FROM THE LOFT



Time to get busy for the fall square dance classes. What can we do more of that worked in the past? What can we do that is different that will produce results? We need to get more dancers in for the fall classes. A unified effort would be more productive than "going it alone".

Should callers and cuers become involved in recruiting new dancers? I believe that they should. I know that they give of their time for demos but we do not see new dancers coming from demos. They teach the dancers that come to the lessons. The facts show that less than 1 in 4 of the folks attending lessons are still associated with square dancing a year later! It is hard enough to get new students to see 3 out of 4 drop out!

Is part of our problem a "list"? Is it too difficult for the new dancers to feel comfortable dancing the "plus" level? Is it possible that square dancing was popular when it was "easy" and a lot livelier? Callerlab is addressing this area. See Jerry Reed's article on page 6 of this issue. Why do dancers dancing at the advanced level not enjoy the plus level? Why do dancers at the plus level not enjoy the mainstream level? Should there be levels?

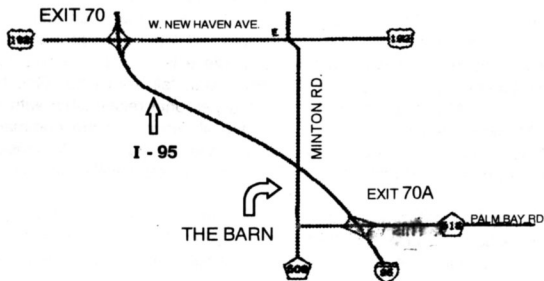
Getting a class for your club is the most important thing you can spend your time and money to accomplish. Without a class, your club will cease to exist! It is not reasonable to think that this is someone else's problem. I do not think it can be accomplished by one person. Each and every club should have a "recruitment" committee. This committee must have the support of the entire club. Plans should be developed for the entire period from recruitment of new dancers to the inclusion of the new class into the club. This entire process should be centered around the new recruit. This should be an exciting and very enjoyable time for the new student. In fact, they should not even consider that they are new students. The caller and club should make this experience so much fun that they would not feel like a student. Support should be total from the club members.

We have many state organizations. The Central Florida Association, the Florida Callers Association, the Round Dancers Association and individual clubs should all give of time and money to see that the new students have a fun filled experience. This way, they would invite their friends to join them in this "new" activity. Remember, round dancers come from square dancers. Let's all do our part to make our activity grow. The only way we can fail is to do nothing.

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

Infinite Past - Infinite Future

Genesis 1:1-4 In the beginning of God's preparing the heavens and the earth, the earth hath existed waste and void, and darkness is on the face of the deep, and the Spirit of God fluttering on the face of the waters, and God saith, "let light be;" and light is.

The only beginning we have any concept of is the beginning of God preparing the earth in the form in which we know it. That the earth and heavens existed is stated. How long it existed in its previous state is unknown. What we can surmise is that there is no "THE BEGINNING". God was. He always was. God had no beginning and He has no end. The earth and heavens had a beginning and they will have an end. We had a beginning - but - we will have no end! We have scientists telling us that the earth is about 4 or 5 billion years old. But we also have scientists telling us that the universe is older than the things contained in it. How can that be? If the universe is everything how can anything that is in it not have been in it at the beginning.

In Genesis 1: 1-4 we have the total teachings of the Bible. It is a story of our lives as well as the physical preparing of the earth to sustain life. Let us consider these verses.

In the beginning of God preparing our lives, He started with us as unprofitable. We existed, but we existed as waste. Not worthy of being with Him we were void of all goodness and existed to do what was good in our sight. We did not know truth and could not recognize truth. We were in the dark on all things. God moved on the face of the waters. In the Bible water refers to the spirit. Thus, God was dealing with our spiritual being, that part of mankind that will exist forever. Isn't it wonderful that God did not just fix our physical life. The physical man can die. The spiritual man lives forever. In fact, God told us He knew us before the foundation of the earth was laid. Before His preparing the earth for habitation! We existed before time! We existed in the infinite past! The Bible teaches our relationship with Him. Man fell from what God had planned for him. Man was created to have a personal relationship with the Creator. Mankind died as a result of breaking all ten of the ten commandments. God could have destroyed the universe and started over. He chose to work with fallen man and provide a way for us to have eternal life with Him.

The first thing God did for us was to give us light. We were in darkness but God gave us light. It is His light that shines in mans heart. It is His light that turns man from darkness to light. Without this light we would not know the

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truth. God has taken the bad (darkness) and turned it to good (light). He has given us life so that we may be part of a great family that will live in the infinite future. We are not waste and void. We are not empty vessels, rather we are beings capable of being joint heirs with God to this whole universe.

