



# Sam Oliveto Receives The Legion of Honor Medal



The Legion of Honor was created two centuries ago in 1802 by Emperor Napoleon, The Legion of honor is France's highest distinction and recognizes exceptional service to France in various fields. It rewards distinguished military and civil merits, and today rewards the courageous American soldiers, our friends and allies, who helped France



fight against the barbarity of the Nazis and liberate it from its occupied status.

On the 60th anniversary of the Normandy landings, France decided to grant the Legion of honor to all the

U.S. veterans who fought on French soil, many of which gave their lives in the name of freedom and were therefore unable to receive this award. The legion of Honor is not only a way to thank those who are still among us for their dedication and sacrifice but also as a symbol of the Franco-American cooperation that have characterized our countries' efforts during WWII and throughout the course of our individual history as well.

The Legion of Honor medal is not awarded posthumously. To be eligible to this outstanding award, the veteran has to fit strict criteria:

Interested veterans of all the different armed forces must have fought in at least one of the 3 main campaigns of the Liberation of France: Normandy, Provence/Southern France or Northern France. Actions having taken place in Belgium, Germany, Italy or any other neighboring European country are not taken into consideration.

The file presented must contain a copy of the military separation record (honorable discharge), the Proposal Memory application (below) and a copy of a current identity document with a picture.





# Let's Reward Our Workers

Below are the awards that are available along with the guidelines, nominating procedures and the nomination deadlines As you read through them, is there anyone you can think of that should be nominated for any of them?

Circle of Service – The Circle of Service was the brainchild of Mori Soglow of [Strawberry Square in] Plant City, Florida, during the spring of 1985. Mori, who at that time had been asked to be a moderator of a LEGACY panel on Awards and Recognition, conferred with Chet Vetter, also of [Strawberry Square in] Plant City, Florida, who at the time was chairman of LEGACY's leadership and education committee and coordinator of Legacy Panels to the National Convention to be held in June 1985 in Birmingham, Alabama. The original title of the circle was "Wheel of Progress", but while Kit Waldorf of Pensacola, Florida, who was asked to design the emblem, was completing her artistic enterprise, the title was changed to the "Circle of Service".

The new title, together with Kit Waldorf's original design was more than acceptable and ready for presentation by Legacy in June 1985. This award for DANCERS ONLY was introduced to the panel on awards and recognition conducted by Legacy at the 34th National Convention held in Birmingham, Alabama in June 1985. The "Circle of Service" presentation was acted upon with favor, being made part of the Square & Round Dancing activities by the committee.

Those initially receiving this honor at the Panel meeting were: Brock and Mary Brockwell, vice chairman of panels at Birmingham; Bob and Dottie Elgin, chairman of Legacy from Pennsylvania. The following day at the Legacy Board meeting, Don and Mary Martin of Georgia, Ernie and Barbara Stone of Indiana, Bill and Colleen Wilton of Wisconsin, Gordon Goss and Partner Valarie of Mississippi, Vivian McCannon of Texas and Vera Chestnut of Wisconsin were all presented the "Circle of Service".

The citation accompanying the presentation reads: This circle is a symbol of service to Square and Round Dancing. It is designed to be worn with PRIDE by dancers who, for three or more years are determined to have made a significant contribution to the Square and Round Dance movement. The stellar hub of the Circle, formed by a pattern of ARCS, symbolizes the importance of each such individual to the total picture. The same circular

shapes flow outward to help define interlocking squares and stylized musical symbols. This linear interplay suggests the strong bond between the two "sister" dance activities, Square and Round Dancing.

A certificate and a small dangle are presented to each recipient. This award must be presented by someone who has already received the Circle of Service award. The dangle can be purchased from any badge vendor.

**Dancer of the Year Award** – This award is presented by the current CFA President at the annual Shamrock Swing. A deserving square or round dance couple or single dancer is selected for extraordinary effort in promoting Square and Round Dancing in cooperation with the Central Square and Round Dancer's Association. An engraved plaque is presented to the recipient(s). **The nominations should be submitted to the CFA President by November 15th**.

