LIGHTHOUSES #29 thru #32

Smith Shoal Light, Northwest Passage Lighthouse Sanibel Island Lighthouse, Charlotte Harbor Lighthouse

#29 Smith Shoal Light: Little is known about this Lighthouse except it was constructed in 1933 and was built to be unmanned. It is one of the screw-pile lighthouses which stands approximately only 54 feet high. Smith Shoal is northwest of Key West and a long way from anything. It is still in service today.

#30 Northwest Passage Lighthouse: This Lighthouse was delayed being built because of yellow fever among the workers and by unpredictable hard storms. This lighthouse finally was completed in 1855, but the lighthouse was plagued from the very beginning by fires and by a myriad of hurricanes and, of course, the usual wood rot. It was finally deactivated in 1921, 50 years before another big fire finished burning what was left from all the previous devastation. It no longer exists.

#31 Sanibel Island Lighthouse: This Lighthouse was written about earlier but here is a brief synopsis - - In 1833 and 1856 and again in 1877 a Lighthouse Board requested a Light be built on the island but Congress kept declining. It was not until after the Civil War that yet another petition was submitted to Congress stating that a lighthouse would cause a big increase in trade and that boaters and travelers would be able to visit the island more easily. Finally, in 1883 Congress appropriated \$50,000 for the project and the lighthouse was final started in February and lit in August of 1884.

The lighthouse was built 112 feet above sea level with an external spiral staircase the lighthouse keeper had to climb to service the lamps. There were no provisions for a keeper to live inside the structure but a small home was built beside the lighthouse for his needs. There have been two recorded big hurricanes that struck the lighthouse but fortunately there was minimal damage either time. The first recorded one was in 1944 where it is said that several residents and the keeper clung to the outside spiral staircase after the keepers' home was destroyed – all did survive. The second hurricane recorded was Charley in 2004 but predicted storm surges never materialized so nothing was lost.

#32 Charlotte Harbor Lighthouse: This Lighthouse was built and lit in 1890 and was a manned lighthouse until the end of World War 1

when the keeper and the assistant were dismissed. After a while, and since it was unoccupied for many, many years, it was torn down during World War 11.

Port Boca Grande Lighthouse,

#33 Port Boca Grande Lighthouse: The construction of this lighthouse, in 1890, was so "house-like" it was once used as a home with a keeper. The square building is only 44 feet high. In the center of this structure is a staircase leading up to the light with living quarters circling around the staircase on the first floor. The lighthouse went out of service in 1966 but was re-commissioned in 1986 and is still in service today.

#34 Egmont Key Lighthouse: This Lighthouse is the next in line traveling north up the west coast of Florida. This was Lighthouse #6 already written about and published in last August or September issues of your Square Dance Magazines.

As a refresher: it was built and lit in May of 1848 but damaged by a hurricane in September of that same year. It was rebuilt in 1858. In 1861 Union Troops occupied Egmont Key but destroyed the light when they were forced to leave. It was relit after the Civil War in 1866. As of 1990 it has been automated.

#35 Mullet Key Lighthouse: This lighthouse was a 38 foot high structure built on piles. Little is known about this light but it was active in 1912 with a single light and, per records, was still active in 1959, however it is non-existent today.

#36 Tierra Verde Lighthouse: This is a very new lighthouse and can be seen across the channel from Egmont Key. An official aid to navigation, it assists the Egmont Key Lighthouse in guiding ships into Tampa Bay.

#37 Anclote Keys Lighthouse: This lighthouse was lit on September 10, 1887, just a year after Tarpon Springs was settled. The lighthouse went dark in the early 1900's. In 1953 it was automated then electrified in 1963. Again, deactivated in 1985 it was relit in 2003 and it is still working to this day.

By now all of you have heard that the Florida State Convention is really a "sure thing". We will be dancing next year, 2022, on Friday (all day) March 18th and Saturday (all day) March 19th. Although hotel and camping facilities and prices have not been completed they soon will be available so keep checking your local newsletter/magazine they will be the first to know.

One of our Florida Dancers, Joy Vaccari, from the Northwest Association was recognized at the United Square Dancers of America (USDA) Annual Board of Directors meeting during the National Convention in Jackson, Mississippi.

She received her 40-year service award from Presidents Diana and Tony Rock. Joy retired after the convention.

