



nights).

I have it on good authority from Julie Franciskato and Sheila Reid that the Dangle Dances are going to be a blast! Make sure you don't miss the fun!

Candy Grams are being sold now around the state for \$2 each. Look for someone carrying a purple CandyGram bag. If a Candy Gram has been bought for you, you will find your name posted outside the Fun Hall. Candy Grams will be delivered in the Fun Hall to dancers Saturday night. What a nice way to support the Convention and say, "Thank you," "I like you," "You're a great caller/cuer," "You're really cute," or even "I love you."

The line dance instructor for the Convention weekend is a major leaguer in the line dance world. Dave Seay is coming to us all the way from Williston, FL. Dave became interested in line dancing ten years ago through a community line dance class, and now he's been teaching for three years. He plans to teach three line dances on Friday and three different ones on Saturday. No partners needed. What fun!

The Contra instructor is a celebrity in her own right, Susie Rudder, and she hails from Micanopy, FL. Susie was a clogger from way back, started attending contra calling workshops, and now she's been calling contras for over thirty years! In contra, the dancers form two parallel lines running the length of the hall. Couples dance a sequence of moves, eventually dancing with every other couple in the set. Many of the basic moves are similar to those in square dancing. Each dance is taught by the caller before it is danced, and the caller prompts the dancers as needed.

The Zumba® Fitness instructor is the superstar Sarah Beth Pergrossi from Trenton, FL. You might also know of her husband Charlie Pergrossi, the Caller Chairman for the 2016 Convention. In 2009, Sarah Beth's journey of getting fit and losing 110 pounds resulted in her

becoming a Zumba® Fitness instructor. She started teaching Zumba® Fitness classes almost five years ago and now teaches twelve classes a week. She is certified in many levels of Zumba® Fitness, and her classes Convention will be low impact and designed to cater to the needs of all ages and abilities. 

The Vendor Committee is a very important function at any National Square Dance Convention. It contributes greatly to the financial success of the convention and is quite important to the dancers as fewer and fewer communities have square dance shops where one can shop close to home. With this in mind, when Barry & Anita Johnson, Chairmen of the Business Committee, asked us to chair this function, we thought long and hard before accepting the position of Vice-Chairmen of Vendors. We finally did in 2012, almost 4 full years before our 2016 convention.

You can check with Barry & Anita as to why they pursued us but we guess the fact that we both will have attended 30 or more nationals by next June and were Vendor and Facilities Chairmen of Illinois State Square Dance Conventions for more than 20 years had something to do with it. We in turn when seeking out our committee members have sought experienced people who have been around the national and state convention scene, have had experience with vendors and are fast learners and good workers. We now have such a team and we'd like to share a little of their background with you.

Our Directors of Vendor Security are Art & Wanda Kruse. They live in the St. Louis, Missouri, area. Art began dancing in 1973 and Wanda in 1981. They were the Assistant General Chairman of the 42nd National Square Dance Convention (St. Louis in 1993) and have danced at most nationals since then. They have also chaired two St. Louis area

Jamborees and will be serving as the Services Chairman for the 67th NSDC to be held in Kansas City in 2018. As Directors of Vendor Security their responsibility is to help keep the Vendor area safe and secure from the time Vendors begin to arrive until they're on their way back home.

Another of the Vendor Committee's big jobs is to help the Vendors move in, park their rigs and move out of the IEC in a safe, orderly and efficient manner. Therefore, our move-in and move-out committee is another key function. Our Directors of this committee are Bob Dahnert and June Mycklebust; they hale from DeForest, Wisconsin. Bob and Iune have been dancing together since they met when Bob took lessons 27 years ago and June was one of his Angels. They have attended most national and state conventions since Bob graduated. Bob assisted on the Anaheim (1988) vendor committee and with security at Minnesota. At many Nationals they have been models in the style show and June has worked at the Sewing Clinic. They served as General Chairmen for the 2011 Wisconsin State convention. They have also worked with vendors at several state conventions. In their current role they have attended the last 3 nationals, our Pre-Convention meeting in Des Moines and several other important meetings as well as site visits in Des Moines so that we can become as knowledgeable as possible about the IEC facility.

Working with them are Scott & Brenda Deal of Iron Ridge, Wisconsin. Scott's been square dancing for 36 years, Brenda for 4 ½ years. After marrying and moving back to Wisconsin from California, Scott convinced Brenda to take square dance lessons. Following graduation, they became quite active at the club level as well as state and national level (currently the USDA Secretary). They are the webmasters for their area association, Wisconsin state and the WI State Square Dance Convention. This year they will be the Registration Chairman for the WI State Convention.

