

upcoming dances.



All of us had a great time in Springfield, MA. Now is the time to start thinking about the 2016 convention. Which will be held in the Iowa Events Center, In Des Moines, Iowa. Contrary to what most people think Iowa is not all-flat land, we have rolling hills and tall bluffs to see and enjoy. Along the Missouri River by Council Bluffs, for example, are the Loess Hills, one of the few naturally occurring wind-blown silt deposits from thousands of years ago.

Des Moines is at the cross roads of interstate 80 which is a major east west highway system. If you want to see scenery along the way we have listed 10 alternate routes using two lane roads to get to Des Moines. They are listed on our website, 65nsdc.org.

Des Moines is also easy to get to by air. We have a very modern International Airport, which has 18 direct flights in an out of the city, and is only 6 miles from the Iowa Events Center. There is also a Mega bus that links 120 major cities for really low prices. One of the stops is only a few blocks for the Events Center.

We have listed several of our best hotels on the back of our registration form. All will be linked by the purchase of a bus pass. A majority of these hotels are also linked by a skywalk, which is climate controlled, which are also linked to the Iowa Events Center.

For those of you camping we will be using the Iowa State Fair Campground with 1600 sites, many of them are full hookups. It has mature trees on gently rolling land; you may need lumber to level your RV.

Parking at the Events Center at \$7.00. There are other parking spaces around the Events Center as well.

The Events Center has four names; depending on which direction you approach it from, Veterans Memorial Auditorium, Community Choice Credit Union Convention Center, HyVee Hall and Iowa Hall of Pride.

The Events Center has 4 floors, which will be used for the convention. The 300 numbered rooms will be used for Education Seminars, Panels and Clinics, with some of these rooms will also offer dancing, lines, hexagons, clogging, contra, rounds, advanced, challenge, DBD, high energy and low energy. Other areas will offer the Live Band, Fashion Show, Exhibitions, Showcase of Ideas, Sew & Save and more.

Registration will be located in part of the Memorial Hall; this is the main entrance to the convention center, which is the 3rd floor. Ways & Means, Information, Tours, Lost & Found are some of the other items that can be found at this location.

When not dancing visit our Capitol Building, it is the only five domed Capitol in the country, one of the domes is gold plated with 24 karat gold leaf and the other four domes have gold on them near the very top.

Another place you may want to visit is our historic governor's mansion, Terrace Hill. The family lives on the second floor. Construction began in 1866 and was finished in 1869 at a total cost of \$250,000. The tower is 90 feet tall.

We also have a genuine English King's Manor House, the Salisbury House. It was brought over from England stone by stone. It was moved by cosmetic magnet Carl Weeks in the 1920's. It has 42 rooms and is over 20,000 square feet.

During the end of the week of our convention (Friday, Saturday & Sunday) downtown Des Moines will host a Juried Art Festival featuring 190 of the nation's best artists selected from a competitive jury process. There is live music and we have applied to do a square dance demonstration as part of the entertainment.

We will be offering a golf tournament on Wednesday, June 22, from 9 to

4. This will include bus transportation to and from, 18 holes with lunch and prizes. Check the tour brochure or go online for more details.

If you arrive early or want to stay late you may want to visit: Adventureland Amusement & Water Park (Pools, fun rides, food vendors entertainment and amazing water slides.

Another reason to attend the 65th National Square Dance Convention is the Midwestern Hospitality. Although Des Moines is a major city, metropolitan area, of 500,000, it is composed of mostly small town comfort.

We are #1 as the best city for young professionals according to Forbes Magazine; 5th best city for retirement across the nation; and 6th best state to retire in, both according to Bankrate.

We know it's the number one place to square dance in 2016!

Dancers Who Have Returned Home



Paul Andrew Kurek II was born on June 6, 1943 at West Point, NY. His father was a military attaché, so Paul spent most of his younger years abroad. His favorite memories seemed about the years they spent in Turkey.

When Paul was 13, his father retired from the Army and they lived near Patrick Air Force Base. Paul graduated from Melbourne High in 1962. He married, had two children, and divorced after 30 years of marriage.

He later met the lady who became his second wife. Her job brought them to Saint Cloud. She died early in 2011, with instructions to her own grown sons that they encourage Paul to find another female companion because he wasn't capable of surviving on his own!

Paul went online, where he met Ellen Bell, an avid square dancer. Having never learned to dance any kind of dance, Paul watched carefully, went to lessons at two different clubs simultaneously, and learned to dance both Mainstream and Plus between September 2011 and Christmas – even though he had a part of his colon removed on Thanksgiving Day that year!

Paul fought the cancer from that time on, all the while continuing to dance and take round dance and Advanced lessons. He was taken to hospice two days after the last time he danced and lost his final battle two and a half weeks later.

He will be remembered by all the square and round dancers he knew for his encouraging words and hard work on behalf of dancers throughout Central Florida.