**Extra Mile Award** - The purpose of this award is to show appreciation to both Callers and Cuers who go beyond the norm in giving freely of their time and talents to the square and round dance activity. The criterion for the award is that the caller or cuer be a member of the Florida Callers Association or the Round Dance Council of Florida.

The procedure for nomination is (1) the Board of the Florida Federation shall be the selection committee, with current president as chairman of same. New members coming on will replace one going off; (2) any dancer may submit a name of a caller/cuer to the selection committee prior to February 1st of the year in which the nominee is to be selected. The choice should include a brief autobiographical sketch and at least three events at which the caller/cuer has demonstrated his or her contributions to the square dance activity; (3) the selection committee to meet during the February working weekend to review the nominee(s) and arrive at a final decision. The nomination form can be found at http://floridasquaredance.com/documents/ExtraMileAwards/Extra%20Mile% 20Nomination%20Form.pdf.

The nominations should be submitted to the Federation secretary by February 1st. The award(s) should be presented at the following Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention by the current president of the Florida Federation. The award(s) presented shall be a framed document and an "Extra Mile Award Recipient" bar or dangle.

**Hall of Fame** - Nominees must have a minimum of 10 years statewide involvement in the Florida Square and Round Dance activity. Their contributions must encompass the entire state of Florida, not just one or two areas. This should require unselfish dedication of time and labor.

Being an Area president, Federation president, Caller/Cuer Association president and/or State Convention chairman is not enough. The Hall of Fame is seeking individuals or couples whose efforts have affected the majority of the State of Florida. The fact that one is nominated is a very high honor, whether or not they enter the Hall of Fame.

Preparing a nominating resume will take some time and investigation to make it complete. Talk to other dancers, callers and/or cuers for dates, places and times the nominee was involved in statewide participation. Follow the who, what, when and where rules as you investigate and prepare the resume. The more information submitted the better.

The Resume Outline contains the following information: Nominee Name(s), Full Address, Phone Number, Email, Began Dancing-Year, What Dance Club(s) do they belong to, Held Club Office(s) & Dates, Member of which State Association(s), Office(s) Held & Dates, Please explain what the Nominee(s) has done using this format: Who (Names), What (They did [This can be done in resume form or as a story], When – Dates [If the exact date is not available please give the year], Where – Area of the State.

Once the résumé(s) is finished there are two ways in which to present the information to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume(s) may be submitted to the Board of Directors of any of the Five Associations, Callers Association or Cuers Association. The Area or Association Board of Directors will review the resume(s) and vote to reject or pass it on to the Hall of Fame Committee chairman. The resume(s) must be received by the Hall of Fame Committee by January 15th of each year. It is suggested that any association not submit more than two resumes for consideration per year. The Hall of Fame Committee shall meet and review all resume(s) presented and vote by secret ballot before forwarding such resume(s) to the Selection Committee for the final vote. ## WAR IN AMERICA

Subject: Editorial from a Romanian newspaper... An ode to America

Why are Americans so united? They don't resemble one another even if you paint them! They speak all the languages of the world and form an astonishing mixture of civilizations. Some of them are nearly extinct, others are incompatible with one another, and in matters of religious beliefs, not even God can count how many they are. Still, the American tragedy turned three hundred million people into a hand put on the heart. Nobody rushed to accuse the White House, the army, the secret services that they are only a bunch of losers. Nobody rushed to empty their bank accounts. Nobody rushed on the streets nearby to gape about. The Americans volunteered to donate blood and to give a helping hand. After the first moments of panic, they raised the flag on the smoking ruins, putting on T-shirts, caps and ties in the colors of the national flag. They placed flags on buildings and cars as if in every place and on every car a minister or the president was passing. On every occasion they started singing their traditional song: "God Bless America!".

Silent as a rock, I watched the charity concert broadcast on Saturday once, twice, three times, on different TV channels. There were Clint

Eastwood, Willie Nelson, Robert de Niro, Julia Roberts, Cassius Clay, Jack Nicholson, Bruce Springsteen, Silvester Stalone, James Wood, and many others whom no film or producers could ever bring together. The American's solidarity spirit turned them into a choir. Actually, choir is not the word. What you could hear was the heavy artillery of the American soul. What neither George W. Bush, nor Bill Clinton, nor Colin Powell could say without facing the risk of stumbling over words and sounds, was being heard in a great and unmistakable way in this charity concert.

