on the floor, whether they use Palms Up, Palms Down or Forearms.

(3) "A Balance in an ocean wave is better executed with Palms Up." REPLY: True. If a caller says "Make an ocean wave and Balance," it should be done with Palms Up. But a Balance is not a turning motion, and it is for turning motions that Palms Down is better and Forearms are best. After an Ocean Wave Balance, if the caller were to give a turning motion call, such as Swing Thru or Spin the Top, one can easily drop to Palms Down or Forearms to do the call.

Note: Some callers use the call Balance as a separator between a series of other wave calls. This is awkward, because a Balance involves a reversal of body flow, thereby interrupting the ongoing forward flow of the dance. An occasional Balance might be necessary for set orientation at the start of a wave figure for new or weak dancers, but otherwise it is not the best call to use. The rule of thumb is: the more Balance is used, the less smooth the dance. This is why most callers today are calling very few if any ocean wave Balances for graduated dancers.

SUMMARY: Palms Down and forearms are preferable to Palms Up because they are more comfortable, result in fewer mistakes, and make for smoother dancing.

Palms Up vs. Palms Down & Forearms - Part 3

Last month we continued to look at this topic, and the reasons why I favor Palms Down and Forearms. In terms of COMFORTABLE DANCING, it was noted that

- (1) Palms Up is not a natural position;
- (2) Palms Up raised one's center of gravity, which causes less stability,
- (3) Palms Down and Forearms are best for height differences, and
- (4) Palms Down and Forearms seems to reduce the frequency of twisted fingers and squeezing too tight.

Regarding FEWER MISTAKES, we said that Palms Down and Forearms result in

- (1) tighter squares, and
- (2) making it easier to help those who are having difficulty. Now we continue under the title of FEWER MISTAKES.
- (3) TIRED ARMS. It was previously mentioned that, because Palms Up is not a natural position, the arms become strained and tired. Tired arms increase the likelihood for mistakes to occur, either because of imprecise turning motions or by failure to assist weaker dancers.
- (4) NEW DANCERS. It is ironic that as dancers improve over the years and become more accomplished in terms of dancing ability, many who were not taught to use Palms Down or Forearms begin to do so, recognizing the values of these methods. Yet it is the new dancer who benefits the most from Palms Down and especially from Forearms. Why? Because new dancers are unsure of many figures, and the strong assistance provided them by Forearms increases the amount of material they can do, thereby building their confidence.

STATEMENTS MADE BUY THOSE WHO SAY PALMS UP RESULTS IN SMOOTHER DANCING.

(1) "Palms Up looks nicer – it makes for prettier dancing." REPLY: In many cases it makes for less attractive dancing. When calls are not done precisely and people drift out of position because of a lack of holding surface, the figures do not look pretty. When people break





Let's Take a Look

HOW WE DANCE

The words "smooth dancing" carry with them a wide variety of meanings. To some, the term is synonymous with all dancers moving together within a square, in harmony with the music and well-timed to the calling. To others, it means the opposite of rough dancing, or avoiding erratic movements that could throw a person off balance and possibly be hurt in the process.

Are you a rough dancer? How can you tell? Ask your dancing partner. Maybe he or she will tell you; maybe not. It's a good idea to know what rough dancing is and what effect it has on others with whom you dance. Most of our trouble spots are simple errors, sometimes bad habits picked up along the way. Rough, inconsiderate, uncontrolled dancing can be corrected. There is not one of us who cannot become a better dancer--IF WE HAVE THE DESIRE.

USA TRAVELER PROGRAM

Do you like to travel? Do you like to attend square dances wherever you go? Then look into the USA Traveler Program! The purpose of the USA traveler program is to promote visitation between dancers in all 50 states by encouraging dancers to visit club dances, festivals, state conventions, or national conventions across state lines and around the United States. The goal – to dance at an event in each of the 50 United States!

Dancers participating in the USA Traveler Program carry a form to be signed by an official at a club dance, festival, or convention. As the forms are completed (in sets of 12 states), they are submitted to the USA Traveler Program chair. Upon completion of the first 12 states, the dancer receives a USA Traveler badge and a bar denoting 12 states visited. New forms can then be completed for subsequent sets of 12 states (no duplication permitted) with bars awarded as follows:

12 states	Red bar
24 states	White bas
36 states	Blue bar
48 states	Silver bar
50 states	Gold bar

Badges and bars are presented at the annual USDA Board of Directors meeting which is held each year during the National Square Dance Convention.

Each participant who reaches 48 and 50 states will also be awarded paid admission to the next National Square Dance Convention. Then it's time to start again for a "second time around" award!





Army Air Corps in 1940 and retired from the US Air Force in February 1965.



He was also State and District Director of Florida Little Major League Baseball, State Director Babe Ruth Baseball (12 years), and was responsible for starting the first Babe Ruth Chapter in Florida. He was also District II Director of Florida Parks and Recreation Association, a recipient of the National Parks and Recreation Achievement Award, and a recipient of the Florida Parks and Recreation Lifetime Award.

Howard was an avid fisherman, golfer, and sports enthusiast.

He is survived by his wife Lena, 2 sons, four granddaughters, and 3 great granddaughters.
