

If it can be made to work, this will help to remove a significant barrier to being able to accommodate new dancers who wish to learn.







Of course if you want to participate in any of our "Casting Calls" you must have a place to stay. We have chosen a few of the best places in the Lakeland area for you to consider. Here are a few of our suggestions, all are within a 4 to 6 mile radius of the Convention Center and all have great accommodations plus they offer a free breakfast buffet.

We recommend, though, using our Host Hotel – THE RAMADA LAKELAND HOTEL. It is right off the I-4 Highway to the left on Highway 98 then almost an immediate right into its driveway. This Host Hotel is offering us Square Dancers a "SPECLAL RATE" again this year. The rate is \$65.00 plus taxes, of course, gotta have them taxes. Randy has been able to block off 75 rooms so don't delay in making reservation call this number: 863-688-8080, be sure you ask for the "square dancers rate".

This hotel has really been accommodating to us for our State Conventions in the past in that they allow us to use their conference room as well as their banquet room for our famous after parties of ice cream one night with pizza and beer (the root kind, of course) another night. Then on the third party night the banquet room will be opened for a "Thanks for the Memories" Party given by the Directors of this year's convention. This is when there is much fun with skits and food and award giving and food etc.

CASTING CALL #4 CAMPERS

For all you campers or wanna-be campers, here is some great information from Vinnie & Lorraine Piecora, our Directors of Camping.

And I quote from their email: "There are 2 campgrounds not far from the Lakeland Convention Center. One is the Carefree Lakeland RV Resort. It is not part of the Carefree RV Resorts which is a nationwide company. They are in the midst of some upgrading to their pool and the main clubhouse which will not affect your stay with them. They have given us a "special" convention rate again this year for only \$20.00 per night. (Their normal rate starts at \$38.00 per night.) This includes full hookups with 30 and 50 Amps. They have 231 sites plus cabins and rental units, many of which are tree shaded and they can accommodate even some super sized rigs. They do not include cable for short term stays. They do have WiFi. For more info www.carefreervresorts.com/rv-parks/florida/lakeland for more complete information. This resort is about 6 to 7 miles from the Convention Center. They are also a Passport America Park.

The second park is Sanlan RV Resort. This is a larger campground with over 500 sites but very little shade. They do include cable and WiFi but charge extra per night for each pet. Their rates start at about \$38.00 per night but they do not offer any discount for the convention goers or for Passport America members. They are about 5 miles from the Convention Center. See www.sanlan.com for more information. Although this park is more modern than the Lakeland RV Resort, the upgrades being done at Lakeland RV Resort will make it comparable to the Sanlan, in my opinion.

Overall, we get a much better deal at the Lakeland RV Resort." (Unquote)



"And thanks to all you dancers who helped to pull me through. The only reason I can dance a step is because of people like you.

"We went on every dance night and tried each dance they taught. But the best thing that was apparent was we laughed instead of fought. We learned a lot of dances and made a lot of friends. We even went to festivals and are sorry when the music ends.

"So here's to all you Round Dancers! Stand up and take a bow. Never give up on your dancing; the music will tell you how."

and universities, companies, government organizations and area students to participate for the purpose of gaining a common good. The results were outstanding.

Perhaps, the University Career Fair concept could be used to make square dancing more visible to the community. One idea would be to not only invite all square, line and round dancing organizations to participate but also other organizations with similar goals, like, ballroom dance, Tai Chi, health, and other social organizations to participate in a "Dancing, Health, and Social Activities Fairs" in shopping malls on a weekend before a major holiday hoping that the preholiday shopping would best maximize square dancing's and shopping exposure. Public announcements could be submitted to local cable television service companies and radio stations to help spur visitations to the mall on the weekends in question. Flyers could be mailed to area churches, universities and schools promoting the "Dancing Social and Health Activities Fair". At the fair each organization would have table to display posters and provide information about what they do for the community and could wear their appropriate costumes such as square dancing, line dancing, or martial arts clothing and may demonstrate their dancing etc.

The mall-based "Dancing, Social and Health Activities Festival" can be a success on many levels as it will provide an opportunity for people to ask questions about square dancing and meet a square dancer. Secondly, organizations will receive inquiries about square dancing etc. that could result in new members. Thirdly, visitors to the festival may ask for an application to join square dance lessons. Organizations that have banded together to increase exposure to the public have had success recruiting new members. In some cases, mall authorities recognized the increased customer traffic and sales and have asked the groups to schedule a follow on "Dancing Social and Health Activities Fair."

Square Dancing Public Relations

(Dancing, Health and Social Fairs) By Patrick Demerath

The American Callers' Association, as do all dedicated dance organizations, continues to work for a healthy recovery for our dance activity. It has done so by providing effective information rele-



vant to all callers, dancers, and club leadership from 2000 to the present. Our principal interest lies in dance program planning that can contribute to an emerging marketing program, and we are committed to help improve the way all dance groups attract, teach and hold the interest of new dancers. ACA acknowledges the importance of supporting the unified marketing efforts necessary to successfully reverse the attendance and membership decline, experienced over the last two decades.

Our 'VIEWPOINT' this month offers two ideas that can have a positive effect on your recruiting efforts. The first idea points out how important it is to maintain a positive attitude toward the future of our activity, especially when new dancers are present. When new dancers enter the square dancing family today, they often encounter more seasoned dancers talking about the past days of too many dancers for the hall size. They describe how square dancing used to be one of the most popular activities in their city or town, and how people tried to enter square dancing classes but could not because the classes were full.

Conversations often drift into a debate over why square dancing's numbers have fallen over the past two decades. Many square dancers come to the conclusion that, because of changes in society, square dancing has lost its appeal to the public, but they stop short of addressing the issues of how do we counter these changes and attract new squarer dancers now. In the meantime, the new dancers have been discouraged about their own dancing future. All dance organizational leadership is being asked to seek new approaches to how they present square dancing to the new generations of dance prospects-to think "out side the box" (or outside the square). The second idea came from just that kind of insight. The author has participated in multiple University Career Fairs, where many different organizations with common interest, pooled their resources, gained supportive sponsorship, and invited other area colleges

And it presents an attractive and comprehensive 'acronym' (the ARTS) for use in advertising, publicity and public awareness and education programs.

Its purpose is to create and affirm a name and a non-profit corporation (the ARTS) which will provide an image of unity among diversified dance groups.