I don't know how it happened that all this obsessive singing of America didn't sound croaky, nationalist, or ostentatious! It made you green with envy because you weren't able to sing for your country without running the risk of being considered chauvinist, ridiculous, or suspected of whoknows-what mean interests.

I watched the live broadcast and the rerun of its rerun for hours listening to the story of the guy who went down one hundred floors with a woman in a wheelchair without knowing who she was, or of the Californian hockey player, who fought with the terrorists and prevented the plane from hitting a target that would have killed other hundreds or thousands of people. How on earth were they able to bow before a fellow human?

Imperceptibly, with every word and musical note, the memory of some turned into a modern myth of tragic heroes. And with every phone call, millions and millions of dollars were put in a collection aimed at rewarding not a man or a family, but a spirit which nothing can buy.

What on earth can unite the Americans in such a way? Their land? Their galloping history? Their economic power? Money? I tried for hours to find an answer, humming songs and murmuring phrases which risk of sounding like commonplaces. I thought things over, but I reached only one conclusion.

The National September 11 Memorial Museum at the World Trade Center bears solemn witness to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 and February 26, 1993. ### Treasurer Report (Dennis Taylor):

The report was presented by Dennis Taylor, as follows:

CFA Income and Expense Summary 1/31/2015 to 5/29/2015 resulted in a net change of -\$449.86. (attached)

Some brief discussion and explanation of line items followed. This report will be filed for audit. (Audit is intended to occur with the changeover to the new board.)

### Area Reports (Ailene Picheco):

Ailene read a brief report from Whirl and Twirl, and also reported that Canaveral Squares will be holding 2 classes next month. No other clubs have provided reports for this period.

## Membership VP Report:

There was no report submitted, however the membership roster is essentially unchanged from that of the last quarter. Ailene began a discussion on ideas to boost membership and more effectively encourage square dancers to join the CFA. Terri Little suggested that we promote the CFA as an organization that works for the betterment of the entire square dance community, and that we should solicit members on the basis of dancers desire to see this continue. (e.g. "Ask not what the CFA and square dancing can do for you, but what you can do for the activity.") Other points were made by others, including more membership drives, and celebrating the upcoming 60th anniversary of the organization in 2017.

### **Insurance Report:**

There are 585 dancers insured through CFA this year / Down from 618 last year

15 CFA clubs are insured through USDA in 2015 / Up from fourteen last year

Balance of funds in the insurance account is \$973.56. (insurance report attached)

## Historian (Jack & Barbara Hoffman):

In 2017, the CFA will be 60 years old. Barbara Hoffman reported that there is considerable material still not collated or assembled into albums,

and she is hoping to begin working on that in the near future. Some discussion followed regarding putting all the information and pictures online, and this idea will be investigated further.

## Florida Federation (Dennis Taylor):

Dennis Taylor reported that the Federation has indicated its support of a 2021 bid for the National Convention, and that an 'intent to bid' will be put forward at the upcoming National Convention. The next Federation meeting will be held November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

## Party Weekend (Randy & Carol Poole):

Randy Poole noted that this year's fundraiser was able to provide \$1745 to the state convention. He also noted that this would probably not be repeated next year, and that another type of fundraiser should be considered. Clubs will continue to get print copies, as will some specific individuals. There is still a need to ensure that we compile an up-to-date email list, and this is in progress. Also KP needs to submit a bill for advertising to the 61st convention.

### 61st State Convention

Jack and Barbara Hoffman declared that this year's state convention was a success, with about492 registered attendees, and a total preliminary indication of profit near \$10000, (although this figure is not yet final). The dangle dances enjoyed great success. A final report will be provided to the Federation in November.

Ailene Picheco expressed CFA's appreciation to the Hoffman's for the great effort by them and all of their team in making the convention a success, and Jack Hoffman in turn thanked all of those many who helped.

The 2016 kickoff was also considered to have been very well done, and generated many ideas for follow up in the ongoing plans for 'Sweet 16'.