Today we are learning more and more about this great universe that God created. We are learning that the size of this universe is beyond comprehension. We are just beginning to learn that we don't know anything about the universe. That is as it should be. If we are to live forever, then we must be able to learn forever. That means that we must have infinite things to learn. The scientists acknowledge that the universe, if started by the "big bang" theory, would have repeated this infinitely in the past and will do so into the infinite future. The Bible states that God created the heavens and earth and that they hath existed. They existed forever in the infinite past. The facts that we understand now clearly shows that what is has existed forever. God created everything in the infinite past. There is no "THE" beginning. The Bible starts with the "preparing" of the earth. The Bible begins with God preparing me for an infinite life. All that has gone before is to prepare me for this future life. The short time that I spend on this earth is only to prove what is the good and perfect will of God. This earthly life is to prepare me to be with God forever. What I do here has real consequences for me in the infinite life.

God has not left us defenseless. He has given us the tools and strength to do what is good. We are to prepare for the everlasting life that is to come. Our time here is to learn that God is love, that God is good. That God is just.

The Bible is not a history book. It is a book about God's dealing with man, about God providing man with an infinite future, of God providing man the way to enter that future so that we may explore strange new worlds, to go where no man has gone before. What an exciting future God has prepared for us. A future that will provide challenges that will never end. Surely the ones that have gone on before us do not have time to grieve the loss of our company. This interlude is ever so short as to be immeasurable by any instrument you could imagine. When we think of their joy we should not grieve for them either, but rejoice that where they are we can be. Let us live our lives in a manner that will be pleasing to God. Use the resources He has provided so that when we enter into His kingdom He will say: "well done thou good and faithful servant". He will multiply those things we have done good and forget those things at which we failed. What greater future could anyone want?

TO CHANGE OR NOT TO CHANGE (That Is The Question)

At the National Convention in Orlando many dancers and callers completed a survey provided by CALLERLAB, the international Association of Square Dance Callers. This survey asked for input to several questions about three proposals for changing the current CALLERLAB dance programs. The reason for the survey is to gather information about how dancers and callers view the current programs and how they view the proposed changes.

It must be stressed that this process is only AN INFORMATION GATHERING tool. There have been no preconceived ideas about the acceptability of the changes by the CALLERLAB membership. The total purpose of the survey is to begin

the process of gathering information and starting a dialog between dancers and callers to help determine the best course of action. The goal is to gather as much information as possible.

The three proposals were developed by an Ad-Hoc committee formed to study the current programs to determine if any changes were needed. The Ad-Hoc committee came to the conclusion that some changes were needed. The committee generated the proposals to meet the need for change as they saw it.

The three proposals are:

- 1) Establish the Basic Program (to be called "Square Dancing") as the entry program for new dancers. This program is intended to be taught in 15 two hour sessions. An important part of this proposal is to also provide a place for the new dancers to dance this program.
- 2) Create an amalgamation of the current CALLERLAB Mainstream and Plus Programs by selecting the number of moves which can be taught in 10 - 12 weeks of 2 hours each.

(NOTE: Both of the above programs will be taught and called using the concept of "Standard Applications". This concept involves the use of the most commonly used positions. Another important part of this concept is that the caller will be prepared to provide help to increase dancer success.)

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3) The final proposal is to establish a new program which will be include the concept of "Extended Applications". Some dancers may be familiar with this concept as relating to the old outdated concept of Dance By Definition (DBD). This program would require a special class session just as the other two programs do. If callers wish to teach this program from the beginning, a period of 50 two hour sessions is recommended.

The next 8 months will be spent gathering information and comments about these proposals from dancers and callers. The proposals will be presented, discussed, debated, and voted on at the CALLERLAB convention next April in Cincinnati. BEST EVER BANANA BREAD

by Debbie Sabre of Cocoa Beach

2 medium size ripe bananas, mashed
2 eggs
1 3/4 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1 1/2 cups sugar
1 cup chopped walnuts
1/2 cup vegetable oil
1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon buttermilk
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 teaspoon salt



Preheat oven to 325° F. Grease and flour a 9 x 5 inch loafpan. Combine all ingredients in a large bowl, and mix together well. Transfer batter to prepared pan. Bake until top is golden brown and splits slightly, about 1 hour and 20 minutes (check at 1 hour with toothpick). Slice and serve warm. Can be frozen. DO NOT DOUBLE RECIPE.

This recipe was printed in the Carol Jose column of the Florida Today newspaper on Thursday, July 3rd. 1997. I made it on Monday, July 7th, and it tastes great. With my oven the time to bake was 1 hour 10 minutes, that's why I suggest a test at 1 hour.

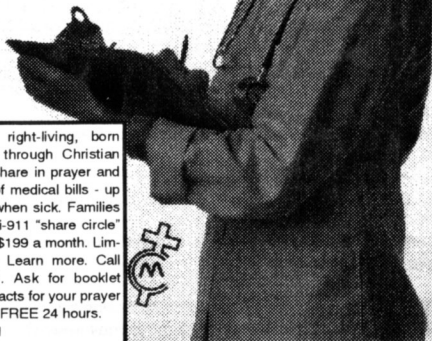

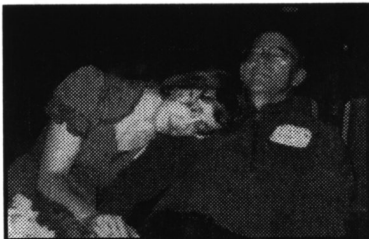