Joy and her late husband, Joe, have been with USDA since the day it was formed. She is only one of two people who were Founders and is still actively participating. The Vacarris were the second presidents of the USDA. They managed the Credit Card Program, and Joy managed the Traveler Program until it was assumed recently by Jerry and Donna Robey. She states that not a year has gone by that she was without a job or chairmanship. Joe and Joy were actively involved in convincing the Florida Federation to join USDA.

They have been busy in Florida too. They were presidents of the Northwest Square and Round Dancers Association (NWFSRDA) 1978 – 79, received the Circle of Service in 1986, inducted into the Florida Square Dance Hall of Fame in 1989, and received the NWFSRDA Presidential Award in 2009. 71st NSDC pre-convention to go virtual, dance cancelled.

EVANSVILLE, Ind. – After much consideration, the 71st National Square Dance Convention® (NSDC) has made the difficult decision to move its in-person pre-convention planning to a virtual format and cancel the pre-convention dance due to the ongoing pandemic.

Pre-convention was scheduled for March 10-13, 2021 at the Doubletree Hotel in Evansville, with the dance scheduled for March 13.

Zoom meetings will still be taking place on these dates to continue planning for the 71st and future conventions. Details on the format are still being worked out, and will follow when they become available.

The 71st NSDC is scheduled for June 22-25, 2022. With two vaccines approved by the FDA, it's looking increasingly likely the event will happen. Register for the 71st NSDC at 71nsdc.org or send an email to registration@71nsdc.org. Early registration is important for planning and funding purposes.

FLORIDA HALL OF FAME

Nominees must have a minimum of 10 years statewide involvement in the Florida Square and Round Dance activity. Their contributions must encompass the entire state of Florida, not just 1 or 2 areas. This should require unselfish dedication of time and labor.

Being an area president, Federation president, Caller/Cuer Association president and/or State Convention chairman is not enough. The Hall of Fame is seeking individuals or couples whose efforts have affected the majority of the State of Florida.

Preparing a nominating resume will take some time and investigation to make it complete. Talk to other dancers, callers and/or cuers for dates, places and times the nominee was involved in statewide participation. Follow the who, what, when and where rule as you investigate and prepare the resume. The more information submitted, the better.

Once the resume is finished there are two ways in which to present the information to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume may be submitted to the board of directors of any of the five area associations, Callers Association or Cuers Association. The area or association board of directors will review the resume and vote to reject or pass it on to the Hall of Fame Committee. The resume may also be sent to the Hall of Fame committee chairman. Resumes must be received by the Hall of Fame committee by November 1st of each year. It is suggested that any association not submit more than 2 resumes for consideration per year. The Hall of Fame Committee shall meet and review all resumes presented and vote by secret ballot to forward such resumes to the Selection Committee for the final vote.

All resumes should be submitted to the Hall of Fame Committee on or before December 1, 2021,

PURPOSE OF AWARD: To show appreciation to a Caller or Cuer who goes that EXTRA MILE, without personal gain, in giving freely of their time and talents to the Square or Round Dance activity.

CRITERIA FOR AWARD: Any Caller or Cuer who is a member of the Florida Callers Association or the Round Dance Council of Florida.

PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATION:

- 1.) The Florida Federation of Square Dancers Executive Board Members shall be the selection committee, with the current President as Chairman of same. New members coming on will replace the ones going off.
- 2.) Any dancer may submit the name of a Caller/Cuer (one nominee per submission) to the selection committee prior to the Federation Annual Meeting (October 15-November 20, 2021) or a date set by the current President to ensure availability for the Executive Board to review nominations prior to the presentation of award at the upcoming Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention.
- 3.) The selection committee will review the nominee(s) and arrive at a final decision.

PROCEDURE FOR PRESENTING AWARD/AWARDS:

- 1.) The award(s) should be presented on Saturday evening at the upcoming Florida State Square & Round Dance Convention, by the current President of the Florida Federation.
- 2.) The award(s) presented shall be a framed document and an "Extra Mile Award Recipient" bar or dangle.

Circle of Service – The Circle of Service was the brainchild of Mori Soglow of Strawberry Square in Plant City, Florida, during the spring of 1985. Mori, who at that time had been asked to be a moderator of a LEGACY panel on Awards and Recognition, conferred with Chet Vetter, also of Strawberry Square in Plant City, Florida, who at the time was chairman of LEGACY's leadership and education committee and coordinator of Legacy Panels to the National Convention to be held in June 1985 in Birmingham, Alabama. The original title of the circle was "Wheel of Progress", but while Kit Waldorf of Pensacola, Florida, who was asked to design the emblem, was completing her artistic enterprise, the title was changed to the "Circle of Service". The new title, together with Kit Waldorf's original design was more than acceptable and ready for presentation by Legacy in June 1985.