During his final weeks, he greatly enjoyed the visits, cards, phone calls, etc. Any time we had square dancers visiting, he was looking for a caller and enough people to make a square! He was his sweet and loving self until the very end and much loved by all the hospice staff.

He requested a memorial square and round dance in lieu of a funeral. The dance was free and open to all dancers regardless of club affiliations.

(TV Commercials - Videos)

Electronic media is growing as a way for people to communicate - - including advertising. The explosion of "home grown" videos on YouTube has been amazing. We have been advised by marketing experts to investigate and implement

electronic media for publicity of our activity and as a way to exchange ideas and information.

The Re-Image Project has recognized the importance and power of electronic communications and has established both a Live-Lively web site and Face Book page. The potential benefits of using available electronic media resources is hard to calculate, but there is universal agreement they are huge and widespread.

Now for the BIG QUESTION - - What can you do to help?

The answer is simple - - You can create short HD videos (30 Seconds or less) which will be edited and used to create a TV commercial promoting Square Dancing. The idea would be to video someone in a "Lively" activity such as running, swimming, playing tennis, basketball, some other active sport, and numerous other possibilities.

The video would show a person either during the activity or at the finish. The video would show the person and the person would say something like: "I SQUARE DANCE!" or "I JUST FINISHED A 10K RUN AND I SQUARE DANCE!" You get the idea. We are looking for high resolution videos which will be edited into clips for a TV commercial.

We must have the name and correct spelling of the person in the video.

IMPORTANT - The person must acknowledge, on the video, that they are being recorded for use in a commercial to promote square dancing.

PLEASE PROVIDE THE CORRECT SPELLING OF SUBJECT'S NAME.

One way to provide the name is to include the correct spelling in the title of the video file. An example would be: "John Smith - Swimming." However you decide to provide the name - it is very important. Without the person's name and their acknowledgement, we will not be able to use the video.

Michael Streby, an expert video editor, will add a voice track at the end of the commercial to include "Live Lively - Square Dance" and "Visit You2candance.com for information in your area" or words to that effect.

Michael will be doing the editing and creating the commercial. If this project goes well, there may be more than one commercial.

There are several possibilities to get the videos to Michael:

- 3) Michael can provide a link to an FTP site

ROUND DANCING — CHOREOGRAPHED BALLROOM WHAT IS ROUND DANCING?

Round dancing is choreographed and cued ballroom dancing. We dance most of the popular ballroom rhythms, such as foxtrot and waltz, chacha and rumba, and many others listed in the navigation bar to the left. This is a pretty long list. There is certainly no need to get bored with round dancing.

The exciting difference between round dancing and free-style ballroom dancing is that each round dance has been fully choreographed ahead of time. A beautiful piece of music is selected, and the different steps or figures are chosen to fit the music exactly. If the music swells and pauses briefly, then a dance step that rises and stretches is put into that place. If there is a little syncopation in another part of the song, then a quick little step is inserted. The creation of a piece of choreography is

like engineering a machine, with every gear and lever in just the right place to give smooth and flowing motion. The step-by-step instructions on how to dance this choreography is written out in what is called a "cue sheet."

Second, there is a cuer or leader at the front of the ballroom who tells the dancers what steps to do. As the music plays, and just ahead of the beat, so the dancers have time to respond, the cuer names each dance figure in the choreography. The cueing lets us dance lots and lots of dances without having to memorize the choreography. You may recognize that this is the way square dancing is done, with a caller telling the couples what to do: "swing your partner, do-si-do." In round dancing, the cuer might say: "open telemark, pick up, and diamond turn."

But compare this round dancing with free-style ballroom. In ballroom dancing, the man has to think of what figures he wants to do to this music and then he has to lead the woman to do those figures. Most men just aren't that sharp—to do at least three things at the same time: think up the choreography, make his feet do what he has thought up, and lead the lady to do it with him. When I ballroom dance, I can usually think of maybe a half-dozen different things to do, and then we do them over and over. Meredith whispers, "let's do something different," but my mind is a blank.

So, for the man, the round dance cuer is a savior. Someone else has thought up what steps should be done to this particular piece of music. The choreographer has carefully studied the music ahead of time and has selected just the steps that best fit each measure of music, and the cuer reminds us of what we should do as we dance. Instead of only 6 or 8 different steps, that I could think of myself, a round dance might easily have 30 or 40 different figures. No, we certainly don't get bored doing the same steps, over and over again.

And then the next dance of the evening will contain a different selection of figures, arranged in still different sequences. The CALLERLAB Mission Statement is: To foster the art of square dance calling, and improve caller skills.

The History of CALLERLAB

In the years immediately following World War II one leader emerged - Dr. Lloyd Shaw of Colorado Springs. Dr. Shaw attracted hundreds of callers to his summer

seminars and set the future direction of square dancing. In 1971, seeing a need for unified caller-leadership, Bob Osgood brought together eleven members of the Square Dance Hall of Fame to form CALLERLAB.

