ARE YOU A HIGH LEVEL DANCER? READ THIS!

Attention All Zip Coder Readers/Subscribers

As you will note, the December 2019 issue of the Zip Coder has fewer articles, ads and general information than past issues. What you can't see is that we now have fewer subscribers than ever before.

The combination of the above aspects makes the Zip Coder not viable on a continued basis. Stated differently, the Zip Coder cannot pay for the ongoing publication costs involved in producing the magazine. To date, the publishers have not profited from the publication – in fact we have supported it through a stipend from Express Press.

In order for us to continue publishing future Zip Coders, we need the following: • We need at least 92 additional subscribers; (or renewals*) • We must have a minimum of seven paying advertisers per issue; • We need authors to contribute articles – at least 8, 9 or 10 per issue.

We, Dave & Becky, truly hate to ask for these things to happen, but without them, we cannot continue to publish the Zip Coder. If we can accomplish the three bullet points above by the time of the March publication (February 14, 2020) we can continue.

How can we achieve this? It won't be easy, but here is the way we see it:

1. The most obvious way is for everyone to do your part. True, we can't all write articles, but you can encourage someone you know (a caller, tape group leader, club officer, etc.) to pen something. Even a short missive will help; 2. The same goes for advertisers – we don't all have something to promote, but we all know someone who does (a weekend dance, a special dance, equipment to sell, a cruise, a new club, etc.); 3. Finally, ask friends and other fellow dancers to subscribe (don't share your copy, promote the Zip Coder at your dances, ask your caller to subscribe – there are always articles for callers in each issue). You get the idea – we are all in this together and if we all work at it, we can save the Zip Coder. A badge and a bar will be awarded to participants after they have visited at least 12 states. The goal is to dance in all 50 states and any participant who visits 48 or 50 states will also be awarded paid admission to the next National Square Dance Convention.

But D Found a Better Rate Online... By Amy Gray

Or I missed the deadline for the room block, or the room block was full. These are all comments I have heard from dancers who attend square dance festivals and weekends in regards to staying 'in the room block' at the host hotels.

As an organizer of several weekends, I can assure you that juggling the costs of a weekend is challenging. One of the ways that weekend costs are offset is by 'nights consumed' at the host hotel. The nights consumed often times help reduce the price of the dancing spaces and/or caller accommodations. The catch though is that while you may be staying at the host hotel, if you don't stay in the room block, your 'nights consumed' won't count toward offsetting the weekend's venue expenses.

At a weekend I recently attended, approximately 15 rooms were booked at the host hotel, but not in the room block. The weekend didn't receive any credit for approximately 45 'nights consumed' because the rooms weren't booked within the room block.

So what can you do to help?

- Make sure, when calling the host hotel, to book in the room block assigned to the weekend.
- If you are told that the room block is full, check with the weekend organizer to make sure you are receiving accurate information from the hotel.
- Reserve your room early; even if you aren't 100% sure you will attend, as hotel reservations can usually be cancelled without penalty within a few days prior to the weekend.

I know that staying in a hotel, especially for 3 or more nights can be costly, but please consider the part you play in supporting the weekend by helping keep costs and registration fees as low as possible before choosing an alternate hotel or a lesser rate at the host hotel. Supporting your favorite weekends in this way will help keep them active and successful for years to come.



Changing Times: The Future of Yellow Rock

In recent years we have seen a sharp rise in sexual harassment issues in the news, including confidential agreements, high profile trials, and resignations of people in prominent positions.

What is and is not sexual harassment is a subject of widespread debate.

Yellow Rock, including variations with other names, has been part of the square dance activity for over 50 years. This name for hugging was invented by a caller calling at Yellow Rock Barn outside of Kansas City, MO. For decades people considered Yellow Rock harmless fun and a way to increase friendliness in square dancing. But in these changing times of sexual harassment focus, it may be time to take another look at Yellow Rock.

The Board of Governors (25 callers) of CALLERLAB did so at a recent annual convention, where considerable time was devoted to a discussion of the issue. Male members, who comprise a majority of the Board, were genuinely concerned about whether they could be accused of sexual harassment if they called Yellow Rock. In addition, they worried whether they could be accused if they themselves gave someone a Yellow Rock.

Female members of the Board described their experiences of appropriate and inappropriate Yellow Rocks that they had received over the years. It quickly became clear that there is a fine line between appropriate and inappropriate hugging, and that this line is different for each person - both the giver and the receiver of the Yellow Rock.