This award for DANCERS ONLY was introduced to the panel on awards and recognition conducted by Legacy at the 34th National Convention held in Birmingham, Alabama in June 1985. The "Circle of Service" presentation was acted upon with favor, being made part of the Square & Round Dancing activities by the committee. Those initially receiving this honor at the Panel meeting were Brock and Mary Brockwell, vice chairman of panels at Birmingham, and Bob and Dottie Elgin, chairman of Legacy from Pennsylvania. The following day at the Legacy Board meeting, Don and Mary Martin of Georgia, Ernie and Barbara Stone of Indiana, Bill and Colleen Wilton of Wisconsin, Gordon Goss and Partner Valarie of Mississippi, Vivian McCannon of Texas, and Vera Chestnut of Wisconsin were all presented the "Circle of Service".

The citation accompanying the presentation reads: "This circle is a symbol of service to Square and Round Dancing. It is designed to be worn with PRIDE by dancers who, for three or more years are determined to have made a significant contribution to the Square and Round Dance movement. The stellar hub of the Circle, formed by a pattern of ARCS, symbolizes the importance of each such individual to the total picture. The same circular shapes flow outward to help define interlocking squares and stylized musical symbols. This linear interplay suggests the strong bond between the two "sister" dance activities, Square and Round Dancing. A certificate and a small dangle are presented to each recipient. This award must be presented by someone who has already received the Circle of Service award. The dangle can be purchased from any badge vendor.



The Origin of Square Dance

Although square dancing is a unique American folk-dance, you can trace its roots from England and France. The square dance began in New England, when the first settlers and immigrants from Europe, brought with them their various national dances like the schottische, the quadrille, the jigs and reels, and the minuet, to name a few. After a hard week of carving farms and towns out of the wilderness, the settlers would gather in the community center on Saturday evening to enjoy socializing and dancing.

As the communities grew and people of different cultures intermingled, so did their dances. As their repertoire increased, it became difficult for them to remember the exact movements for each dance style. However, in any group, there would be at least one who had a knack for remembering the dance steps. This person would cue or prompt them in case they forgot what came next.

The prompter or caller would learn moves from other communities and he (usually a man) would teach them to the group. Some of these prompters developed dance routines of their own, including dances for groups of four couples, and this is how square dance was developed. As the population grew and became diverse, so did the dances.

Square dancing filled the recreational needs and provided socialization for the settlers. They only needed wooden floors, music, and the caller to enjoy dancing. As the population grew and became more urban, it also became multiracial. Booming trade brought new fashions, new music, and new dance moves from other places. New dance styles became more fashionable, and they displaced square dancing in many communities, square dancing mainly survived in isolated areas at this time.

How Henry Ford Saved Square Dance

In the early 1930s, Henry Ford became interested in reviving square dancing as a part of his project. His efforts had captured the interests of others who then modernized the activity so it would appeal to Americans while keeping its basic moves. Square dancing groups began to form, and by 1948, square dancing became popular again.

As square dance became popular again, it moved from backyards into urban centers. Name tags, worn by the dancers, put everyone on a first-name basis and created instant informality and good fellowship.

Square dancing was revived in a modern setting and spread over the nation. Today, this wholesome recreational dance is enjoyed by millions of Americans and by countless others around the world. New ideas and moves are often introduced to ensure that square dancing remains new and different every time that you go dancing.

Square Dance Dress Code

The traditional square dance attire for men includes long-sleeved western -style shirts, dress slacks, a scarf slide or bolo tie on collared shirts, and sometimes cowboy hats and boots.

The traditional square dance clothing for women includes a blouse, skirt, petticoat (petticoats make your skirt look full and elegant as you spin on the dance floor), belt, pettipants, and square dance shoes. Square dancers often choose coordinated square dance outfits to match their partner or group.

Summary

Square dance is a product of multiple cultures but has been a part of American social life for centuries. Square dancing may have evolved and had many changes through the years but it remains an enduring part of American culture and tradition that is still enjoyed by many.