Their initial goals included:

- Put the Dance back into square dancing
- Establish standardization for calls.
- Provide adequate training for callers.



Square Dance

The original group grew to the 23 callers who became the first Board of Governors and convened the first CALLERLAB Convention in 1974. One of the strongest challenges facing this new organization was to stem the flood of new calls that had brought frustration to dancers and callers alike. The result was the Mainstream list of calls, established in 1975 and accepted throughout the world. The following narrative history of the development of CALLERLAB was written by Lee Helsel, Arnie Kronenberger, Bob Osgood and Bob Van Antwerp.

STATE JOINS USDA

February 1982 is the 25th Anniversary of the founding of the Central Florida Square & Round Dance Association. It was organized in February 1957 and held its first dance on March 16th of that year. Many changes have taken place since that time but the Association has never wavered from its original goals.

If you become completely lost:

Do not turn around. This will make it difficult for someone behind you to help you recover. It is much easier to guide someone into place by guiding them from the back

Turn your head in all directions to see where you should go; and, if someone says to turn around or you see that you Page 2

should turn around, then do it. Otherwise, retain your facing direction and let someone guide you into place.

Do not wander around. Stay put until someone either guides you into place or tells you to go to a certain point. And do not be surprised that you get this help—expect that you will get it and be ready to respond to it quickly.

Florida Federation Hall of Fame

January 15, 2016

is the Deadline to Submit Nominations to the Hall of Fame. For info: http://www.floridasquaredance.com/halloffame/index.php

Nominees must have a minimum of 10 years statewide involvement in the Florida Square and Round Dance activity. Their contributions must encompass the entire state of Florida, not just 1 or 2 areas. This should require unselfish dedication of time and labor. Being an area president, Federation president, Caller/Cuer Association president and/or State Convention chairman is not enough. The Hall of Fame is seeking individuals or couples whose efforts have affected the majority of the State of Florida. The fact that one is nominated is a very high honor, whether or not they enter the Hall of Fame.

Preparing a nominating resume will take some time and investigation to make it complete. Talk to other dancers, callers and/or cuers for dates, places and times the nominee was involved in statewide participation. Follow the who, what, when and where rule as you investigate and prepare the resume. The more information submitted, the better.

Once the resume is finished there are two ways in which to present the information to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume may be submitted to the board of directors of any of the five area associations, Callers Association or Cuers Association. The area or association board of directors will review the resume and vote to reject or pass it on to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume may also be sent to the Hall of Fame committee chairman. Resumes must be received by the Hall of Fame committee by January 15th of each year. It is suggested that any association not submit more than 2 resumes for consideration per year. The Hall of Fame Committee shall meet and review all resumes presented and vote by secret ballot to forward such resumes to the Selection Committee for the final vote.

All resumes should be submitted to the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee on or before January 15th.

DANCING: Astaire Way to the Stars

Whether you are feeling low or up on a high, consider dancing. It relieves stress. It helps you celebrate a pay raise. It enables you to shed your aggressions, if you have any, or to let the emotions take over on a cloudy day.

Psychiatry has long known that a good dance is sound therapy. It is getting fresh emphasis in Europe, especially in Germany. Neurologists at Bonn University, experimenting with jazz dancing, expect good results — not cures, of course, but better physical health and mental relaxation.

Any of us stylish dancers could have told them all they want to know just for the asking. We are the graduates of jitterbugging, the big apple, and the Lindy. Before that there was the Charleston.

We could also polka, waltz, Irish jig and SQUARE DANCE. For my own part I had to draw the line at rock. Unless you are young and supple, it can get you a slipped discotheque.

Cave drawings believed 20,000 years old depict what may have been the first dancers. Every civilization has or has had its dances, although I have not noted one for the Eskimos.

Cherokees do the rain dance, the corn dance, and the youth dance. It is impossible to tell which is which, but it makes the

Cherokee happy. Another oldie is the hula which Hawaiians insist on teaching to tourists.

There have been times, though, when dancing drew an official frown. Nearly 50 years ago, the Methodist Episcopal Church stated doctrinally: "We lift up a solmen note of warning and entreaty against dancing." This was the era of the shimmy, so perhaps they were right.

I once knew a football coach who required his players to attend recitals by campus male dancers to learn graceful techniques in open-field running.

Dancing as a tradition is thousands of years old in parts of Asia. In some instances the dance was a part of religiour ritual. The dancers wore elaborate costumes and grotesque masks, or makeup, and danced all night.

In the Middle Ages there was something called the chain dance. It began among the unwashed peasants and spread to the perfumed gentry. Such were the beginnings of modern folk dances and the square dance.

If therapeutic dancing can make sick folk feel better and well folk better still, then on with the dance! And don't let us find anyone confining joy!