They have also really gotten into their Vendor jobs quickly. Since accepting their positions, they have attended the last two nationals spending many hours learning the ropes in the Vendor Hall, earning their club leadership certification at the Little Rock National and assisting with the sign-up of 2016 vendors while attending the 2015 National in Springfield. They also attended our 3-day Pre-Convention meeting as well as other meetings held in Des Moines.

More recently recruited to work with Bob, June, Scott and Brenda are Paul and Gloria Van Rooy. They live and dance in Madison, Wisconsin. They have been dancing for about 12 years and have attended every state convention since they graduated. They've been part of the state convention management team for three of those conventions and have attended three National Conventions—Des Moines will be their fourth.

In case you haven't noticed, our entire Vendor Committee lives outside of the State of Iowa (calling Illinois, Missouri and Wisconsin home) but in June we'll all be Iowans. Three of our five couples met through square dancing. If you add all of our national square dance convention attendance together, you'll come up with something close to 175 years amongst the ten of us! We feel honored to have some of the best and experienced committee members we could possibly have to help us with this important responsibility.

What will the Vendors have to offer you? We have worked hard to bring you as many vendors as possible, offering a wide selection of apparel, shoes, jewelry, badges and engraving, square dance publications, audio equipment, records, tapes, CD/DVDs, and other novelties we hope you will find interesting. Closer to convention time when our vendor list is finalized, we hope to provide a list of specific vendors you can patronize while in Des Moines. For now, just plan to bring plastic and start saving your cash! The Vendors will love you.

The Vendors will open their doors on Thursday morning at 10:00 AM in Hall A of the Iowa Event Center and will remain open all day and into the evening Thursday, Friday and Saturday. We will need the names of everyone going on the Tour to **John Deere** two days prior to the tour date, so please get your reservations in early because we will have to cut it off by the end of the day Monday, June 20th, 2016.

We are really looking forward to having all of you here to see our city and have so much fun Dancing.

In my last article I told you a lot about the Owners and Producers of our amazingly energetic Special Event with Vocal Trash. If you missed it you can go back online and see the previous E-Magazines.

There will be several places within the Iowa Events Center where you can get what you want to eat and the prices will be much less than what we could provide a meal for you. So we kept the price down on our Special Event and I think you will be able to get a meal and the Show for less than previous years.

We have many Tours for you to choose from. The **World Food Prize** has indicated they want to know how many people we are bringing one month or 30 days before the tour so please get your reservations in before May 23, 2016.

We have five tours that no one has registered for and they are all amazing tours. Our **W2- Living History Farms** Tour offers so much about our past to the present of Iowa and may have some interaction for those guests if you care to indulge. Sometimes they have samples at the areas they are baking pies or other scrumptious eats.

W1 – Golf at Toad Valley has been planned by Jim "Who" Logan at one of our beautiful Golf Courses and was requested by several people. You will play 18 holes and I believe there will be prizes for different categories and you may be surprised what the categories are. We also have a

box lunch scheduled there so anytime there is food involved in a tour we need reservations **early** so they know how many to prepare.

W3 – Adventureland Amusement and Water Park is a wonderful place if you are young at heart or have younger people with you. The water park area is so much fun and there are other water rides in the park as well as rides for smaller children and for those that are more daring. Do you remember the Bumper Cars? They are there and the Merry Go Round is always a favorite for everyone and the Train for all ages that goes around the park. There are some amazing shows you won't want to miss so check your program right away so you know what time to be at them. They provide a relaxing time to eat at one of the many places of different types of food.

F3 – **Terrace Hill** / **Salisbury House** are places in Des Moines if you have never been a must to see. **Terrace Hill** is our Governors Mansion is a true treasure and has hosted guests from around the world. Our own John Martinez, a Brick Layer, repaired stone work on this building and along the windows by the pool. This was built by BF Allen a Railroad tycoon and banker. It is a beautiful building with Stain glass windows and oriental carpeting and native Black Walnut woodwork. This building has different holiday events including Halloween and Christmas each year as well as tours.

Carl Weeks once wrote, "If you dream it, you can build it." He and his wife Edith set out to do just that. During a 1921 visit to Salisbury, England, the Weeks's encountered the Kings House, a fifteenth-century manor. They knew immediately they had found the inspiration for their Des Moines home.

Groundbreaking took place in 1923. Five years passed before construction was complete. Salisbury House remained home for the Weeks family—Carl, Edith and their four sons—until 1954. At that time, Salisbury House was purchased by the Iowa State Education Association (ISEA), and served as their headquarters until 1998.