Male callers were concerned that they might be reported to CALLERLAB for an ethics violation if they call Yellow Rock, even though there is currently nothing specific on this topic in the CALLERLAB Code of Ethics. They were also concerned they might be reported if they gave a Yellow Rock to someone -- reported either by the person who received the Yellow Rock or by someone viewing the action from across the room.

More on Yellow Rock. It was suggested that callers take a poll of their home clubs, to see if people liked Yellow Rock. But it was quickly noted that unless this was a secret ballot, no one would vote against it because such a stand could cause embarrassment and be perceived as unfriendly. Also, if just one person voted against Yellow Rock, that person might possibly claim sexual harassment in the future, based on that person's definition of what is appropriate.

One caller said he only calls Yellow Rock with the original partner. This was fine decades ago, when most couples were married. But he recognized that in this day of so many singles dancing with various people during a dance, this is probably no longer appropriate.


The story was told of a well-known caller who started a large beginners class. This caller recognized that the personal space of new dancers was much larger than those who have danced a long time, so he intentionally never showed Yellow Rock until later in class. This caller had to miss the third night of class, and the replacement caller showed Yellow Rock. The next week half the class had quit, because their personal space had been invaded in a manner unacceptable to them.

Bottom line. The Board took no vote on this issue, and callers are free to call Yellow Rock as they wish. But many callers on the Board said they had already stopped calling Yellow Rock, and others said they planned to do so. They all agreed it was just a no-win situation for them. So, while Yellow Rock will not be going away, it is likely to be used far less in the future. When you notice that the use of Yellow Rock is in decline, remember the observations made here and you will know the reason.

A note to callers. At the meeting, male callers asked the female callers what to do if a woman walks up to you with arms outstretched, obviously wanting a Yellow Rock. This can happen at any time during a dance, and especially in a "thank you line" at the end of a dance. If the male caller steps forward too far (in the mind of the woman), it could be considered an aggressive move. But if he does not move at all, this could be considered unfriendly. What to do?

Answer from the female callers: The male caller should turn his body sideways 90 degrees - this will cause the woman to turn her body to face the same direction as the man. Then the man puts his arm around the woman's back and gives a half hug. The female callers said this was a perfect solution.

Likewise, if a male approaches a female caller with arms outstretched, the female caller can turn sideways 90 degrees and give a half hug. This keeps her in control of the situation.

ARE YOU DANCING UNINSURED?

REAL FACTS ABOUT THE SQUARE DANCE INSURANCE PROGRAM

THE BASICS:

Every square dance organization needs General Liability and Accidental Medical Expense coverage while conducting and sponsoring dance activities. As closely as safety rules are followed, accidents can and will happen. This insurance program, especially designed for USDA dance groups, provides Accident Medical insurance, which helps protect club members from financial loss due to a covered accidental bodily injury, and Liability Insurance, which protects the club and its members and association officials from financial loss due to unforeseen incidents which may develop into litigation against members and dance organizations.

PERIOD OF COVERAGE:

The insurance year is January 1 through December 31. Coverage becomes effective for individual clubs under the policy on the day the application and premium for insurance is received by the USDA Insurance Coordinator. There is no pro-rate provision. This is necessary due to the large administrative expense of maintaining different policy dates.

OUR DANCE FACILITIES LIABILITY INSURANCE:

Limits of Protection: \$1,000,000 combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence (subject to a \$100 property damage deductible per claim) while participating in scheduled and sponsored dancing activities. \$100,000 limit for damage to premises rented to you.

DANCER MEDICAL INSURANCE WHAT IS COVERED?:

Accidental bodily injury sustained by an insured person while participating in dancing activities sponsored and supervised by a recognized club or organization

WHO IS COVERED?:

Club members will be insured while participating in any regularly scheduled and sponsored dancing activity worldwide, including group travel (10 or more club members) in a vehicle commercially licensed for transportation of passengers and operated by a person holding a valid operators license for such vehicle, while being transported to or from a covered dancing activity.

LIMITS OF COVERAGE:

\$10,000 Usual and Customary Accident Medical Expense, including Dental (\$10,000), Accidental Death Benefit (\$10,000), Accidental Dismemberment Benefit (loss of one hand, one foot, sight of one eye).

BUT I HAVE MY OWN MEDICAL INSURANCE!

Coverage provided is excess to any other valid and collectible medical insurance covering the same accident. Coverage provided for covered medical expenses incurred within 52 weeks of the accident up to \$10,000 for all eligible expenses as stated in the policy.



OUR DANCE FACILITIES WHO IS COVERED:

The club and its members while participating in club or organization-sponsored and supervised dancing activities. Liability coverage applies in the United States, its territories or possessions, and Canada.

- 1. **I** wish that more dancers would take advantage of the invitation from CALL-ERLAB to attend its annual convention. Here is a chance for dancers to attend any committee meeting or interest session and witness everything that happens. The next convention will be April 5-8, 2020, in Reno, Nevada. - 2. I wish that teachers of Beginners Classes would emphasize fun vs. the learning of call names. So what if the class runs longer? It is likely to cause dancers to stay enthused and thus remain in the activity.
- 3. I wish that clubs would only graduate from Beginners Class those who achieve at least an average standard of ability, instead of graduating everyone no matter how poorly they dance, thereby causing discouragement for others in the class and club members.
- 4. I wish callers would eliminate 95% of their use of Do-Sa-Do. This double reversal of body-flow call makes any dance less smooth the more it is used. Big-name traveling callers seem to use this a lot, especially in singing calls, thereby conveying the attitude that they don't care about smoothness that they just want people to drool over how beautiful their voice is. But this causes new callers to think they should use Do-Sa-Do all the time too.
- 5. I wish there was consistency at the National Convention. Things that are good one year can easily be bad the next year, and the dancers will not know until they are there, and then it is too late. Latest example: Bad sound in the large halls at 2019 National in Atlanta, Georgia. The National Convention Executive Committee says it has printed guidelines for everything, and this is true. But once a city has gotten the bid, it has free reign to do whatever it wants with little oversight on standards. I have been making this wish for consistency for over 30 years, so I have no hope that anything will change.



Otis Plato Lutz, 81, of Grant passed peacefully on Tuesday, June 25th, 2019 in the comfort of his own home surrounded by family. He was born on September 20, 1937 in Canton, Ohio.

Otis moved to Brevard County in 1969. He was a man of many accomplishments. He was a proud veteran of the United States Air Force and served in the Korean War. He was one of



the unit's top mathematicians where he was sent to California for special training. He bailed out of an airplane over enemy territory in the Korean War.

He was a man of intelligence and graduated at the top of his class from the University of Florida in Electrical Engineering. He was a proud alumnus and even had a tattoo of Albert the alligator on his calf which he got for his 72nd birthday.

He worked as an engineer for the Harris Corporation formerly known as Radiation within the government systems division until 1981. During his time being employed by Harris Corporation, he was stationed in Germany with his family for 18 months. He was instrumental in inventing the first supercomputer called the HOP 9,000. HOP standing for Harris Otis Plato.

He then started his own computer business, Computer Specialties Incorporated, that was the largest of its kind on the East Coast of Florida. He also introduced computers to the school system of Brevard County. He enjoyed being an influential leader to the youth of the community. He was a one-man force with NASA consulting, teaching, and integrating of computer networking.

Otis was jovial, innovative and he holds a patent for a hammer he designed. He was a farm boy and loved to garden. He raised a few cows and took a barn that was originally used for raising 1,500 rabbits at one

time and converted it into a square dance hall where he was the caller, inspiring people to come and enjoy themselves.



Otis found happiness and practiced leadership through being an ordained minister. He held bible studies at home for many years. He counseled troubled youth at the JDC, leading many to Christ. Otis was a motorcycle enthusiast; he rode for years. He even rode to Ohio and back multiple times.

Otis retired at the young age of 52. He spent the years after retiring traveling the United States in an RV with his wife, Linda. Otis and Linda met on a blind date and were married six weeks later, they were just shy of their 58th wedding anniversary by six weeks when he passed.

They met many friends during their travels. He was a member of the Challengers RV Club. He found great joy in playing the piano at his local church, Calvary Baptist Church of Grant, FL. He played at least six different musical instruments, all self-taught which include the piano, trumpet, guitar, harmonica, accordion, and harpsichord. Additionally, Otis was a proud republican.

Otis was a man of integrity best learned and instilled through his father. He brought his sense of humor to every situation, was loving, kind and strong willed.



- 28. Contribute toward the enjoyment of the dance by expressing friendliness, good humor, cooperation and a real desire to have fun.
- 29. No drinking of alcoholic beverages before or during the dance.
- 30. Thank everyone who made your evening out a pleasant one the Caller, Club leaders, guests, etc. Your "thanks" is their "pay".
- 31. Forget about business, financial, social and family cares and concentrate on enjoying the fun and fellowship at the dance.
- 32. Be loyal to your Club and Club officers.
- 33. Set a good exapmle for other Club members to follow.