During the late 1990s, the house, grounds, and collections were purchased by the **Salisbury House Foundation**. The property was then converted into a historic house museum. Thousands have passed through the house's great arched doors and come away awed by its architecture and extensive collections of artwork, rare books, and artifacts.

The not-for-profit **Des Moines Art Center** engages diverse local and international audiences with the art of today through its museum and school, adding to the cultural record through collections and programs. **Baru** at the Art Center serves lunch overlooking the Des Moines Art Center's Maytag Courtyard and Reflecting Pool.

Our Saturday **S2- City Tour** with an hour off the bus to see and shop the ArtFest Midwest "**The Other Art Show**," is Iowa's largest fine art show. ArtFest is held indoors in the Varied Industries Building at the Iowa State Fairgrounds, the same weekend as the downtown art show. 240 artists will be participating - approximately 40% from Iowa and 90% from the Midwest. ArtFest is offered as an alternative, affordable fine art show - a compliment to the downtown art show. An extensive array of free children's entertainment will be offered as well - our expanded "KidzDuArt" area - all day hands on art for kids and their parents!

So you see all of these tours are wonderful tours so get your reservations in **early**. We still have room on all of our tours but remember if there is food involved or even some places require a certain deadline for us to get number to them such as if they have to get tour guides for a certain amount of people. **Please Register Early!**

We have a change in the **F2 – Boat Ride** With Lunch on our Tour Brochure. Please be aware of this change. The Boat has left the port and is now docked at Rathbun Lake in Moravia, IA. We will still honor this tour at the same price. It will be a little longer tour leaving from the Iowa Events Center Friday, June 24, 2016 at 10:00 AM instead of 11:00 AM and returning at 5:00 PM instead of 4:30 PM. You will still go to the Botanical Center before returning to the Iowa Events Center. This should be a beautiful tour on Lake Rathbun. It is one of the larger lakes in Iowa Over 700 campsites are available at this 11,000-acre lake in the rolling hills of southern Iowa. Excellent camping, fishing, hunting, boating, state fish hatchery, and Honey Creek Resort, are major attractions.

We have some Tours that have limited space so please get your reservations in **early**. We have many wonderful Tour choices for you so please check out our Tour Brochure or online at 65nsdc.org and book the tours of your choice.

At the 65th National Square Dance Convention we plan to cut the tours off one hour before they depart so please get your reservations in **early**. This is to give us time to make sure we have everyone registered on the list and at the departure sight and our Treasurer will be able to give us checks for each place we are visiting to pay for them.

Please be at the Tour Desk in the Iowa Events Center 15 minutes before the departure time of your tour.

Our Fashion Show will be spectacular. We have wonderful decorations planned to enhance the models and not distract from them. We have wonderful pre-show light music by Jack O'Leary and some songs during the show by Barry Peck written to fit the theme in the show. The Isiserettes are a non-profit group organized in 1980 to give Des Moines area youth something exciting and positive to do. The Isiserettes are composed of both males and females ranging from the ages of 7 to 18 years old. Two of the major goals set for the youth are to build character and social skills. They pride themselves on the ability to expose the group to other diverse communities and environments different from their own. The Isiserettes have traveled throughout the State of Iowa as well as the United States serving as ambassadors for the Black Community, City of Des Moines and the State of Iowa. They have marched in both of President Obama's presidential parades in Washington, D.C., as well as local parades, sporting events and other occasions. The team has been awarded numerous trophies and awards for their performances. The drill and drum corp is an exciting group of young people you won't want to miss.



"Last Square Standing" Fun Dance Rules & Process

- a. Dance level will be Mainstream. Any calls from the "Mainstream" list may and will be called during the dance.
- b. Square dancing will be fifteen (15) minutes of Patter.
- c. Each square must be in constant movement during the dance.
 - d. If any "Square's Judge" finds the participants of his/hers square have broken down, the Judge will then raise a yellow flag and give the square a count of ten (10), out loud, to the beat of the music to allow the participants the time to get back into place. If they can repair their square and resume dancing without forming lines, they can continue the dance. This will only be allowed to happen one (1) time for each square. If they cannot repair the square, the Judge will black flag the square letting them know they should leave the floor as their participation in the dance is finished.
 - e. If after thirty (30) minutes, more than one square is remaining, the Fun Dance Callers will call for another fifteen (15) minutes, but will increase the difficulty level (still at the Mainstream level).
 - f. In the event of a tie after forty-five (45) minutes, the squares will continue for five (5) minutes with even more increased level of difficulty (but still Mainstream level). The first square to get a yellow flag will be 2nd place and the remaining square will be the

Conclusion

The most dangerous phrase in the language is:

"We've always done it this way." -Rear Admiral Grace Hopper

I want to begin by writing that I actually posted this article on the Square Dance News Facebook forum and I got some feedback. It is amazing how similar things are so different in certain parts of the globe. What may work nicely for one club in a particular area may actually be an epic fail at another club in a totally different area. We are all promoting the same product, but in many different and unique ways.

The trick to fun night is to let the new dancers have so much fun that they continue to come back. Here are three ways that have been done before (thousands of times) and each of them have worked rather well and have also failed miserably. After each Fun Night idea, I have put in my two cents worth. I would really enjoy hearing some of your success stories as well as your trial and error stories for a future article.

Fun night #1 Invite all the new dancers on the floor to dance a beginner party dance. Then the club dances, then a club round dance, then back to

the new dancers.

Cory's Comments: This may have worked nicely back in the past when there seemed to be a lot more socializing. Three kinds of people...those who want to socialize and enjoy the breaks. Then there are the folks that just want to dance. Thirdly, there are the dancers who do a little and a lot of both. Here are a couple of things that I need to ask and inquire about with Fun Night #1.

Why isn't the round dance a beginner rounds? Bingo Waltz is excellent mixer because you are learning some square dance moves as well. Cincinnati Waltz on Blue Star Records is another good one using basic calls. Also, new dancers would be sitting out for well over 15 minutes by the time they get back to the new dancer tip with this kind of a layout. That's too long of a wait for new dancers on a fun night.

Fun night #2 Invite all the new dancers to square dance. Every third tip of the evening is PLUS program for the club. Have a round dance demonstration about half-time during the dance.

Cory's Comments: This is a nice idea because the new dancers won't be sitting out as much. Round dance demo is good, but should be introduced as 'a close friend to square dancing' so the novice knows what they will be seeing on the dance floor. Every third tip for club is much better than the old 'class, club, class, club' routine. Remember, you want to get new faces into square dancing, but you also want to retain the current smiling faces you already have committed to coming week after week. Some clubs have it designed as an 'all skate' for the first full hour, and then showcase some of the other styles and programs of dancing during the second hour. What may flow well for some, may not for others. This is where your caller's programming, showmanship and instructing will either flourish or flop. Work as a team!

Fun night #3 Everyone, beginners and veterans, dances easy-level Community Dance Program for the entire evening. Introduce and incorporate basic Round and Line dancing as well (if your club dances those styles) No demonstrations of Plus dancing and no showcasing/showboating either. New dancers get the opportunity to dance every tip all night long with graduate dancers.

Cory's Comments: This would be ideal!!!!.... but we all know some 'angel' dancers want to dance some kind of an 'Exchange of some sort of Gears' at some time during the course of the evening. I really like the idea

of the first 10-12 basics all night long. I also feel that the angel dancers deserve some type of 'reward' for helping with the newbies all night.

So, perhaps a graduate dancer star tip at half-time? Or maybe after announcements? It's not for showing off, but I do think the newer dances need to see what is in store for them. When I have gone to my daughter's gym classes and even Karate classes there are always experienced people there helping the new-comers, but there is always someone more advanced in their art or craft practicing in the background or on the sidelines. This shows me what I'm getting myself into.

These are just 3 different kinds of stories and scenarios with Fun Nights. I will bet there are a lot more creative ideas out there. I hope and pray, because we need more brainstorming. With some of the feedback I have received, here are a few more notes.

Many clubs still offer the FREE night for FUN night, but some do not. Some clubs charge their regular fee. This is because they have expenses to pay. I've also heard club members say to 'charge everyone' because 'these new dancers won't be coming back after tonight' and they need to pay as well.

Cory's Comments: Okay, 'WHY won't the dancers come back?' is the question to that remark. Is it because for the last few years you only see a large group at the fun nights and then when the actual sessions begin people don't return? There are some really great ideas out there for consolidation of calls lists that are being experimented around the map.

Some clubs dance in casual clothing for their fun nights and their classes. They feel that they don't want to segregate the new comers from the experienced dancers by dressing up in square wear.

Cory's Comments: Dress however you'd like. Whatever you are comfortable wearing. If you are a square wear dancer, dress up. If you are a casual clothing dancer, dress down. I know of a few clubs that have gone and made shirts with their club banner decal on it, which really looks sharp. That way the newbies will still know who the club members are. Final thought....Did you know some clubs offer a FUN NIGHT 4 or 5 times a year instead of just once or twice?

Cory's Comments: This is great!!! You can reel them in once you've got them hooked, and you don't have to say... "I'm sorry, new square dance sessions don't start back up until the fall time."
